

Pastoral Perspective

Generosity, like mercy, is twice blessed. It blesses those who give and those who receive. And you have - as usual - been generous in your support of our parish. During this year's Christmas Gift 2014 opportunity you gave us just over \$136,000, and during last year's Bridge the Gap opportunity you gave us just over \$103,000. So I hope you are feeling very blessed. I certainly am, and I want to thank you profusely for these gifts and for you generosity.

What does it mean to be blessed? This church-talk conjures images of formally dressed priests waving thuribles of incense. That is of course partly true. But the word indicates more than that: a blessing is an an action of one person or group of people that confers that which is good on another person or group of people. As people of Catholic faith – and as Catholic people of faith – we believe that such actions invoke divine participation as well. So when I do that which is good for you, God joins me in offering the good. The good you receive, coming from me and from God, raises this good into a richer source of joy, of life, of inspiration, and of hope than any human being could create by himself or herself.

At the end of the undergraduate men's retreat last Sunday morning I offered a blessing to each of the leaders who in turn blessed the members of their small groups. Then – "filled with the Holy Spirit," as St Luke said in his gospel - all 25 undergrads blessed one another. The formulation I gave them for the blessing was really quite simple, as the best blessings should be: "I'm glad you were here. While we were here, I saw that you are... (and they filled in recollections of what they had seen the man say and do). So I ask God to give you...(and they filled in whatever they asked God to give him or do for him.)"

Notice that the blessing process can be done without using the word "blessing." And without thuribles of incense and formal rubrics. It is quite simple, and each of you who is baptized can give a blessing with God's authority conferred at our baptisms: the Royal Priesthood of Christ. When coming from the heart, such a blessing invokes God's participation and so becomes something very rich and dynamic, bringing about whatever has been asked for.

So I thank you one more time for blessing us at the end of the last calendar year with your generosity. I assure you that your gifts are indeed a blessing. And I ask you to be attentive to the reality of your own lives and see and count the blessings that God offers you. Not least is the reality of Jesus present in the power of the Holy Spirit at every moment of our lives, the Spirit abiding in us always ready to assist us as we may need and ask.




Busy Student Retreat:




