

WHAT ROLE DOES THE ASSEMBLY PLAY IN THE MASS?

When we are gathered for Mass, each one of us has a special role. We are not merely onlookers, but are called to be active participants with "abundant opportunities to manifest the paschal mystery" (dying to self and rising to new life – which reflects Christ's perpetual dying and rising).

While the presider has the principal role in celebrating the Mass, the assembly (the people of God) also offers the sacrifice of the Mass, together with the priest "so that they may learn to offer their very selves." (*The General Instruction of the Roman Missal, 2011*).

To offer ourselves means first, showing up, even when you'd rather be at home, sleeping in. It also means joining in prayers, songs, gestures and processions with enthusiasm and a desire to be one with the whole assembly. The General Instruction, or GIRM, stresses the importance of unity among the assembly, even if we may want to do our own thing.

The role of the people is also seen during the presentation of the gifts of bread and wine (earthly things made of human hands). This procession shows "the desire of the faithful to be a real part of the Eucharistic sacrifice."



Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Looking for a way to help your young child grow in relationship with God?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the relgious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite children ages 3-5 years who are either in preschool or young 5s programs to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish.
