

Called to Respond

As John the Baptist proclaimed, "One mightier than I is coming after me. I am not worthy to stoop and loosen the thongs of his sandals. I have baptized you with water; he will baptize you with the Holy Spirit."

As soon as we read the gospel for this Sunday we were reminded of the theme for St. Mary's upcoming undergraduate Women's Retreat, "Priest, Prophet, and Queen: Our Stories as Catholic Women". This title comes from the Rite of Baptism when we are anointed priest, prophet, and king.

As we gathered last Sunday around table to share a meal with one another, the women's retreat planning team struggled with this baptismal call. Yet in this struggle we felt the Spirit guiding us, the same Spirit that descended on Christ in our gospel today. For some of us we struggle, like John the Baptist, to feel worthy of our call. While others struggle to understand what this call means. How can we as women respond to the lofty titles of priest, prophet, and queen? This is what we hope to discover on the women's retreat. And what is at the heart of this question?

The heart of this question is how we can come into greater relationship with the Beloved, Jesus Christ who gave his own life for us. This is something that we are all called to. We are called to relationship with our God and to share that love with others. We each have unique gifts, unique titles that God has blessed us with. The Spirit is alive in each and everyone of us, present in our lives, guiding us with love. This Sunday let us reflect on where the Spirit is moving in our lives. How is the Spirit descending on us today?

We'd like to invite all undergraduate women to join us on the women's retreat to explore these questions more deeply and share our lives with one another. The two of us have already found immense blessings in the preparation for the retreat and know that it will be rich in blessings for all who attend.

He is also instrumental in the ongoing service project for SMSP students with the St. Luke New Life Center.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program

Looking for a way to help your young child grow in relationship with God?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite preschool children ages 3-5 years to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish. This faith formation opportunity will be held on the following Sundays: January 18, February 1, March 22, April 26, and May 3 after the 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 am-12:45 pm in the Newman Room. Parish Memorial Garden

The dust has cleared and our beautiful parish Memorial Garden is now in place in the courtyard area behind the parish offices. Parish members have shown great interest in the garden and columbarium, so if you have been waiting to discuss reservation arrangements, please know that you will be called for an appointment as soon as possible.

The St. Mary Student Parish Memorial Garden is the result of many years of planning and requests from parishioners. Final landscaping will be done in the spring, creating a beautiful, lasting resting place for the cremated remains of parishioners and their family members.

The Memorial Garden includes a columbarium, which is an arrangement of openings, or niches, that are used to hold the urns containing the remains of an individual. Each niche will be covered and sealed. The columbarium is constructed of cast bronze and granite, with 214 niches available.

Low Gluten Hosts

Sharing in the Eucharist our Lord's table is what makes us Catholic. But how many of us take this rite for granted? A person with celiac disease cannot tolerate gluten, a plant protein found in wheat, barley, and rye.

We are happy to make available low-gluten hosts that may be consecrated for you at our Eucharistic celebrations. Instructions and pyx are in the Parish Office.

Low gluten breads are made of what starch and water. The gluten content of these breads is .01%. According to the magazine *Gluten-Free Living*, Vol. 9, no. 1a, experts from the Center for Celiac Research at the University of Maryland call the host "*perfectly safe*," stating, "you would have to eat 270 wafers everyday to reach the danger point." This being said, it is still recommended that celiac sufferers consult with their physician before using these breads.


