Guest Pastoral Perspective

Over the last few weeks we have repeatedly heard Jesus being referred to as the bread of life in the Sunday readings. We are extremely aware of this during the Communion Rite, when we come up to receive the Lord on our hands or on our tongue in the form of a simple, round, host. Yet, I would like to focus on another way that Jesus is present during the Mass, a way that does not confine him to the tabernacle or to the gifts brought up during the Offertory. That presence, brothers and sisters, is us, every single time we come together to celebrate Mass.

Christ's presence in the assembly of his Church was not something I was always aware of. As a young boy growing up in Hamtramck, Michigan, participating in Mass was not only a spiritual exercise, but also a cultural one. It allowed me to connect to my Polish heritage. I started altar serving not because I understood the historical and theological implications, but because my older brothers did it and whatever they did was cool. Yet, as a teenager and later as a college student at Loyola Chicago, my understanding of Church began to change. The language, songs, and people changed, but the feeling was the same. Christ was present in the faces of the people that brought up the gifts, he was present in the eyes of the people when I distributed Communion, and he was present in the smiles of the people when I said goodbye after Mass. More personally, I could feel myself growing closer to God through my ministry to these people. It inspired me so much that I now work as a full-time Campus Ministry Associate for St. Mary.

Our second reading today asks us: what is faith without works? Over the last month, I have seen many parishioners volunteer to help at welcome week events, give generously to help the poor in Uganda, as well as bless and greet new members of the Church as they are baptized.

On behalf of all of the staff and parishioners at St. Mary, I would like to invite you to answer another call of service, that of being a liturgical minister. Whether you have served at some other parish in the past or want to learn and grow in your faith with this ministry, we, as the Body of Christ, need you. We need you to welcome us strangers at the doors and make us feel part of not only the extraordinary community that is St. Mary, but also of the universal Church. We need you to proclaim God's Word to us in our readings. We need you to bring Christ to us in the form of bread and wine so that we may become nourished for our mission ahead. As St. Teresa of Avila once wrote "Christ has...no hands, no feet on earth but yours." SMSPP needs your hands. SMSPP needs your feet. Christ needs your hands, Christ needs your feet.

Liturgy 101

Beginning this month, St. Mary Student Parish will take a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Introductory Rites

The first part of the Mass is meant to gather all the individual people in the church into the Body of Christ. The rite takes each of us out of our individual thoughts and gathers us all into the universal prayer of the Church (with a capital C, meaning the universal, larger church.) This is a transition that gets us ready for the central mystery of our faith – the Eucharist – where we can meet God and God can meet us.

Together we sing the Opening Song, which helps to unify us as one voice. As we do this, think about the prayer that you bring to church at this moment; a prayer for yourself and a prayer for this faith community.

Then, all stand for the Opening Song and procession.

Liturgy, unlike devotional prayer, is not formed by our own needs and desires in the moment, but rather forms us into the Body of Christ and enters us into the paschal mystery of Christ. (Sr. Kathleen Harmon)

What are you seeking? Can RCIA help?

Deep in our hearts, we have a longing to be closer to God, to feel that we have a home with God for all eternity.

The RCIA journey at St. Mary Student Parish is designed to help people hear and respond to God's call – and especially to his loving invitation for a deeper relationship with him. Together, we will also explore and learn about the Catholic faith, which provides a pathway to fuller life in the Spirit.

For those who choose it, the program also prepares for the completion of the Sacraments of Initiation (baptism, confirmation, eucharist) at the Easter Vigil Mass.

There's no pressure or obligation. Participants are welcome to explore and ask questions as they discern where God may be leading them.

RCIA sessions will begin formally on Sept. 16 from 7 to 9 p.m., but inquirers are welcome to come in anytime to talk.

My time as a catechist has brought out some of my best gifts by

allowing me to see my developmental psychology degree in action and giving me the opportunity to share my faith. I looked forward to teaching the first Sunday of every month as the Newman Hall is filled with inquisitive children, good food (with copious amounts of coffee), and friends also looking to deepen their faith. I was approached to be a Catechist at a time when I was trying to re-position myself in the Catholic Church. What is a catechist? A catechist is one who teaches the faith to others by their words and actions. At Saint Mary Student Parish, it is a tradition to invite students to teach the faith and share their love of God with our young parishioners.

Here's what some of our previous catechists have said about this ministry:

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Looking for a way to help your young child grow in relationship with God?



The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite children ages 3-5 years who are either in preschool or young 5s programs to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St. Mary Student Parish. This faith formation

opportunity will be held once a month starting September 20 after 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 AM-12:45 PM. Materials cost is \$35 per child for the year and scholarships are available.
