

Most days, being the parent of a young child feels a little bit like being a servant. I prepare meals that get sent back. I wash clothes that I don't wear, do dishes that I never used, and run errands for things that won't directly benefit me. I spend an inordinate amount of time attending to the needs of someone else. It's a thankless, exhausting job, and if I'm honest it sometimes makes me bitter.

On my good days, I attempt to serve in love. I look at this beautiful little child of mine and glimpse the divine in her. I try to treat her as if she were Christ, because she is. But then she throws her food across the kitchen or cries because I won't sing her favorite silly song for a fifth time in a row or pinches me because I'm trying to change her diaper, and all I see is a little tyrant. A tyrant whom I love deeply and for whom I would give my life, but a tyrant nonetheless.

The thing is, it's easier to serve when we are appreciated and recognized for our good works. That's human nature, and it's not bad, but I think Jesus is calling us to another kind of service as well. That's why he asks the disciples, "Can you drink the cup that I drink?" His kind of service requires suffering. He was loved but also despised and rejected. Even his closest friends didn't really understand what he was doing for them. Ultimately his kind of service meant giving up his own life.

That kind of service feels impossible to me. But then again, so does a love that conquers death. Yet that's exactly what God makes possible in Jesus. It doesn't mean that the frustration and bitterness and exhaustion go away. They'll still be there. But they don't have the final word. Because I really do love my daughter enough to give my life for her, as most parents would, and that trumps everything else. It doesn't make sense, and yet there it is. Love wins, every time. *A Woman Campus Minister*

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Introductory Rites (The Collect)

After we have praised God through the Gloria, the presider invites us to join together in prayer with the words, "Let us pray." The final piece of the Introductory Rites of Mass is the Collect, or opening prayer. Each Collect is composed specifically for the celebration at hand, and many Collects have a long history, dating back hundreds of years. They are theologically rich and Trinitarian in nature, asking us to prepare, in some specific way, to celebrate the mysteries at hand.

These prayers are created to "collect" the many prayers of the gathered assembly into one prayer, proclaimed by the presider. This is why the presider pauses after he says "Let us pray." This helps us to remember that we are in God's presence and helps us bring to mind the prayers that are in our hearts.


