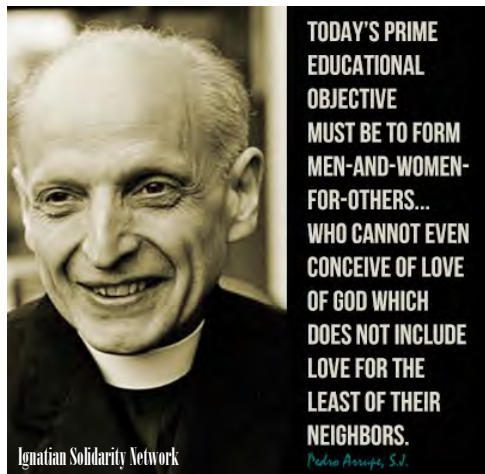

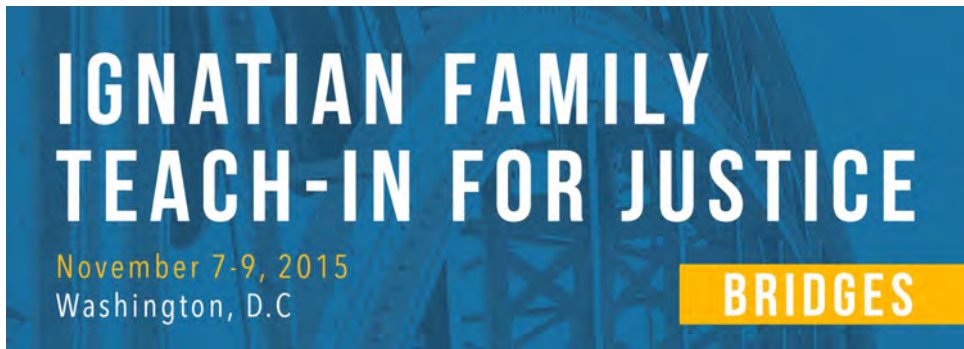

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Introductory Rites (Penitential Act)

At this point, we've made the transition from everyday life and we've entered into the Sacred Liturgy. As we begin, we recognize that we are all sinners and we need the mercy and forgiveness of God.

The rite can take place in a few different ways. The assembly can say the *Confiteor*, led by the presider (I confess to Almighty God...) or join in a dialogue with the presider based on scriptural verses from Baruch and Psalm 85 (Have mercy on us, Oh, Lord...) This is followed by the *Kyrie eleison* (Lord, Have Mercy) or a musical chant of the *Kyrie* with "tropes," (phrases that introduce and amplify the text).

Though we are asking for forgiveness, the rite does not take the place of the Sacrament of Penance. Rather, we have the opportunity, each week, to confess our sins and reconcile ourselves with one another before celebrating the Eucharist.

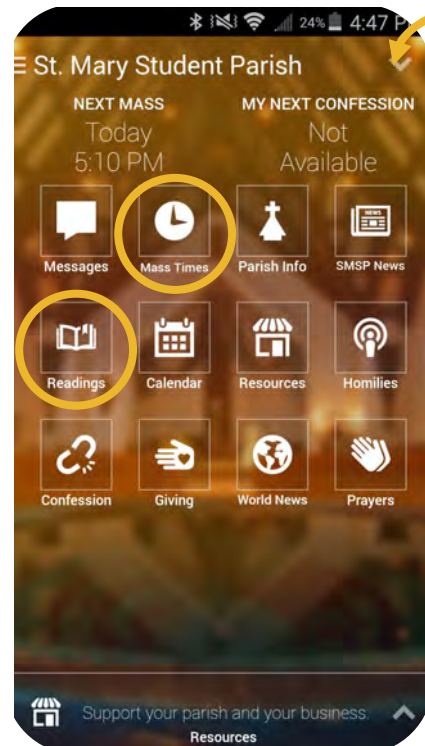

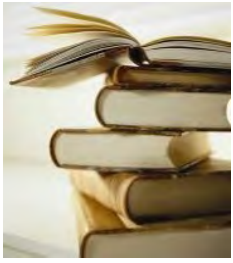

CHRISTIANS OF IQRIT, PALESTINE

On Thursday, October 8, at 7:00 pm, Zion Lutheran Church in Ann Arbor (1501 W. Liberty) will host a presentation by a delegation from Iqrit, Palestine. Iqrit is a Palestinian village of 1,400 Christian Palestinians who were exiled from their village in 1948. The village was demolished on Christmas Eve 1951 by the Israel Defense Force. Since 2013, Iqrit's youth activists have lived in the village church, the only remaining building.

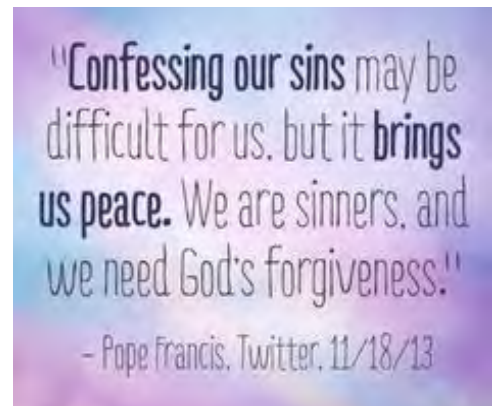
