

Images of Mary

Happy Mother's Day! As we celebrate this special day in honor of those who have nurtured and cared for us, let us remember also our Blessed Mother, the greatest of all saints. As Catholics, we have a special devotion to Mary because she is the first and greatest disciple of Jesus.

We honor her in a special way (we don't worship any of the saints) because Mary is a model for us. She showed us — even as a young girl — how to faithfully "say yes" to God's plan. Mary's own words in scripture are few, but the Gospel writers show her as a woman whose heart is attuned completely to the will of the Father.

"Behold, I am the handmaid of the Lord. May it be done to me according to your word." (Luke 1: 38)

In that same chapter from Luke, as she visits Elizabeth, Mary gives us a great example of prayer, when she spontaneously prays, "My soul proclaims the greatness of the Lord; my spirit rejoices in God my savior ... His mercy is from age to age."

We also believe that Mary is the only person, apart from Jesus, who was born without sin. That may cause us to view her as distant and separate from us, yet we see in scripture that she was a loving friend and mother, as well as a disciple. Mary shows complete faith in Jesus, as she asks him to help her friends at their wedding in Cana (John 2: 1-11). She firmly believes that Jesus can work miracles.

Mary can give us solace and comfort, because we know she is a woman who suffered loss and severe heartache. With great hope, we turn to her. We ask for her prayers on our behalf, knowing with confidence that she can understand us and she will intercede for us.

In his book, My Life with the Saints, James Martin, S.J. explains that the account of the Annunciation shows what a relationship with God can look like for any "real-life believer." Fr. Martin writes:

"To begin with, the initiative lies entirely with God. It is God, through the angel Gabriel, who begins the dialogue with Mary ... as God does in our lives. God begins the conversation. God speaks to us, and in often unexpected ways."

As we see through Mary's example, it's how we respond that makes all the difference.






