When I first joined a Small Church Community, I had no idea how completely the experience would change my prayer life, my friendships, and my approach to my faith. It was a personal invitation from a friend that convinced me to join a graduate student and young professional SCC several years ago. Today we extend that same invitation to each of you—students, professionals, and resident parishioners alike—as we look toward our parish-wide season of Lenten SCCs.

Setting aside just 90 minutes in my week to reflect on the Sunday readings, spend time in prayer, and break open the Word with others has been a source of comfort, support, and spiritual growth for me. Coming together to center ourselves with Christ and grapple with what it means to be a person of faith has been an anchor and lifeline amidst transition; there is no denying the Spirit in our midst as we've been transformed individually and in communion with each other. Just as in today's Gospel, we've been able to encounter Jesus together, name the role He plays in our lives, and gather strength for our journeys.

SCC has helped me recognize God at work in all things—and discover Christ in those around me. The incredible bonds I have formed with fellow members in the groups I've been part of and facilitated are the cherished relationships that sustain me today. No matter where you are in your own experience—seeking friendship, a better understanding of your faith, to feel more “ready” to reflect on scripture each Sunday, or all of the above—we invite you to consider joining a Lenten SCC. Looking back, my decision to do so was one of the best I've ever made; if you're looking for a way to deepen your own spirituality, this upcoming season is the perfect time to take the first step.

Events like those in Ferguson, MO this past year showed us that minorities or those living in poverty don't feel like they have a voice in their community. **How can the Church empower those with no political leverage?**

Fr. Tom Firestone will speak from his experience helping to rebuild the city of Flint by providing safety, housing, education, and administration. Joining him will be Dr. Thomas Henthorn, Professor of History at U of M - Flint.

Fr. Tom Firestone was pastor of St. Mary Student Parish until January of 2005. He currently serves as pastor of St. John Vianney and his parish boundary includes the north side of Flint. He serves as chairperson of FACT (Flint Area Churches Together) an interfaith effort to improve life for residents of Flint through projects on school improvement and blight elimination. He is also instrumental in the ongoing service project for SMSP students with the St. Luke New Life Center.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program

Looking for a way to help your young child grow in relationship with God?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite preschool children ages 3-5 years to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish. This faith formation opportunity will be held on the following Sundays: **January 18, February 1, March 22, April 26, and May 3** after the 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 am-12:45 pm in the Newman Room. Materials cost is \$20 per child.

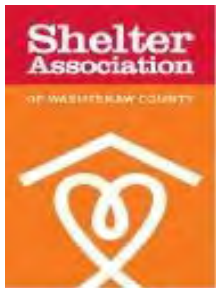
Born for Joy
