

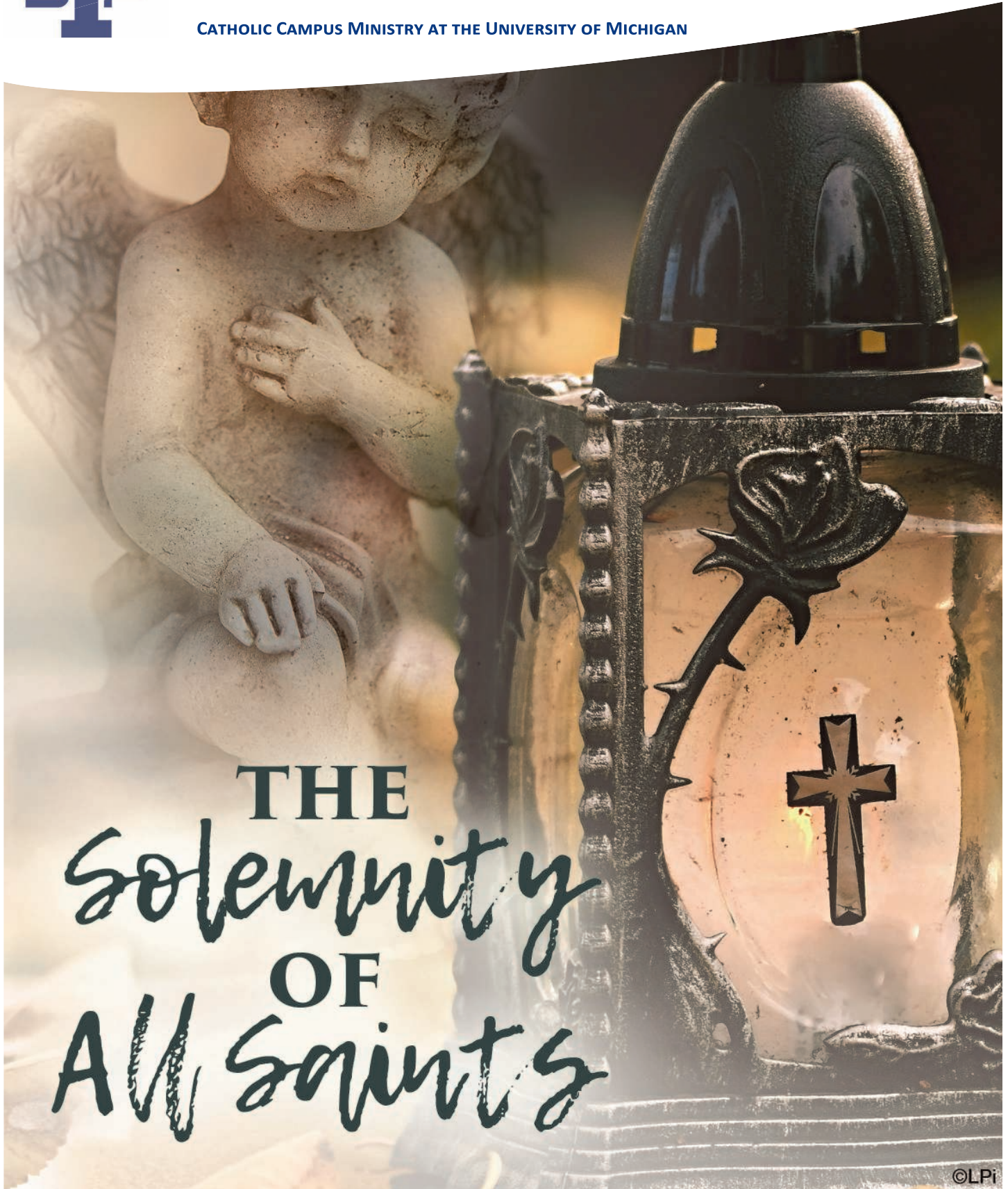

## DAY OF THE DEAD/EL DÍA DE MUERTOS by Akemi Tsutsumi Rioboo

The Day of the Dead, celebrated every November 1st and 2nd, has always been one of my favorite Mexican traditions. As a child, I spent the morning of the Day of the Dead at school setting up altars with pictures of family and friends who have passed away. At night, I would come back to school with my friends and family. As soon as I walked in the school, I was surrounded by bright marigold flowers, colorful ‘papel picado’ (tissue paper with designs made out of holes), and thousands of candles. All the decorations, in addition to music, dancing, and food, made this celebration truly special. Unlike most events associated with death, the Day of the Dead is a day of celebration. It is the day in which the spirits of loved ones who have passed away come back to spend some time with us. For this reason, the Day of the Dead is one of the most meaningful and awaited days for Mexicans. People spend the night playing music, dancing, eating, and drinking with their loved ones. Some people go to cemeteries and set up altars by their loved one’s graves. Other people set up altars at home. Altars, the most well-known characteristic of the Day of the Dead, are meant to honor and remember all the people who have passed away. They often include pictures of loved ones, as well as their favorite foods and drinks. Other characteristic elements of altars include water, salt,

‘cempasúchil’ (marigold) flowers, incense, and candles. All these elements have a different symbolic meaning.

This Day of the Dead, St. Mary Student Parish will be bringing this beautiful Mexican tradition to Ann Arbor. I recommend you stop by the altar and enjoy this special event.

El Día de Muertos, celebrado cada 1 y 2 de noviembre, siempre ha sido una de mis tradiciones mexicanas favoritas. De niña pasaba la mañana del Día de Muertos en la escuela montando altares con fotografías de familiares y amigos los cuales ya habían fallecido. Por la noche, regresaba a la escuela con mi familia y amigos. Desde el momento que entraba al colegio, estaba rodeada de brillantes flores de cempasúchil, colorido papel picado y miles de veladoras. Todas estas decoraciones junto con la música, el baile y la comida hacen de esta celebración una ocasión muy especial.

Contrario a la mayoría de los eventos asociados con la muerte, el Día de Muertos es un día de festejo. Este es el día en que los espíritus de nuestros seres queridos que ya han muerto vuelven para pasar un rato con nosotros. Por esta razón, el Día de Muertos es uno de los días más anhelados y con mayor significado para los Mexicanos. La gente en México pasa esa noche oyendo música, cantando, bailando, comiendo y bebiendo con sus seres

amados. Algunas personas montan altares en los cementerios sobre las tumbas de sus familiares. Otros los montan en sus hogares. Los altares son la característica más conocida del Día de Muertos, y están hechos para honrar y recordar a todos aquellos que ya no están entre nosotros. Los altares incluyen fotografías de los seres amados, así como su comida y bebida favorita. Otros elementos característicos de los altares son el agua, la sal, las flores de cempasúchil, el incienso y las veladoras. Cada elemento tiene un simbolismo diferente.

Este Día de Muertos, St. Mary Student Parish traerá esta bella tradición mexicana a Ann Arbor. Les recomiendo visitar el altar y disfrutar de este evento tan especial.

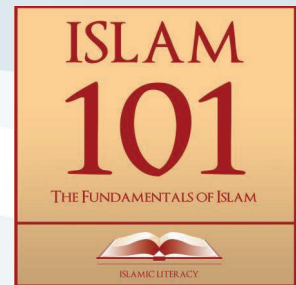

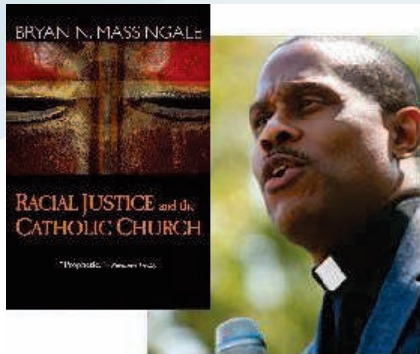

## HISPANIC/LATINO MINISTRY

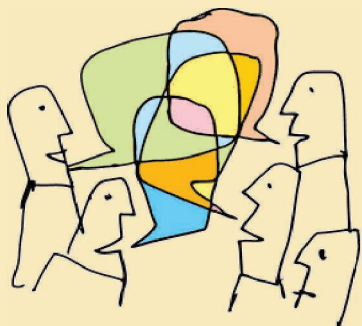

## BAPTISM CLASS

St. Mary Student Parish holds a baptism class, in English and Spanish, for new parents one Monday evening each month at 7:00 pm. Parents who are preparing to have their child baptized in the Catholic faith should pick up materials for the discussion from the Parish Office at least one week prior to the meeting they plan to attend.

The baptism preparation packet contains articles and discussion questions for parents and godparents. It also contains a Baptism Registration form which must be filled out prior to class.

At the discussion, parents (and godparents, if possible) will have an opportunity to ask questions about Catholic Baptism and schedule their baptism in the Church. If you've attended a baptism class before, we don't require you to attend another. Saturday baptisms are private ceremonies usually celebrated by the deacon.

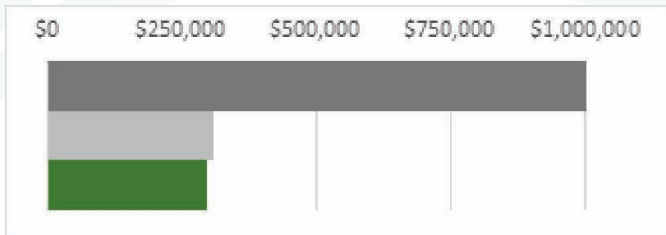

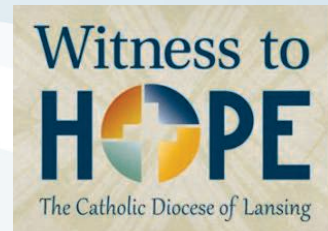

One of the most important aspects of Witness to Hope is strengthening the parishes of the Diocese of Lansing. Traditionally, in diocesan-wide campaigns, funds are split using a formula that allows both the parishes and the diocese to achieve their goals. Witness to Hope, however, is introducing a new sharing formula that will provide parishes with a much larger share of the funds raised. This new formula will provide for those parishes that conduct highly successful campaigns even more resources for local needs, and is an incentive for every parish to engage the support of as many parishioners as possible.

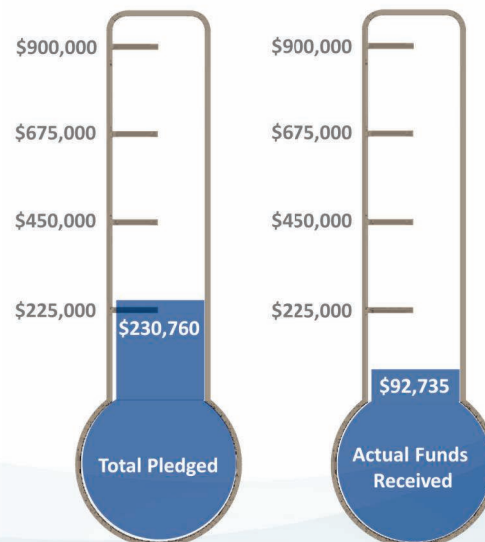
## NO CASH? DONATE USING VENMO!

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer.

The book [Open Heart, Open Mind](#) by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.
