



Mary Louise (DeClaire) Sinnott passed away on September 6, 2015 at Bickford Cottage, Champaign, IL. Mary was born June 2, 1919 in Detroit, the daughter of Lewis DeClaire and Katherine (Quinn) DeClaire. She graduated from St. Cecelia High School in 1937, attended Marygrove College, graduated from the Providence Hospital School of Nursing in 1943, and was a Registered Nurse. She married Maurice J. Liturgy 101

Beginning this month, St. Mary Student Parish will take a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Introductory Rites (Sign of the Cross and Greeting)

When each of us was baptized, we were signed with the cross of Jesus Christ. In that moment, the Church claimed us for Christ – we belong to him. As we are gathered for Mass, the very first thing we do, once again, is to mark ourselves with the sign of Christ's cross, reminding us of whose we are, and to whom we belong.

This also reminds us that the Mass, though it has many parts, is one great prayer! All the different pieces help to form this one most perfect prayer that we, as Catholics offer together. (Walk Through the Mass, Todd Williamson and Nancy Polacek, 2012, Archdiocese of Chicago)

Liturgist Emily Strand adds this:

"There is no need for 'Good morning' or another everyday greeting because what we gather to do is decidedly not everyday and social niceties in this profound moment threaten to cheapen the experience."

The next rite to occur is the greeting. The priest says to the assembly, "The Lord be with you," and the people respond, "And with your spirit." This has a "rock-solid basis" in both Hebrew and Christian Scriptures (the response comes from Paul's letters), both as a greeting and a way of acknowledging God's presence in the persons greeted.

The words signify both our acknowledgement and our intention that God is present here and now in the assembly, and in the presider, who has received the Spirit of God in ordination in a special way, in order to serve the people of God in the liturgy.

[When we enter into the holy act of Mass] we cross the threshold, just as we are and we bring what we have to the celebration. We are both material and spiritual beings, we humans, with both body and soul, and we bring our whole selves before the Lord in worship.


