

Guest Pastoral Perspective


It is difficult to leave the place we call home, and I am finding it hard to believe that in a few short weeks I will be leaving my home here at St. Mary's. Although most of the students are gone for the summer there has been plenty to do at St. Mary's. Rachel, the other peer minister, and myself have been busy with what Gary Pearce kindly calls "liturgical restoration". This work has included many diverse projects including painting, organizing closets, and cleaning in the church. At first these tasks seemed ordinary but over the past month and a half they have become meaningful for me.

Last week when I found myself cleaning the chairs closest to the tabernacle I turned off my ipod and instead prayed while I cleaned. I found myself overwhelmed with gratitude; gratitude for all the people at St. Mary's who have touched my heart, for all the ways I have grown closer to the Creator through my year of service here, and gratitude for the opportunity to continue to serve through the summer, especially when I can be so close to the real presence of Jesus Christ while doing so. I was full of this sense of gratitude when I read today's readings about being sent out, but I found myself struggling to accept that I too was being sent to a new place.

In the first reading from Amos (Amos 7:12-15) and in today's gospel reading (Mark 6:7-13) people are being sent out. It is not easy to be asked to leave the place where you are comfortable but it is comforting to know that we are not alone. Jesus sends out the disciples "two by two". We are all called to go out and spread the Good News, but we do not need to go alone. A year ago I was called to St. Mary's, a new place where I didn't know anyone. Although I may have arrived alone, I was immediately surrounded by an incredibly caring community.

There are many staff members, parishioners, and students who have been my companions on my journey this year. It will be difficult to leave these companions when I move to California in August to go to the Jesuit School of Theology at Berkeley where I will get my Masters of Divinity. Today's gospel and my time here at St. Mary's both give me hope that when I leave this place I will not be going alone. I will leave with the spiritual companionship and prayers of this community. A community which will continue to be in my heart and prayers as I leave this place I have come to call home.

CATHOLIC SOCIAL TEACHING

"Amen, I say to you, whatever you did for one of these least brothers of mine, you did for me." (Matthew 25: 41)

Why did Pope Francis get involved in the debate about the environment?

The Pope's recent encyclical (a pastoral letter that is sent to the whole Church) encourages all of us to be mindful of how we can help solve current environmental problems, such as climate change and destruction of resources that affects the poor disproportionately.

The Catholic Church has a long tradition of applying the gospel to various situations in society, in order that society may be transformed. This tradition is called Catholic Social Teaching and it includes a list of principles and guidelines to help us apply Church teachings to social and political issues.

One of the principles is "Care for God's Creation," which Pope Francis specifically addresses in his encyclical, called *Laudato Si': On Care for our Common Home*. This principle tells us that God is the creator of all people and all things, and he wants us to enjoy his creation. We are called to make good choices – moral and ethical – that protect the ecological balance of all of God's creation.

Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book Open Heart, Open Mind by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction. All are welcome.

The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session.
