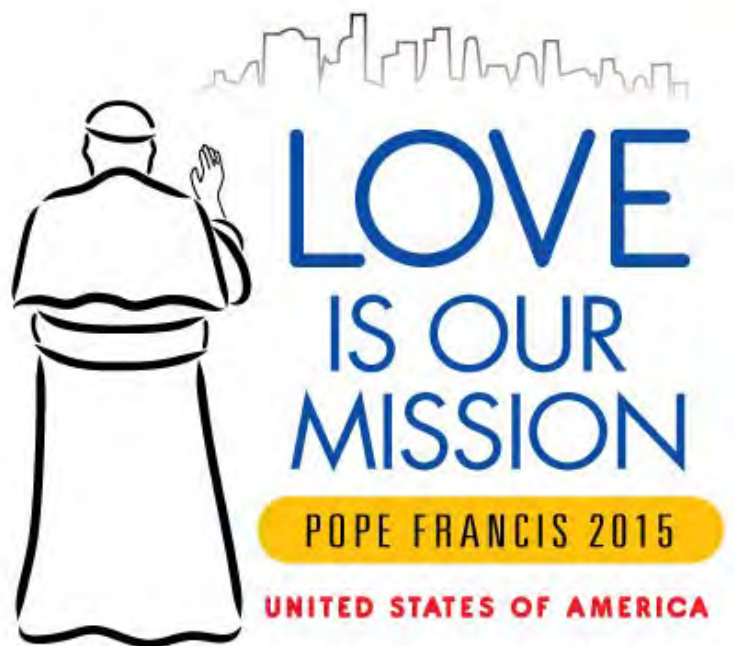

Pastoral Perspective

"We will not find the Lord unless we truly accept the marginalized. Truly the gospel of the marginalized is where our

credibility is at stake, where it is found, and where it is revealed . . . Total openness to serving others is our hallmark, it alone is our title of honor!" Pope Francis

Last January, Pope Francis traveled to the Philippines, the third largest Catholic country in the world. As one who imbibes the gospel call of peace and mercy, he was moved with compassion to be with those who live on the margins. At an unscheduled visit to a homeless shelter for children, a young boy, without any hesitancy or fear, ran to the pope and hugged him. Pope Francis joyfully returned the embrace, and throughout the visit, the boy would not let go of the pope's hand. Later, before a crowd of millions, a twelve-year old girl, who had lived on the streets of Manila, asked through her tears why God would allow children to suffer this way. The Pope gently embraced her and said that she in her pain and suffering has asked the only question that has no answer.

Yet, the answer is in his response. It is the answer of the cross. Allowing his heart to be broken, he is not afraid to be with her in her suffering. It is boldly walking to the margins to be with people in their poverty, to encounter Christ in their lowliness, and to proclaim our discipleship by being a servant of all. In children, we recognize the necessity of vulnerability, of making no claim to power. As we hear in today's Gospel, when we welcome the child, we welcome Christ. In this privileged place, we are able to listen to and truly hear the cry of the poor; we are truly able to hear God's voice. This exclamation, this encounter with Christ on the margins, will irrevocably change us because in the encounter, we are compelled to speak truth to power and work for justice. We are called to share the stories of those who suffer, to amplify their voices. We can do no other if we are to follow Christ. We cannot be complacent. From the beginning of his pontificate, Pope Francis has reminded us of this truth, demonstrated it in his word and deeds, and called us to the same action.

Now, the Pope goes to Washington this week and in a historic address to a joint session of Congress he will once again speak truth to power calling on our legislators to pay attention to our neighbors suffering on the margins. We will have the opportunity to listen to the Pope speak as we gather as a community to watch his address live this Thursday in Donnelly Hall. Join us as we allow our hearts to be moved and then, like Francis, let us walk out to the margins, and in our lowliness, encounter Christ there.



The Pope Goes to Congress

As part of his visit to the United States, Pope Francis will address a joint session of Congress on Thursday, September 24, 2015 (9:30 am ET) bringing together faith and politics. His address to Congress will be an opportunity to invite legislators to reflect on the U.S.'s response to those who are marginalized by poverty and injustice, especially migrants, those plagued by climate change, and workers treated unjustly while challenging all of us to live more fully the Gospel call to mercy and justice and promoting a culture of life. St. Mary Student Parish will host a watch party to view this historic event. If you are available, please stay after the pope's address for discussion and a call to action. All are welcome.

Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book *Open Heart, Open Mind* by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction.

All are welcome. The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session. Otherwise, we typically sit for two 20-minute silent prayer sessions with a short meditative walk in between.

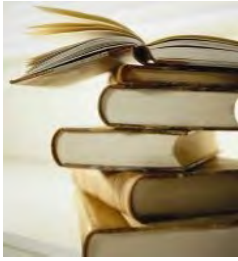
Registration for the walk begins at 1pm, send-off service and walk begin at 2pm at Rudolph Steiner High School on Pontiac Trail.

Liturgy 101

Beginning this month, St. Mary Student Parish will take a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Introductory Rites

(Entrance Procession and Veneration of the Altar)

The people are gathered and have sung the opening song together, representing the unity of the assembly.

During the song, the priest and accompanying ministers enter the worship space and process toward the Altar. The procession moves slowly through the worship space and those carrying objects deposit them where they belong (candles into candle holders, cross into the stand, etc.) Each person who is not carrying an object makes a "profound bow" (from the waist) as a sign of reverence to the altar.

Then the priest approaches the altar. He bends forward in reverence and kisses it. This ritual is an ancient symbol of reverence that was once used for temples.

This also acknowledges that the altar for us – the table of sacrifice – is a physical symbol of Christ, who made the ultimate sacrifice, offering his very self to the Father. In scripture, Christ is called the "cornerstone" and the altar will be the center of attention during the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

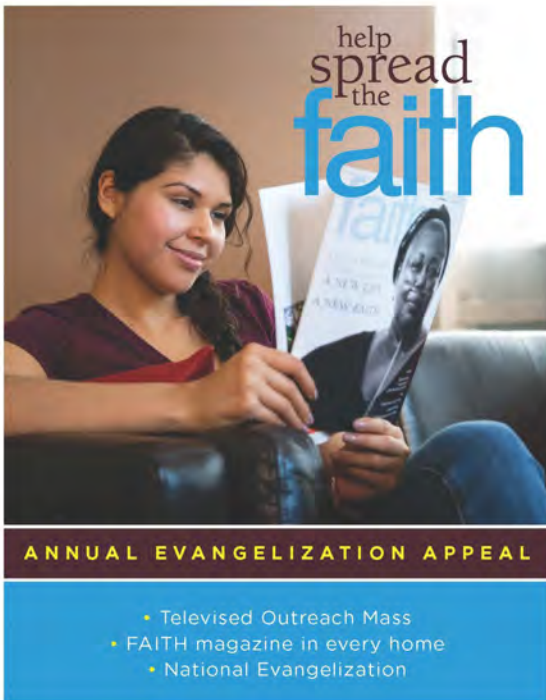

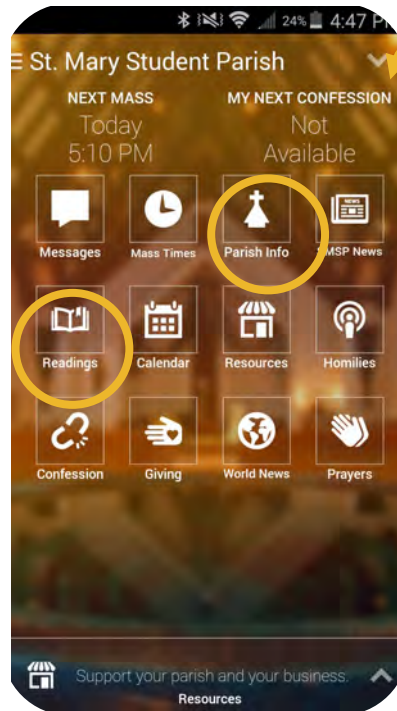
