

MEET OUR NEWEST CAMPUS MINISTER

This past week, we welcomed Fr. John Ferone, S.J. to the staff. Fr. John comes to us from Miami University in Oxford, Ohio, where he was Director of Campus Ministry at St. Mary Catholic Church and Newman Center for the past three years and served as a campus minister in that parish for almost 20 years. He also taught for eight years at a Jesuit High School in Cincinnati.

Working with students, he says, is a wonderful adventure.

"I love helping students discover their uniqueness, their own, individual calling, and trying to help them realize that they're unique and there's a reason for that," he said. "Each one of them is a particular facet of the Body of Christ. I love teaching them that they can show God to the world in a way that they've never seen it before and somehow sparking that."

Here are a few other interesting things about Fr. John:

 He loves animals (even hugging Tigers in Thailand) and he enjoys reading about



them and photographing them. His office walls are filled with beautiful examples of his work, including an elephant, a snow leopard and a marine iguana that he photographed on his sabbatical trip to the Galapagos Islands.

- Fr. John grew up in Cincinnati, Ohio.
- He has many hobbies, including art (especially drawing and creating liturgical banners), photography, cooking, gardening and reading (especially J.R.R. Tolkien, Harry Potter and C.S. Lewis).
- He is a musician and enjoys singing and playing the bass and the clarinet. He also just finished composing a Mass setting in honor of Our Lady.

Being a Jesuit, he added, has provided him with "a great life," filled with rich and varied experiences. – "experiences in life, experiences in growing, experiences of meeting new friends, experiences of being in awe and wonder."

"The possibilities are limitless," he said. "I couldn't picture doing anything else."



THE SIGN OF PEACE: 'CHRIST IS OUR PEACE'

When we exchange the Sign of Peace at Mass, it is a sign of hope. This ritual action expresses our desire for peace, love and unity in the Church, and among all humanity. It is a reminder that Christ is our peace, and this "divine peace" of the risen Lord is always with us.

The Sign of Peace was reintroduced into the Mass when the Liturgy was reformed after the Vatican II council. The action was part of many changes that encouraged people to come to the Liturgy not as observers, but as more active participants, and as members of the Body of Christ.

Offered just before we receive the Eucharist, the Sign of Peace is generally shared as a handshake along with a heartfelt wish that the other person may experience the peace of Christ. By exchanging this greeting with one another, we are renewing our commitment to be a people who bring about the true peace that only Christ can grant us. Family Faith Formation & Teen Confirmation



The Family Faith Formation program is for registered parish families whose eldest child is in at least kindergarten and serves students through the seventh grade academic year. Family Faith Formation is a home-based catechesis that requires parents and children to attend a monthly formation class (Sundays, October-May) and work at home on lessons. The Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically completed in the 2nd grade year and it is encouraged that children have received at least one year of faith formation before their sacramental prep year.

Teen confirmation is for eighth grade students who have completed the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, and Eucharist. Our teen confirmation program meets 2-3 times a month on Sunday afternoons between October-May. Teens attend most sessions on their own with some parental involvement at some of the sessions. In addition to attending class, teens are required to complete a faith formation text at home, complete 25 hours of service, and attend a day-long retreat. It is recommended that teens come to their confirmation preparation year with recent faith formation experience.

More information and registration forms are available in the parish office. Space is limited, so early registration is recommended.






