"Be doers of the word and not hearers only"
Second reading, Jas 1:17-18, 21b-22, 27



The Sunday readings emphasize social justice, providing an important lens through which to view the work of Sr. Priscilla Busingye, who will be presenting the annual Mission Appeal on August 30. Sr. Priscilla is the only Obstetrician/Gynecologist in the Rwenzori region of western Uganda. She's a member of the Daughters of Saint Therese of the Child Jesus (Banyatereza Sisters), a Ugandan order of Sisters who have fully answered the call for social justice. They currently serve in Uganda, Rwanda, Kenya and the Congo (DRC), typically working in low resource and rural communities - many that have been affected by war and refugee populations. In addition to supporting Catholic liturgical ministries in their local parishes, the Sisters manage two

hospitals, nearly a dozen clinics, many schools and a few orphanages. Sr. Priscilla is based at Holy Family Virika Hospital, owned by the Catholic Archdiocese of Fort Portal. The hospital serves as a hub for the outlying clinics. She lives on the hospital grounds, and is on-call 24 hours a day/7 days a week, maintaining a clinical practice that's heavily focused on saving the lives of mothers and children. Most women in this region give birth without the benefit of a skilled birth attendant, resulting in high maternal and infant mortality. Outreach through the clinics brings health-care services closer to the villages where prenatal services are also offered. Prolonged labor can leave women with a complication (i.e. fistula) resulting in the uncontrolled leakage of bodily fluids. Not uncommonly, this leads to social withdrawal or worse, with affected women ostracized from their communities and families without a mother. One of the many important projects of Sr. Priscilla and her team is to repair these fistulas and return women to the central role they play in society.

We've had the good fortune to work with Sr. Priscilla and her community in Uganda. The problems seem overwhelming and the stories

are often disheartening. Yet we often feel like we are witnessing small and frequent miracles, fortunate to share in the joy and love that is central to the Sisters' work.

We have also experienced this same joy and love in the outreach of the Catholic community in Ann Arbor to Sr. Priscilla and Virika Hospital. They have supported a number of initiatives including a new birthing center that brings skilled attendants to a region served by the hospital, funding for surgical services to repair injuries associated with childbirth, and funding to provide systems to bring clean water to Virika Hospital and the new birthing center.

The Sisters' positive impact on the communities they serve provides clear evidence of God's hand and the truth reflected in this Sunday's readings.

Mission Appeal-August 30—Holy Family Virika Hospital

Doctor Sister Priscilla Busingye (pictured above) will speak at all the masses about the work of Holy Family Virika Hospital to provide quality health care to the people, especially those in poverty, of the Rwenzori region of Uganda. Holy Family Virika Hospital is also a teaching hospital training Ugandan health professionals to provide holistic care to the poor and vulnerable. We will have a special collection to support this valuable and needed ministry.

Born and raised in a nearby village, Sr. Priscilla is committed to improving the health and welfare of the Ugandan people and is particularly devoted to women and children. She oversees nearly 2,000 deliveries a year, working nearly every day and on call most nights. Women travel from afar for care, often arriving with severe complications of pregnancy that threaten the lives of both mothers and babies.

After difficult deliveries, many women require fistula repair

surgery to regain their health and return to their families. Due to extreme poverty in the region, the surgery costs are covered by Sister Priscilla and her community of Sisters (the Daughters of Saint Theresa of the Child Jesus in Uganda). Funds collected will be used for the care of women who have complications from child-birth and to support a new birthing center that recently opened to bring skilled delivery services closer to distant villages. Sr. Priscilla is a friend of our St.

Mary's community, where she has visited on several occasions.

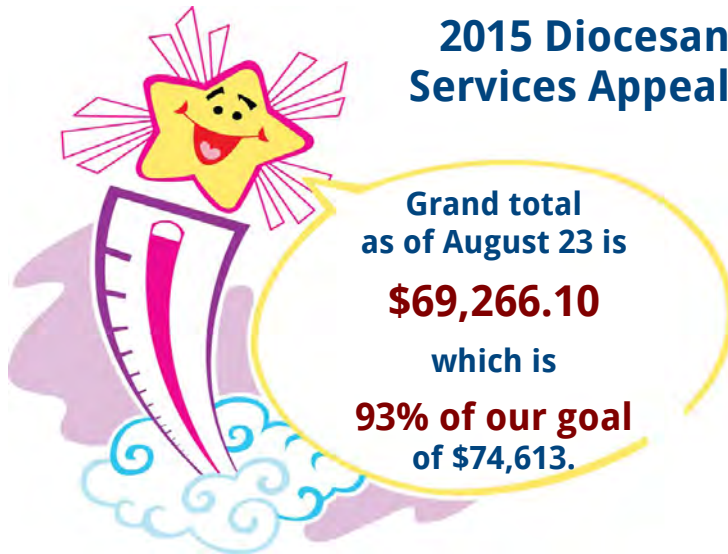
