WE ARE WHAT WE EAT—WAYS TO BE EUCHARIST TO ANOTHER

The Gospel this week is a about Jesus feeding the 5000. When the disciples see the large crowd they asked Jesus to send them away as they will have to get provisions for themselves. So Jesus says to them ,"You give them something to eat." I'm sure that the next thing that came into their minds was something like this—how can the twelve of us carry enough food for 5000 people?

What Jesus was referring to was not real food but spiritual food and the disciples missed the whole point of what Jesus was trying to teach them. I believe Jesus was trying to teach them was that real food sustains us but Spiritual food helps us to become **WHAT WE EAT** so that we can go out and bring it to others. For example when we receive the Eucharist we must go out and be Eucharist to others.

He stopped to greet him and engaged him in conversation at which time he found out that his friend had just been laid off from his job. He gave him a lot of positive feed back and encouraged him to look for another job along with some ideas.


They talked for about a half hour and he could see that he was making a difference in his friends attitude through positive feed back he was giving his friend. He realized that he made a difference in his friends attitude because his friend began to smile. What he also realized was he also became Eucharist to his friend.

Here are a few other ways to be Eucharist to another:

I was thirsty and dry in spirit and your accepting smile refreshed me.

- 1 was a stranger when I walked into your church and you made me feel welcome by shaking my hand.
- I was spiritually naked and cold and you dressed me and made me feel warm with your encouraging words and respectful attitude.
- 1 was in a prison of pain when I lost a loved one, you visited me, grieved with me and hugged me.
- → Whatever you did for the least of mine, you did for me.

In 2020 Sr. Norma Pirnentel was named one of the 100 most influential people in the US and has recently received the Pacem in Terris Peace and Freedom Award by the interfaith Pacem in Terris Coalition. She met with the US Catholic Conference of Bishops after recent press attacks on her and Catholic Charities for their assisting asylum applicants.

In Brownsville, Texas, Sr. Norma has been on the front lines of the immigration crisis in the U.S. for decades--witnessing first-hand the effect of U.S. immigration policy at the southern border, including the 2020 Title 42 order barring individuals without documentation from entering the U.S. As the nation contemplates ending Title 42, anti-immigrant efforts are growing.

Sr. Norma is coming to visit Strangers No Longer in Michigan to help us understand what is going on at the border and to nourish our souls and those of your parishioners and friends.



WHAT ARE YOU SEEKING? CAN RCIA HELP?

Deep in our hearts, we have a longing to be closer to God, to feel that we have a home with him for all eternity. St. Augustine reminds us, "Our hearts are restless until they find rest in you."

The RCIA journey at St. Mary Student Parish is designed to help people hear and respond to God's loving call – and especially to his invitation for a deeper relationship with him in the tradition of the Catholic faith. The weekly sessions are designed for:

- Those who want to be baptized in the Catholic faith.
- Those who want to join the Catholic Church from another faith or another Christian tradition.
- Baptized Catholics who wish to receive the sacrament of Confirmation.

Throughout the year, participants in RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) are welcome to explore and ask questions as they discern where God may be leading them.






