Pastoral Perspective

THE FIRST SUNDAY OF ADVENT by Marlee Willshire '19, Intern for Liturgy, Prayer and Music



The first Sunday of Advent's Gospel reading comes from the 13th chapter of Mark and begins with,

"Jesus said to his disciples: 'Be watchful! Be alert! You do not know when the time will come.'"

A few things from this verse, Mark 13:33, stand out to me as I begin to ponder the power and the beauty of the Advent season and as I begin to prepare for the birth of Jesus. First of all, I have always paid close attention to when exclamation points are used throughout the Bible. Personally, I use exclamation points (far too frequently, in my opinion) to convey messages of excitement and importance. With my frequent use of exclamation points, I can relate to Jesus's urgency and emphasis when he tells his disciples to be watchful and to be alert. Through this small detail, I can almost sense, hear, and taste Jesus's excitement and urgency when speaking to his friends and followers.

I particularly enjoy the Advent season because I constantly, throughout the entire liturgical year, need a concrete reminder to be watchful and to be alert for Jesus's presence in my life and God's will. I find that part of the beauty and the power of the Advent season comes from the fact that it is such a busy time of year for many people; Christmas shopping, cooking decorating (or eating), exams (for some of us), and catching up with family and friends. The Advent season, and its many festivities, always center me and remind me what's most important during the busy holiday season.

Finally, my favorite part of the Advent season are the lessons I learn from the waiting and the longing for Jesus Christ's arrival. Yes, this longing began when I was a child. This longing began when I counted down the days, with the help of a paper linked chain, until Christmas when I got to open presents at the crack of dawn and wear a new dress to church. However, this longing has beautifully matured into teaching me patience and trust in God's timing and promises. Honestly, I think Advent is underrated. There is so much beauty in the waiting. I'm amazed at the different lessons God has taught me each year through this special season.

I encourage you to take five minutes and write down a list of

your personal hopes for this new season. Now, put your list aside and turn toward God. By doing this, each of us will discover how Advent can and will surprise us. Our plans are not God's plans. Your lists of hopes for this Advent season is a beautiful beginning, but by setting it aside you invite God to enter in and take the lead. Which is exactly the spirit of Advent; to prepare our hearts for the One who is waiting to transform our lives.


