NOW IS THE TIME

...TO ACT

"For it is love that I desire, not sacrifice, and knowledge of God rather than burnt offerings." Hosea 6:6

This week we will hit the half way point of our Lenten observance. Easter is only 4 weeks away! How are we doing with our Lenten practices of prayer, fasting and almsgiving? Our theme this year of "Now is the Time" has invited us to prepare, to listen, to see, and now this week to ACT. In my work this year as the Social Justice Ministry assistant, I have witnessed many of our St. Mary Student Parish members ACTing on their faith in various ways. And for that I praise God!

Sometimes it is the first thing that we want to do: action, service or volunteerism in the name of Jesus. And while this is very good both for us and for the communities which we serve, Lent is a time to take a step back to look at our motivations and our true gifts and to re-energize ourselves to ACT with love. In fact, one thing that I learned during our hosting of the Daytime Warming Shelter in January is that sometimes when we are ACTing with love, it seems as if we aren't doing anything. Often times, we are simply listening to someone's story or offering our own story as a way to connect as human beings. As children of God. When I am sharing this type of interaction with another person, I am humbled by our common humanity. I become more grateful for the gifts that God has given me and I come to recognize the gifts in that other person. When my motivation is only to listen and to love, my ACTions will more closely match the needs of the other. My ACTions will come from the place where I have been listening to God; my ACTions will come as I see the other as Jesus sees that person; my ACTions will spring from my true gifts and knowledge of God.

All my life, I have felt called to ACT on my faith. I remember collecting clothing for Birthright as a young person and volunteer babysitting as a teen. As I've gotten older, I've seen both service and advocacy as actions that spring directly from my faith in Jesus. But along the way, I have learned much about why and how to ACT and that has come from a realization that silence and inaction are the starting point. I cannot be constantly ACTing, or my energy, my motivation, my strength and peace will diminish. I need to start first with silence (LISTEN) which leads to faith (SEEING) and that can lead me on to service (ACTING). It seems contradictory, but Mother Teresa says it well in her Simple Path:

The fruit of silence is PRAYER

The fruit of prayer is FAITH

The fruit of faith is LOVE

The fruit of love is SERVICE

The fruit of service is PEACE

So as we continue on our Lenten journey, we do want to ACT but we must continue to LISTEN and SEE with eyes of faith so that our ACTION springs from the love of God within us and leads to the peace that only God can give us.

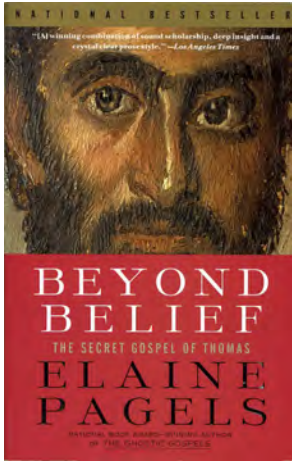

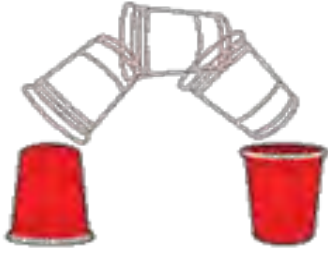

Deepen Your Faith Follow Along with SCCs

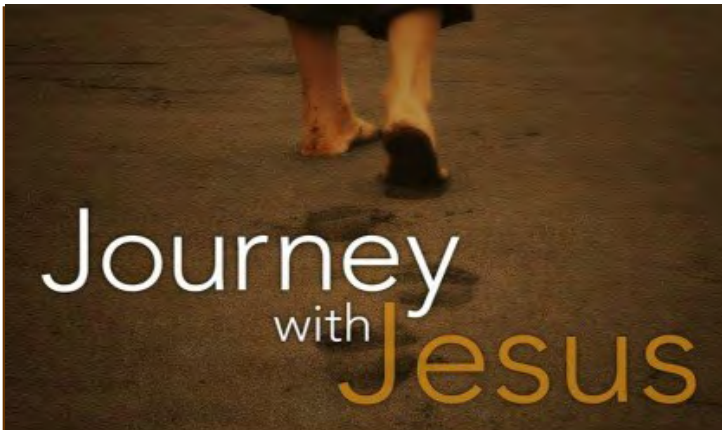
