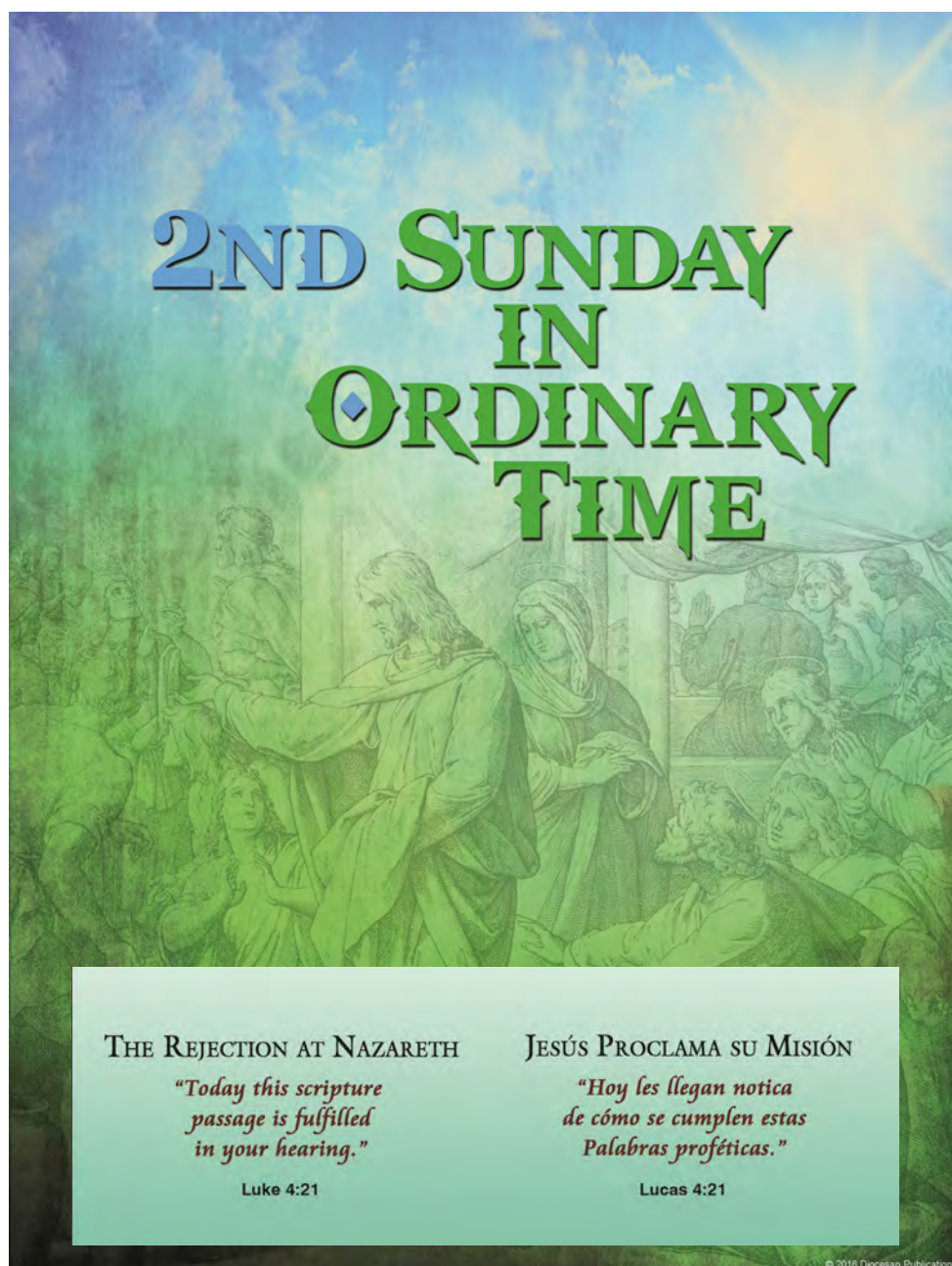

WHERE ARE *you* HEADED?

Freshman year was difficult. Nothing can compare to it: leaving home, the only life I had known up to that point, and moving to a huge university where I could be surrounded by people and still feel lonely. I was told that it takes time to make friends, which is true, but the waiting was excruciating.

I came to mass by myself one Sunday, and prayed that God would help me get through the next few weeks until I could go home again. At the end of mass, I heard an announcement for the **SMALL CHURCH COMMUNITIES**.

I cannot fully describe what I felt, but something in me moved and I felt an urge to join an SCC. I hoped that I would make some friends and maybe learn a little more about my faith. I now can see that the Holy Spirit was guiding me and my prayer was being answered.

I was a nervous wreck for our first meeting. I have always been shy and really didn't know what an SCC would be like. Did I know enough about the bible to participate? Who were these other strangers with whom I was about to discuss my faith? Was this really how I wanted to spend my time each Tuesday evening?

After the first meeting, I knew the answers to all of these questions. I didn't need to be a theology genius; I just needed to bring my own perspectives and be open to letting the Holy Spirit move in me to grow and learn about my faith. The

other group members quickly became my friends. The community created was friendly, supportive and built with the foundation of our faith. And yes, this was exactly how I wanted to spend every Tuesday evening. After every meeting, my worries were gone, and I felt refreshed and ready to take on the next week with God at the forefront of my mind.

Furthermore, through my SCCs I have grown tremendously in my faith: I have learned who Jesus was and who He is for me now, I have learned to see God in my everyday life, I have discovered the individuality of faith with us all still being one body in Christ, and I have discovered the Holy Spirit moving in

me and all those around me to be God's presence in the world.

Now, in my last semester of senior year, I am still taking part in SCCs. I am looking forward to the upcoming season to meet more wonderful people, and to continue on this journey of faith.

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist (Presentation of the Gifts)

We begin the Liturgy of the Eucharist with the Presentation of the Gifts. People from the community bring forth the bread and wine to be shared with everyone. However, these are not the only things we offer to God during the Presentation of the Gifts. We also offer ourselves.

Each time we go to Mass, we are called to offer to God all that we are. We offer ourselves as “gift” to God. Even though you may not be walking forward, you can still “carry” a gift, given to you by God. Each of us brings our own gifts to Mass to be blessed, broken and shared with others.

These preparatory rites serve three purposes: to prepare the altar, to prepare the gifts offered upon it, and to prepare the faithful for the Eucharistic celebration.

As the presider receives the gifts, he says prayers praising God for these good fruits of creation. Finally, the priest washes his hands in a bowl of water and dries them, while praying, inaudibly, that he be cleansed from sinfulness (from Psalm 51). Then the priest says an additional prayer over the offerings and invites the people to pray, that the sacrifice be acceptable for God’s glory and for the good of the Church.

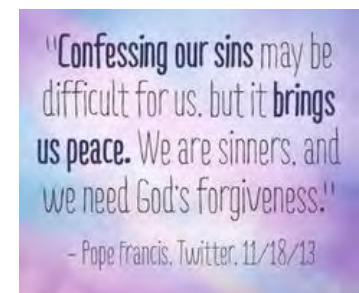
Infant Baptism Class
