Pastoral Perspective

REJOICE - REJOICE! BY FR. BEN HAWLEY, SJ

A Savior? What do we need to be saved from?

Scripture describes Jesus' life's work as freeing the captive, giving sight to be blind, and healing the sick. So he saves us from anything to which we are captive, to which we are blind, and of which we are sick.

Another way to understand what Jesus does for us is this: he rescues us from the shipwrecks of our lives. The original Greek word that the New Testament uses to mean "salvation" is a much older word that this sea-faring people used to mean "rescue from a shipwreck."

In the busy time leading up to the end of the semester we can feel as though we have lost sight of anything but the huge volume of work we must finish. We can feel discouraged by the pressures and so captive of endless work. We can feel heartsick about ever achieving our hopes and dreams.

Jesus' word of hope wants to pierce these layers of blindness, discouragement, and heartsickness. "Your life has value because I give your life that value," he says to us. This doesn't make the work or the pressures or the discouragement disappear. Nor are we likely to find ourselves full of giddy joy. It isn't about happy feelings. It is about a deep-seated, foundational realization that I can in fact keep going moment by moment, hour by hour, day by day, and all this pressure will pass and I will emerge into a new part of my life, aka second semester.

Of course, Isaiah's texts were spoken to the Jewish people in slavery in Babylon, and the New Testament texts - the gospels, St Paul's and other authors' letters were written at a time of terrible persecution in the Holy Lands. So these words of hope have been spoken to people in much more dire circumstances than ours. And their hopefulness and God's love have allowed these words to be transmitted to us.

"Make straight the way of the Lord." Help Jesus help us. Trust just a little. Let him in. Only when we have let him in and he has started the process of our salvation can we face those who are blind or captive by their own choice - the ones who are blind to their own limitations, blind to the humanity, the worth and value of the people around them, who see people as objects to be used, the ones we hear of in the news these days: Matt Lauer, Harvey Weinstein, Bill Clinton, and the rest of them. They are the real destructive ones from whom we need real protection. But that is the story of Lent and Easter.

For now let us rejoice - rejoice! Scripture says - that our Savior has come and is coming more and more into our world. Let our Christmas be merry and our New Year filled with the hope of the Christmas Season.
