Building Relationships

Each evening of this year's Flint Family Service Trip, our group of 27 adults, teens, and children would gather in the living room of our gracious host (Dave Wolbert) for reflection and prayer. Our group leaders (Lisa Hirsch and Tom McDonough) would ask each of us to think back on the day's events and then share a single word or short phrase that came to mind. The diverse and thoughtful responses elicited vivid images and complex emotions: "grateful," "inspired," "hard work," "fun," "humbled," "Ajax," "generosity," "paint," "love," "listening," "mulch," "courageous," "tired," "soap scum," "community," to list a few. One word, offered each day, best captured the essence of the trip; that word was "relationship." Some parishioners might recall that former St. Mary's pastor Fr. Tom Firestone rarely made it through a homily without mentioning the word "relationship", often more than once. "Relationship", he'd remind us, is God's love made manifest in our world. Fittingly, it was the relationships he formed and maintained that accounted for our presence in Flint where he now shepherds 4 parishes. Decidedly, it was the relationships our group built with each other and the people we met that allowed us to experience and share God's love during our trip. But just how does one go about building relationships?

Sharing Stories: Stories were shared as we worked, ate, played, and prayed together each day. Importantly, we learned to value listening as an act of discovery and generosity. We discovered that Phil played minor league baseball and was an actor and insurance salesman before becoming head of maintenance for the Shelter Association of Flint. We listened spellbound as Sisters Carol and Judy told us how they started the New Life Center (an amazing organization that trains, employs, feeds, and spiritually nurtures those in need) based on their discernment of a dream and a niece's Confirmation service project. We were humbled as Laquita, an unassuming yet undeniably courageous 23-year-old woman who worked at the North End Soup Kitchen, quietly told us how she was raising six nieces and nephews so they wouldn't be placed in foster care. **Common Values:** In the sharing of stories, we identified common values that spanned our differences and united us in a common bond: justice, equality, safety, purpose, opportunity, gratitude, and generosity. **Mutual Effort:** The bonds of relationship are best fortified when individuals work side by side, motivated by a shared vision and a strong desire to achieve a common goal. During our trip we discovered that common goals can be as simple as scraping off a tenacious film of soap scum from a shower, making 150 sandwiches, or dispersing 10 cubic yards of mulch. In building relationships, the effort often matters more than the outcome.

In summary, our Flint Family Service Trip humbled and emboldened us. More importantly, it united us in lasting relationships, built with shared stories, common values, and sustained efforts. Through these relationships, we experienced and shared God's great love for us.

TRADITIONAL PRAYERS

Why do Catholics often speak to God using traditional prayers? Why not just pray in your own words?

Prayer isn't a zero-sum game. You should feel free to pray in whatever way you feel most comfortable – whether it's spontaneous prayer in your own words, or traditional prayers. Catholics pray in many ways, but we do value traditional prayers, which can be useful and comforting.

Joe Paprocki, author of *"A Well-Built Faith,"* (Loyola Press) says that traditional prayers are like "family heirlooms that have been handed down to us by the Church through the centuries."

Catholics are blessed to have a rich treasury of traditional prayers, such as the Hail Mary, the Act of Contrition, the Memorare and others. These common prayers enable groups of people to pray together in unison and they are helpful in certain times, when we cannot find words of our own to pray.

Fr. James Martin, author of *"The Jesuit Guide to Almost Everything,"* has this to say about prayer: "Any time spent with God is transformational."

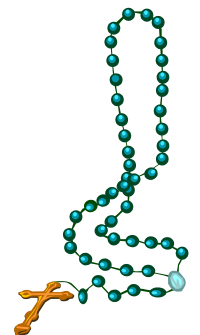
