

Each person in our parish is faced with a different financial situation,

and it is with that in mind that we ask everyone to prayerfully consider what their best sacrifice is, knowing that pledge amounts will vary from person to person.

Each member of our community is asked to join all in our parish in making their own best sacrifice. For example, a pledge of \$50 per month means a \$3,000 over five years, and a pledge of \$167 per month means a \$10,000 campaign gift over five years. Some parishioners have pledged less and some have pledged far more in line with their blessings from the Lord.

FREQUENTY ASKED CAMPAIGN QUESTIONS

What is a pledge?

A pledge is a good-faith promise that offers you a way to be generous over a period of time. Pledges are not legally binding.

When will I receive reminders to make payments on my pledge?

Unless you indicate that you would like a later start date on your pledge card, you will begin receiving reminders a few weeks after you make your pledge. You can choose whether to receive those reminders on a monthly, quarterly, or annual basis.

Is it possible to set up automatic payments for my pledge?

Yes, some donors set up automatic bank draft or credit card payments. Some also send checks or transfer stock.

To whom should checks be made?

Checks should be made out to "Witness to Hope."



The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class.

At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another. Saturday baptisms are private ceremonies usually celebrated by the deacon.



Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book <u>Open Heart, Open Mind</u> by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.




