

Now is the Time By Fr. Ben Hawley, S.J.

For God says, "At an acceptable time I have listened to you, and on a day of salvation I have helped you." See, now is the acceptable time. See, now is the day of salvation! (II Corinthians 6:1, 2)

In writing to the Corinthian community, St. Paul quotes Isaiah 49 to help them realize that the 500-year-old prophesy is being fulfilled in his time – and NOW in our time. So, my staff and I have chosen as our parish theme for this Lent:

Now is the Time.

Of course, Lent already has a theme – so we really do not need to devise a new one: God's active love, made present in Jesus, overcomes whatever constrains us and guarantees us new life with God forever. But that abstract theme, true as it is, remains an abstraction until we invite God to make it real in our own experience. Our parish theme, then, is an invitation to each of us to hear St. Paul speaking to us individually and personally, Now in this time in a new and special way.

Our major Lent theme gives rise to a variety of modes of engaging God and this season: so the theme for the first week of Lent is Now is the Time to Prepare. In a similar way the themes for weeks two to six build on the initial invitation: Now is the Time to Listen, to See, to Act, to Heal, and to Say Yes. As you and I are willing to respond to the invitation of each of these weeks, we will be ready to engage more fully with Jesus as he enters into Holy Week and the great climax of his public ministry.

Living out these themes requires personal commitment, a commitment that we then share communally at mass and in service. So for the coming week the theme Now is the Time to Prepare asks you to make a concrete resolution to engage more deeply in some way special to you. Start with something easy, but powerful: every day name the many good things of your life (family, job, house, health) and thank God. Or start with reading something on-line, like the Small Church Community reflections on the readings of the Sundays of Lent, or the St Mary's blog, or daily reflections from the Jesuits of the British Province (Pray as You Go) or the Irish Province (Sacred Silence).

But, please START! Now is the Time! What is at stake is our own lives and the life of the world. Jesus promises us a life that is fuller and richer than anything we can imagine or create for ourselves. And he promises us a way through the hard times that will come to most of us. Jesus also promises to prepare us and send us to people in need – who may be right around us now – who need divine help that we can offer through our efforts, as a matter of care or a fight for justice. Lent is our time to come to know him more fully and the fullness of life that only he can give.
