# WELCOME THE STRANGER

***And when was it that we saw you a stranger  
and welcomed you . . . -Mt 25:38***

For the last month, we have been welcoming men and women to come out of the cold and find a place of rest in our Newman Hall. Each day in the warming center, our guests have brought their pains and troubles, their burdens and histories and have found a place of acceptance and openness where their dignity is recognized and affirmed. For a moment, they are able to let go, put down what they carry, and just be without question or hassle. Coffee is poured and food is shared. All, guests and hosts, become responsible for nurturing the community whether through serving a bowl of soup, mopping a floor, or guiding a troubled friend whose demons have the best of him. True and mutual connections are made through the sharing of our stories. In the month of January, the kingdom of God has shown brightly at St. Mary.

Now the warming center will move locations to First Baptist and First Congregational Church. I encourage everyone to continue to serve the kingdom of God, to continue to welcome those without a home by visiting the new locations. Thank you to our community for opening up our building to host the warming center. Thank you to the many parishioners who opened their hearts and visited the warming center, donated food, served meals, and most importantly, listened to the men and women who society prefers to ignore. Thank you to Sherri and Sulley, the warming center coordinators, who manage the daily operation of the center with peace and dignity. You have allowed your hearts to be broken and are a powerful witness for us of the face of mercy. Finally, thank you to our guests for trusting us with your stories, for building community here.

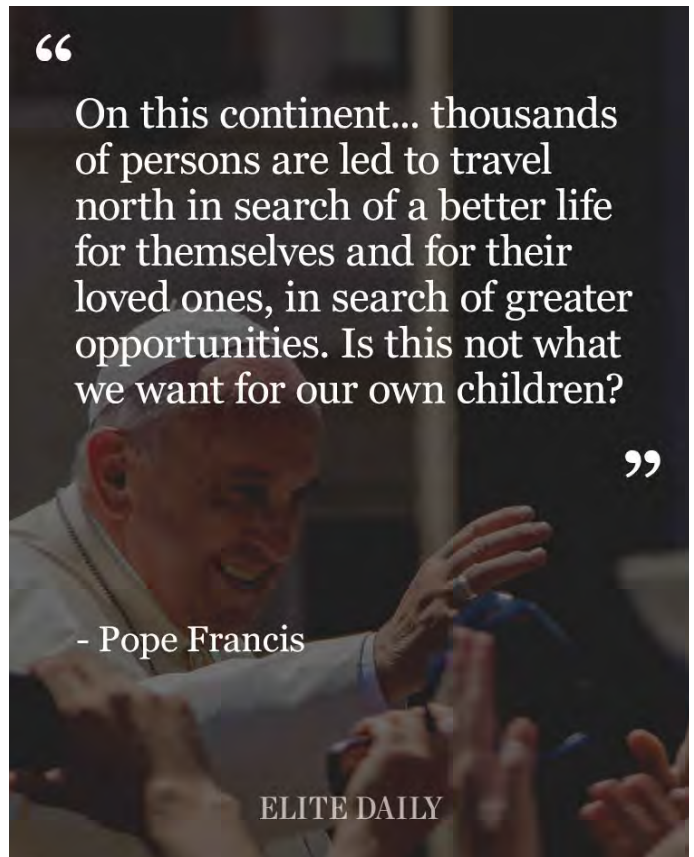
We will continue to celebrate the Year of Mercy and practice the necessity for hospitality by focusing on the theme of **Welcome the Stranger** and **Instruct the Ignorant** in the month of **February**. We turn our attention toward immigrants and refugees and their daily struggles with a broken immigration system:

**Prayer:** *Father of the poor, God of love, you made us all your children; we praise You and thank You. Fill us with a sense of justice. Help us in your work, to take the side of the lowly, to defend the newcomer, to welcome the stranger. Help us now to befriend the friendless, protect the weak children, and work for the rights of all. Lord, on our journey home, bring us together in peace, in justice, and in love, through Christ our Lord. Amen. (Source: Santa Catalina Catholic Parish, Tucson, AZ)*

**Education:** Many people believe the myth that undocumented immigrants are a burden on the U.S. economy and do not contribute by paying taxes. Undocumented immigrants do pay state and federal taxes and contribute almost \$7 billion to the Social Security Fund. They also pay sales taxes. They pay all these taxes while often being denied access to social services because of their legal status. # Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at [stmystudentparish.org](http://stmystudentparish.org)) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

## Liturgy of the Eucharist (Choosing the Eucharistic Prayer)

For the Liturgy of the Eucharist, the presider will select a Preface that is appropriate for the Sunday, or for a particular liturgical season. After the Preface, the presider and the assembly pray together through the entire Eucharistic Prayer.

This is a great prayer of praise and thanks. The Church has 13 different Eucharistic Prayers. While the exact wording will vary depending on which one is being prayed, the underlying structure is the same. Each of the prayers:

- ✠ *Acknowledges our need to give thanks to God*
- ✠ *Offers the bread and wine*
- ✠ *Asks God to send the Holy Spirit to transform the bread and the wine into the very presence of Christ*
- ✠ *Intercedes on behalf of the church, the world, the poor and those who have gone before us*

The Eucharistic Prayers are based on prayers that we have had in our tradition since the earliest years of the Church. In a very real way, everything that we have done at Mass before this point, has prepared us to enter into this great prayer.

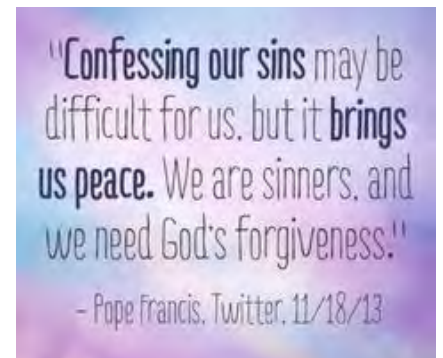
