BSR Reflection by Jessica Montgomery, Student Intern for Hispanic Ministry

Our faith is not something for us to figure out alone. For most of my faith journey, I did not realize that this was true. I thought that I could figure out whatever God was trying to tell me on my own. Small conversations with friends could help things become clearer, but they could only provide small moments of clarity. Yet as the years went by, God's plan for me was still masked in a cloud of confusion, and I only had small glimpses of what it was.

I have been discerning religious life since my sophomore year of high school and despite being in the discernment process for about six years, I still consider myself to be in the very early stages. There have been moments of clarity through my own reflection throughout the years, like realizing that God does love me enough to have a plan for me, but the progress was slow. I tried to look for His signs, and I'm sure they were there, but I needed help interpreting them and figuring out how all these puzzle pieces fit into His plan for me.

When talking with a campus minister last semester about discernment, he recommended that I find a spiritual director to help me figure out God's call. I soon signed up for the Busy Student Retreat and started meeting with a spiritual companion. I quickly realized that this retreat was more of a blessing than I ever could have imagined.

Whenever I meet with my companion, we talk about what has happened in our lives since we last met, and it always amazes me how much God shows Himself and His loving plan for me each week. As I talk with my companion, she asks questions that are clearly guided by the Holy Spirit, allowing me to realize God's presence in my daily and prayer life. Through the wisdom God has

given her, my companion is able to help show me that God is working in every aspect of my life and calling me to whatever lifestyle will help me establish a fuller relationship with Him. By no means have I figured out everything that God has in store for me, but this retreat has helped me figure it out in a way that I could not have done on my own.

The Busy Student Retreat is not a big time commitment, and I promise that it will help you grow in your relationship with God. By signing up for the retreat, you commit to praying 15 minutes a day and talking with a spiritual advisor for up to an hour each week. This retreat has helped my prayer life in a much deeper way than I could have anticipated, and I encourage you to take this time to help grow in your relationship with God. I am sure that you will be amazed by how much you will see God's presence in your life.

New Jesuit at SMSP



We are pleased to announce Fr. Miguel Arrieta, S.J. will be joining our pastoral staff in July. The youngest of three children, Fr. Miguel Arrieta was born September 21, 1974 in Lima, Peru. After high school, he began studying mechanical engineering at the Pontifical Catholic University of Peru. After a one-year period of discernment, he entered the novitiate of the Society of Jesus at Arequipa, in southern Peru, at the age of 26.

Following his novitiate, he moved to Lima to pursue studies in philosophy at the Antonio Ruiz Lopez de Montoya University, a private Jesuit university in Lima, Peru. Also during this time he worked in the university chaplaincy in Lima. In 2007, he was sent to Cuba to make his regency, where he worked with youth ministry and vocations. Following Cuba, he traveled to Paris to study theology and teach Spanish to foreign students. Currently, Fr. Miguel coordinates campus ministry at the Antonio Ruiz Lopez de Montoya University.

Fr. Miguel Arrieta, S.J. will reside in Ann Arbor for one year and will split his time between hispanic ministry at St. Mary and studying English in preparation for graduate school at Loyola University. Fr. Tom Florek, S.J. will also continue his involvement with our hispanic ministry.

Tenemos el placer de anunciar que Pd. Miguel Arrieta, S.J. va a juntar el personal pastoral en julio. El menor de tres hijos, Pd. Miguel Arrieta nació el 21 de septiembre de 1974 en Lima, Perú. Después de sus estudios en el colegio, empezó a estudiar la ingeniería mecánico en La Pontificia Universidad Católica de Perú. Después de un año de discernimiento, entró al noviciado de la Compañía de Jesús en Arequipa, en el sur de Perú, cuando tenía 26 años. Después de su tiempo en el noviciado, se mudó a Lima, Perú para estudiar la filosofía en La Universidad Antonio Ruiz de Montoya, una universidad

privada y jesuita en Lima, Perú. Durante esta época, trabajaba como el capellán de la universidad en Lima. En el año 2007, fue enviado a Cuba para hacer su magisterio y trabajaba con el ministerio de la juventud y de las vocaciones. Después, se fue a Paris para estudiar la teología y enseñar el español a estudiantes extranjeros. Ahora, Pd. Miguel coordina la pastoral universitaria en La Universidad Antonio Ruiz de Montoya.

Pd. Miguel Arrieta, S.J. residirá en Ann Arbor por un año y dividirá su tiempo entre el ministerio hispano de la Parroquia de Santa María y sus estudios del inglés, para prepararse para sus estudios posgrados en la Universidad de Loyola. Pd. Tom Florek, S.J. continuará sus trabajos con nuestro ministerio hispano.

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist (Washing Hands)

In ancient times when the gifts were brought forth from the community, those could have included live animals. The washing ritual was a practical step before consecrating the bread and wine to be shared. The ritual remains in our Mass of today as a symbolic washing with a prayer that the priest says for interior purification, “Wash me, O Lord, from my iniquity and cleanse me from my sin.” It is a prayer that we can pray with him in our hearts to help prepare to receive the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation.

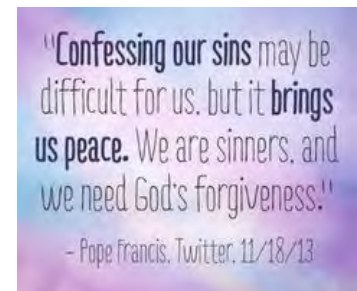
