

Guest Pastoral Perspective

"No creature is concealed from him, but everything is naked and exposed to the eyes of him to whom we must render an account."

We cannot keep secrets from God. I know that I have tried. I have tried to hide my weaknesses and offer God only the good in me. Even knowing that God knew everything about me, I still wanted to hide. How could God want my flaws? How could God want the parts of me that pull me away from him?

I didn't understand this before, but God wants our weaknesses in order to heal us. He wants all of us.

God is like a carpenter. He created us into unique and intricate furniture, but sometimes we can break or be worn from the ways of the world, like having a leg falling off of a table or the paint chip from a chair. God wants to reattach our leg and repaint our surface, but as a carpenter, he cannot fix us without having our broken parts. God knows we are broken as we have no secrets from him. But if the carpenter knows that the table is missing a leg, but does not have the broken leg, he cannot fix it. In order to live out the Lord's purpose to its entirety, we want to be healed. No matter how small the scratch, God asks us to give ourselves to Him entirely so that we can be fixed, maintained, loved and used to our full potential. -An Undergraduate Woman


QUESTIONS FOR REFLECTION:

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Introductory Rites (The Gloria)

After we have remembered God's mercy and forgiveness given to us in Christ (during the Penitential Act), it is only appropriate that we praise God. Together, we sing or recite the Gloria. This ancient hymn was first sung by the angels at the birth of Jesus (Luke 2: 13-14).

Liturgist Emily Strand tells us that the Church originally used this hymn at Easter "but eventually it made its way into more frequent use." Now it is sung regularly, except during the seasons of Advent and Easter. In those seasons we "fast" from use of the Gloria. This heightens the solemnity of the Christmas and Easter seasons when the Gloria returns.

The text of the Glory to God is Trinitarian in nature. As we praise God, we prepare also to properly celebrate the Eucharist "by acclaiming God as three persons in one: a relationship of holiness in whose image of communion we are formed."






