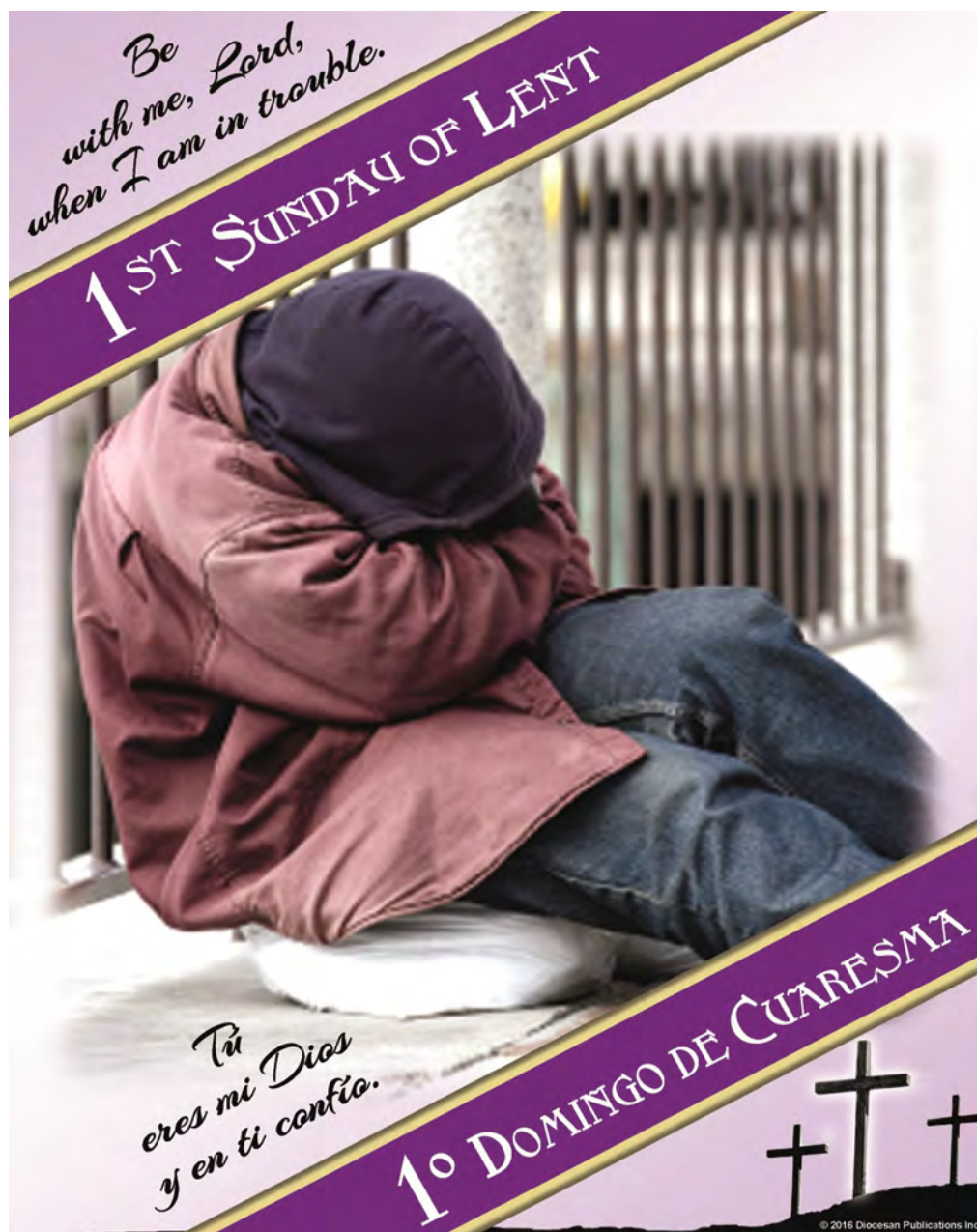

First Sunday of Lent

Lenten Reflection

By An Authentic Engineering Alumnus

At first glance; the temptations Jesus is faced with seem kind of ridiculous. I don't know about you, but I can't remember the last time I was tempted with all the kingdoms of the world. But the actual stress Jesus faced is something everyone has dealt with in some form.

Each temptation is framed with a deceptively simple "If you are the son of God". The Devil isn't just tempting Jesus; he is assailing and attacking his very identity as savior. He is trying to encourage in Jesus feelings of self-doubt and fear. Each of the temptations tries to take advantage of even a seed of insecurity; and ultimately tests Jesus' conviction that he is the Messiah.

How often when we are faced with a major challenge do feelings of self-doubt and even questions about your very identity occur? Just when you need to make a major decision or solve a challenging issue; you can almost expect these feelings to appear in some form. If I really was so smart; I wouldn't have done poorly on that test; maybe I don't even belong at this school or in this major. Or if I really was such a good person, why did I mess a problem up or let something bad happen? Maybe I'm not such a good person after all.

If ignored, these feelings of self-doubt can lead to paralyzing fear and desolation, and erode your faith in God probably right when you need God's grace and wisdom the most. But Jesus offers us a different example. Instead of allowing the temptations and challenges to lead him to a place of fear, he turned over his fears and insecurities to God and used the opportunity to grow in his own faith and convictions. The invitation and model for all of us is to do the same.

Questions for Reflection:

Can you recognize times and circumstances in your own life where in addition to struggling with a challenge, you also had to grapple with a loss of self-confidence? How did you overcome this and how did it affect your relationship with God?

Is fear the opposite of faith?

We are all cast into different roles, at different times, but during these times we must remember we are all one cast: the children of God. Open your heart this Lent and let the drama prepare you for the risen Lord.

- ◆ Second Sunday of Lent: We are cast as a blessing to others.
- ◆ Third Sunday of Lent: We are cast to a universal need for grace.
- ◆ Fourth Sunday of Lent: We are cast to return home.
- ◆ Fifth Sunday of Lent: We are cast to be merciful.
- ◆ Palm Sunday: Casting Call!

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist

(The Doxology)

After the Mystery of Faith, the presider continues the Eucharistic Prayer with “prayers of intercession.” Much like the General Intercessions that the assembly prayed together (responding with “Lord, hear our prayer”), these intercessions once again allow the gathered assembly to look “far beyond itself.”

Here the presider prays for the entire Church, specifically naming our Bishop and Pope, the clergy and all of us who make up the Body of Christ. This prayer leads up to praying in unity with Mary, all the saints and all our faithful departed. Together with the presider, the community prays not just for the church universal, but we acknowledge that we celebrate the Eucharist “here and now,” in union with the “great band of believers,” living and dead, who form the Body of Christ.

“These intercessions remind us that we are on a journey and keep us connected to those ahead of us on the road home.”

Finally, we come to the Doxology, which praises the father through the Son, with the Holy Spirit. The presider lifts high the bread and wine in one final gesture of offering and chants the Doxology, “Through him, and with him, and in him...”

Together, we answer with the Great Amen, which is sung whenever possible. Through our heartfelt “Amen,” we make this prayer of thanksgiving our own. “Our sacrifice of praise is complete.”



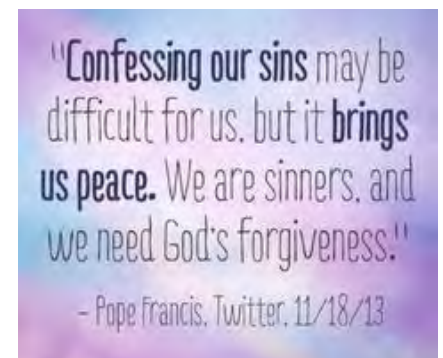

Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book *Open Heart, Open Mind* by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction.

All are welcome. The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session. Otherwise, we typically sit for two 20-minute silent prayer sessions with a short meditative walk in between.
