## AN UPDATE ON WITNESS TO HOPE by Fr. Ben Hawley, SJ

The Church is the People of God made most visible when we gather to celebrate the Eucharist together. As the People of God we are organized into dioceses and parishes so that our prayer for the world and our work in the world can be focused, coordinated, and unified.

In this spirit the Diocese of Lansing has mounted a capital campaign called Witness to Hope to encourage all parishioners to a special effort on behalf of each parish's life as well as the wider diocese. This campaign hopes to elicit yet greater financial contributions for parishioners like you for our own parish as well as for the ministries supported by the diocese, assistance to retired and not-yet retired priests, like Charlie Irvin and Tom Firestone, support to Catholic schools, and support for diocese seminarians studying at Sacred Heart Seminary in Detroit and elsewhere.

The parishes of the diocese have been organized into three successive time periods in which to run their individual campaigns. Our period began in May with my own announcement to you all and two introductory receptions. At that time or subsequently after, you should have received your information packet with a personal letter from me telling you about the campaign. We will hold our next two receptions following the noon and 5pm masses on Sunday, July 30. I

invite you to attend to ask any questions or share any observations you might have.

Several important points:

- Of the nearly \$1 million the diocese has asked us to raise based on annual Sunday collections, one third returns to us for our own needs. We have designated two such needs: the first, investment in replacing our slate roof with one quite similar in appearance but much easier to maintain, and the second, ongoing support to our campus ministry program.
- We receive our one-third share periodically as contributions are made. We do not need to wait until the end of the campaign.
- We will not be taxed if we are unable to raise the full amount.
- You may contribute by a one-time gift, by a pledge over several years, or by stock transfer according to your own desires.

Other parishes in the first phase of the campaign have already met their goals and in some cases have exceeded that goal. In meetings I have attended their pastors are very impressed by the generosity of their parishioners and very pleased not only to support the works of the diocese but also to have additional funds to support their own parishes.

I hope you will reflect on God's generosity to us as Catholic people and to our church and parish and then as you may feel inspired and led to make a contribution to this campaign.

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book [Open Heart, Open Mind](#) by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

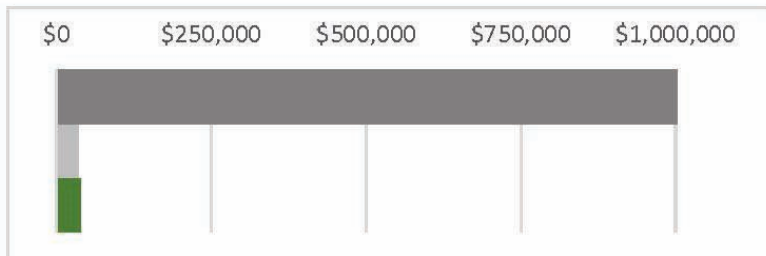

**BAPTISM CLASS**

7/31, 8/21, 9/25

On the last Monday of every month (occasionally, the date is changed due to holidays, etc.), St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class for new parents at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend. The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class. At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another.

In order to have a baptism here you either need to be registered here OR get permission from the church where you are registered. We do Sunday baptisms during the mass and are celebrated by the priest. Only one child may be baptized per mass on Sundays. Spanish Baptisms are usually scheduled every other Sunday after the 2pm Spanish mass at 3:15. Three children can be baptized after the Spanish Mass. We grateful for the opportunity to celebrate the miracle of new life and welcome new members into our parish family through the Sacrament of Baptism. ## AN INVITATION TO EXPLORE THE CATHOLIC FAITH

RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) is designed to help people discover where God may be leading them, regardless of where they are in their own personal faith journey.

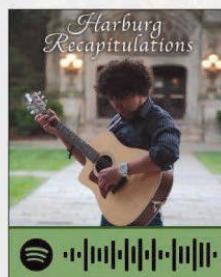

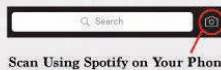

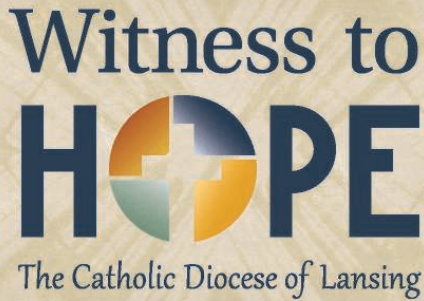

## Catholic Charities

To Strengthen Our Parish and Our Diocese

### Living Our Faith Through Evangelization

As Catholics, we are part of our parish outreach every day to meet local needs. We also join together to ensure additional needs are met through Catholic Charities serving our 10 counties. Each year, more than 73,600 services are provided to those in need. From events drawing national focus to quietly meeting a family’s need – Catholic Charities is there to respond. *Witness to Hope* will invest \$10,000,000 of the funds raised to support these efforts.

#### Catholic Charities Endowment

The *Witness to Hope* campaign includes \$6,500,000 to be invested through The Catholic Foundation for the Diocese of Lansing. The annual distribution from this endowment fund will be used to support ongoing and new service programs at the five Catholic Charities agencies. Each agency will receive funding every year, but the total amount provided to each agency will be determined based on programs submitted and will be awarded based on funding need and service priority.

#### Catholic Charities Capital Needs

The five Catholic Charities agencies serve the 10 counties of the Diocese. Each of these agencies, and two important parish-based social ministry programs will benefit from capital support to improve their facilities, enabling them to continue to provide vital services. Funding will be distributed as follows:

**My neighbor isn’t Catholic and she asked me about getting her son some counseling from our local office. What should I tell her?**

**Answer:** Tell her to call our local office! Each Catholic Charities office in the Diocese of Lansing serves people of ALL faiths and backgrounds. You do *not* have to be Catholic to get help. In fact, more than 70% of people helped by Catholic Charities are *not* Catholic.

**I would like to volunteer at Catholic Charities, but I don't know what is available. I am retired, so I have lots of extra time and I really want to help.**

**My parish has a tithing program and we give a percentage of our offertory collection to local non-profits, including Catholic Charities. How come *Witness to Hope* is also allocating money?**

**Answer:** In a nutshell: even with parish tithing, individual donor gifts and financial support through events such as the St. Patrick's Day lunches, golf tournaments, and Thanksgiving, Christmas and Lenten Appeals, Catholic Charities spends the majority of its funds on direct service to clients, with little or nothing left over. The *Witness to Hope* funds will be used to set up endowment (saving) accounts and capital improvement accounts to *insure the sustainability* of each agency. Each office still has to also raise money for their day-to-day operations.

**When my mother died, my brother decided that instead of flowers we would ask friends to donate to Catholic Charities. It worked pretty well, and now our family wants to do something bigger in honor of our Mom. What can we do?**

**Answer:** Families can honor and memorialize loved ones at Catholic Charities by: **1.** Consider a special, outright "group" family gift once a year, perhaps on the anniversary of you Mom's death or even her birthday. **2.** Make a provision in your *own* will or trust to your favorite Catholic Charities with named gift in honor of your family, thus perpetuating your family's legacy of support for the most needy and vulnerable in your community.
