

Lent: Dust and Spirit

"Then the LORD God formed man of dust from the ground, and breathed into his nostrils the breath of life; and man became a living being." (Genesis 2:7)

Dust and Spirit, the two experiences that every human on the face of the planet have shared since the beginning of time. Dust and Spirit, the common ground, and the freely given grace of the breath of the Spirit that makes all one.

Lent is the season where we are invited to once again review the common ground of our universal human experience; to be cast and plunged into the story of what binds us together.

It is the story where we are invited to enter more deeply into the experience of Jesus, who as Son of Man, is one with us in solidarity in all that is human, including our deepest moments of vulnerability, weakness, loneliness and death. It is an invitation to enter more deeply and intimately into the prayer experience of Jesus himself, the prayer led by the Spirit manifested in his Baptism which moves him to pray "Our" to be inclusive, to share life with everyone, even if it is the practice of such prayer that leads him to the cross, because "this man eats with sinners." And we are all sinners, predestined, called, justified and glorified.

We are also the beloved children of the Father, who have been given the first fruits of that same Spirit who also teaches us as it did in Jesus' baptism to pray "Abba," "Father," the same merciful Father who is always welcoming all of his prodigal children to the family meal.

The story we share is a story of our common ground and the common breath of the Spirit, the Spirit which makes us living beings, the Spirit that is poured forth in the death and resurrection of Jesus, which will raise us together to share in the glory of the children of God forever.

May the Spirit teach us to rejoice in our common ground, to understand more deeply what it is to pray out of our experience of baptism into Christ Jesus. May our earthen vessels be filled with new life and new spirit. For all of creation awaits the revelation of the children of God.

Partnering with Groundcover News

As part of International Vendor Week, our parish has teamed up with local vendors from Groundcover News to help raise awareness of the newspaper and all the benefits it brings to the community.

During the first week of Lent, the many Small Church Communities here at St. Mary's have been encouraged to study and reflect on the articles and themes in this month's edition of the Groundcover News. Some of the groups are also choosing to explore other opportunities to help, such as sponsoring an ad in the paper.

Groundcover was founded in Ann Arbor in 2010. Its mission is to create opportunity and a voice for low-income people, while focusing on the greater need to end homelessness and poverty in our area. Some of the principles of the Groundcover organization echo the values found in Catholic Social Teaching. These include:

All people have a right to dignity.

Diversity has intrinsic value.

Poverty is political – systemic change is necessary.

Building community is essential to social change.

Studying these issues ties in well with the Lenten theme our parish has chosen for Lent. All of us are "Cast Into the Story," but the roles are not always easy. Hopefully our journey together will help make the story easier to bear.

As we begin Lent, our weekly theme is "We are cast as a common humanity." We all share the universal experience of being human and being called together in faith.

To prepare for the SCC discussions, St. Mary's invited Groundcover vendor Lit Kurtz to speak at a recent meeting of the SCC facilitators.

Lit explained the importance of the "street paper" movement and how her work as a vendor has helped her to gain some independence. Liz lost her job in 2012 with Detroit Public Schools as part of a mass layoff. Eventually she lost everything and ended up on the street.

Lit was thrilled to be able to promote the cause at our parish and is very excited that our small groups will be studying and reflecting on the articles in the paper, many of them written by her.

"Many of the articles focus on the real issues of homelessness and the dignity of those who struggle," she said. "These are articles that you can't always find in the mainstream media."

Lit explained that vendors also learn positive sales skills and professionalism from their jobs.

She encouraged our parish members to speak with street vendors and to learn more about this important initiative. People are also welcome to serve as guest vendors, working alongside a Groundcover vendor. Greater awareness is important, she said, since many people pass by unaware that the dollar they donate could enable someone to eat a meal or stay in a warm hotel room for the night.

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist

(Words of Institution)

If the Eucharistic Prayer is the heart of the Mass, then the institution narrative, which comes next, is the heart of hearts. In the context of a prayer, the words of Jesus at the Last Supper are retold. While many Catholics have been taught that this is the moment of consecration, when the bread and wine become the Body and Blood of Christ, modern liturgy scholars prefer to emphasize the integrity and completeness of the *entire* Eucharistic Prayer.

However, the words of institution and the elevation of the Body and Blood are moments when the assembly rightly responds with profound silence and attention, "for in our very midst, God transforms mundane things of our world into the gift of himself for our salvation."

After this, the presider introduces the Mystery of Faith, or the Memorial Acclamation. There is a choice of three different texts for this. It is usually up to the music minister to decide which is used.

"The Memorial Acclamation, sung by all, sums up and praises the Paschal Mystery of Christ, linking the celebration at hand to the whole of salvation history. It is noteworthy, that, unlike the rest of the Eucharistic Prayer, which is addressed to God the Father, each version of the Mystery of Faith addresses Christ the Son, who is now sacramentally present on the altar."

Centering Prayer Mondays at 6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book *Open Heart, Open Mind* by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction.

All are welcome. The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session. Otherwise, we typically sit for two 20-minute silent prayer sessions with a short meditative walk in between.




