

Guest Pastoral Perspective

Abby Braun, Campus Minister

I was never an altar server growing up, and I can't quite remember why. Thankfully, I didn't live in a diocese that banned girls from serving at the altar. In fact, my two younger sisters were altar servers at our parish, and to the embarrassment of my parents and me, they would visibly bicker during Mass over who got to wash the priest's hands or who got to ring the bells during the consecration when they served together. In hindsight, maybe I didn't want to be an altar server because I didn't want to be associated with the two of them.

It's more likely, though, that I was intimidated by the idea of altar serving- not only because I would be up in front of a lot of people but also because it required being close to the altar and the priest and the place where all of that mysterious business happens with the bread and the wine becoming the body and blood of Jesus. It meant the possibility of messing up something sacred and holy, and I didn't want to be responsible for that.

The irony of this story is that I'm the one in the family who ended up as a minister in the Church, and not only that, but for many years my primary job was to coordinate Masses and train liturgical ministers. Somewhere along the way, I began to experience what happened at the altar as less intimidating. It began to feel more like belonging to a community and hearing stories that were part of me and gathering around a table with friends. I began to fall in love with the ritual and the reality that Christ is present in the brokenness of bread and the brokenness of people, that we become the body of Christ when we come together and allow our own lives to be blessed and broken open for one another.

I once heard Fr. Greg Boyle, a Jesuit priest who started a remarkable gang intervention program LA, tell a story about a teenage boy and former gang member who was orphaned and invites a group of others who have nowhere to go to spend Christmas day with him. The boys were from rival gangs- essentially enemies- but they spent the day together cooking and eating a turkey. Fr. Boyle connected this story directly to what Jesus did when he celebrated the Last Supper with his disciples, and then he said something that has stayed with me: "Jesus doesn't lose any sleep that we will forget that the Eucharist is sacred. He is anxious that we might forget that it's ordinary, that it's a meal shared among friends."


My sense as a child- that what happens when we gather around the altar is mysterious and sacred and holy - wasn't wrong. The table is profoundly sacred. And it is also profoundly ordinary. We hold those two truths together. And we also remember that Jesus promises to be wherever two or three are gathered in his name. There isn't much we can do to mess that up.

I'd like to invite each of you today to consider any of the reasons you may have kept some distance from the altar. Maybe they are different than mine. Maybe they are good reasons and maybe it hasn't been the right time. But maybe God is inviting you now to come closer - whether as an altar server, a Eucharistic Minister, a reader, an usher, or a greeter. The need for liturgical ministers at St. Mary is great and the time commitment is small. 




No One is a Stranger, All Are Welcome


