

Lenten Reflection

By A Male Campus Minister

My Mom is a miracle. Almost forty years ago, my dad sat my older sister and me down and told us that mom was very sick; she would be going to the hospital. She had been diagnosed with stage IV breast cancer and did not know what the future would be for her and her five young children. She survived but in 2009 she called me to say she would not be able to come to my oldest son's first birthday party because she was sick again. She had been diagnosed this time with ovarian cancer.

Now, seven years later, she has survived and beaten cancer. More importantly, she lives her life with purpose and not regrets and recriminations. Each moment for her is an opportunity to love and she has never let her children, her grandchildren, or her husband forget that they are loved. She lives in peace and joy, a sort of indifference, and I am so grateful for her life and the gift that she is.

I will not believe that her cancer is a punishment from God or even a testing of her faith. No, she is no more guilty, I am no more guilty, than the unfortunate people killed by the falling tower at Siloam we hear about in today's Gospel. Suffering is not a punishment for our sinfulness and we need not seek it out in order to draw closer to God. Suffering will find us. It is our response that matters.

Sin and suffering are real. Will we repent and believe that God never tires of us? Will we seek forgiveness? Will we cultivate the ground of our heart, fertilize it, so that our lives bear fruit? Will we allow God to tend to our barrenness, to be our master gardener?

Questions for Reflection:

- How have you responded to the suffering in your life?
- During Lent, what are you doing to cultivate the ground of your heart?
- ♣ How is God the master gardener of your life?

Lent 2016 Cast Anto the Story

This Lent you have been cast into the story. The roles will not always be easy; you may find yourself tempted by the devil, as Jesus was for 40 days in the wilderness. Or you may find you've turned away from Jesus, as Peter did on the eve of the crucifixion.

We are all cast into different roles, at different times, but during these times we must remember we are all one cast: the children of God. Open your heart this Lent and let the drama prepare you for the risen Lord.

The following themes will guide us on our journey:

- Ash Wednesday: We are cast as a common humanity.
- First Sunday of Lent: We are cast as children of God.
- Second Sunday of Lent: We are cast as a blessing to others.
- Third Sunday of Lent: We are cast to a universal need for grace.
- Fourth Sunday of Lent: We are cast to return home.
- Fifth Sunday of Lent: We are cast to be merciful.
- ◆ Palm Sunday: Casting Call!

Each week, we're passing out a small card as you exit the church to help guide your reflection. We invite you to keep this card in your pocket, on your dashboard, or even on your fridge - place it where you'll have a moment to reflect on how you're cast into the story. This week's prompt:




Rite of Election with Bishop Boyea

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist

(The Lord's Prayer and Sign of Peace)
After the Great Amen, the assembly stands together and recites *the Lord's Prayer*. This is the prayer that unites ALL Christians – the prayer that Jesus, himself, gave us. Not only does it serve to unify us, it allows us to pause before we share in the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation. As we pray together, we recognize that our daily bread comes from God.

Before the prayer ends, Catholic tradition calls for the priest to insert an additional petition for peace and deliverance from evil (called the embolism). It is an ancient part of the Lord's Prayer for Catholics, but often unfamiliar to Protestant visitors.

Sign of Peace: In this ritual sharing of Christ's peace, we use the first words of Jesus after the Resurrection: "Peace be with you." It also reflects Jesus' Sermon on the Mount from Matthew's Gospel, when he urges his followers to be at peace with one another before making an offering to the Lord.

This is not just a kind greeting, it is a sincere sign that we desire to forgive and be forgiven before receiving the Lord in Communion. The Sign of Peace is generally shared as a handshake, along with a heartfelt wish that the other person may experience the peace of Christ. By exchanging this greeting with one another, we are renewing our commitment to be a people who bring about the true peace that only Christ can grant us.

When we exchange the Sign of Peace at Mass, it is a sign of hope. This ritual action expresses our desire for peace, love and unity in the Church, and among all humanity. It is a reminder that Christ is our peace, and this "divine peace" of the risen Lord is always with us.

SUNDAY READINGS

FEBRUARY 21 - SECOND SUNDAY OF LENT

Reading I Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18 27:1, 7-9, 13-14 **Psalms Psalm** Reading II Philippians 3:17-4:1 Gospel Luke 9:28-36

Abram's faith is sealed with a covenant initiated by God, our light and our salvation. The transfiguration of Jesus prefigures the transformation in glory to which we are called by our sharing in the paschal mystery—the dying and rising of Jesus.

FEBRUARY 28 - THIRD SUNDAY OF LENT

Exodus Reading I 3:1-8a, 13-15 Psalm Psalms 103:1-4, 6-8, 11 Reading II 1Corinthians 10:1-6, 10-12 Gospel Luke 13:1-9

From the burning bush, Moses is called by God to lead his people out of slavery into freedom. The parable of the fig tree speaks, on the one hand, of God's patience, but, on the other, of the urgency of the call to conversion. Like the Hebrews of old, we too have failed to heed God's call, thinking ourselves to be selfrighteous.

Centering Prayer Mondays at

6:30 PM

Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book Open Heart, Open Mind by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. All are welcome. The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session. Otherwise, we typically sit for two 20-minute silent prayer sessions with a short meditative walk in between.




