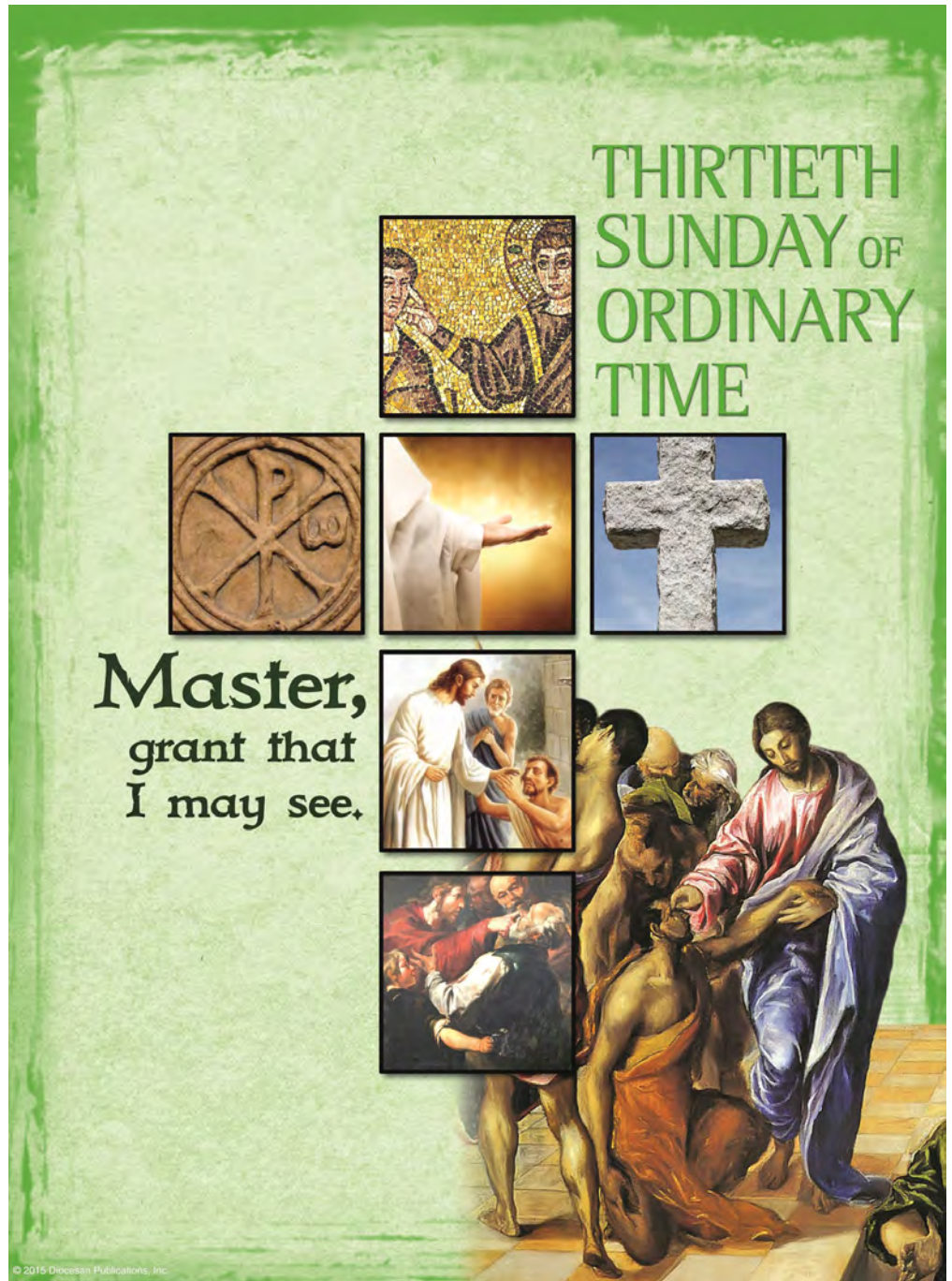

REFLECTING ON THE READINGS

Are you beset by weakness? Am I beset by weakness? It's not how we normally word the question. We often ask, "Are you strong enough?" But as these readings point out, the important question is, "are we weak enough?"

It sounds strange to our ears. I've grown up in North America, I've been trained to think of myself as a rugged individual, to think of myself as someone who can change anything I want. As a result, I spend a lot of time fixing... fixing myself, fixing others, fixing my work. I spend a lot of energy making sure I'm strong enough to handle all of life's challenges.

But none of us are strong enough. We spend so much of our precious time on this earth trying to hide that fact, or to change a fundamental reality that is beyond our power. We are mortal and we are weak in comparison to God. Acceptance of that fact is the key in the second reading. I can do nothing without God. "No one takes this honor upon himself but only when called by God."

This reading reminds us that we don't have to be strong enough; we don't have to be anything more than we already are. The key is to cooperate with God. To acknowledge our need and our weakness and to trust that God has and will continue to work with that.

The real question isn't are you strong enough, but are you in touch with your weakness; are you weak enough to ask for help and listen to God's invitation?

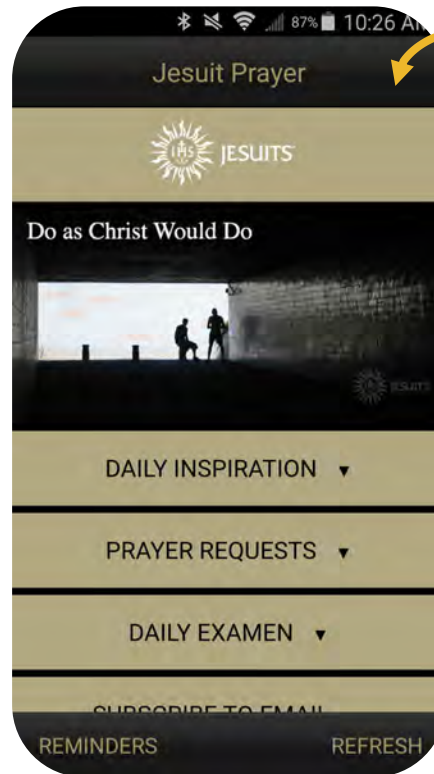

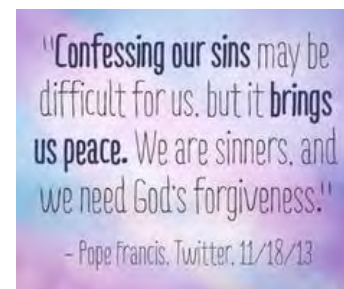

- Flowers
- Pictures of Deceased Family Members
- Food (often the deceased's favorites)
- Candles
- Sugar Candy Skulls
- Cross or Religious Image

The Altar of the Dead cultivates hope in everlasting Christian life for our beloved who have gone before us. The colorful decorations and festivities juxtaposed with the somber nature of death help remind us that for Christians, death is not final.

St. Mary will be creating an Altar of the Dead in our atrium during the week leading up to November 2nd. Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Word (First reading)

After we have given praise to God through the Gloria, and gathered all our prayers in the Collect ("Let us Pray"), we are ready to enter into the Word of God through the part of Mass known as the Liturgy of the Word.

Once again, the Mass of today reaches back to the way the earliest Christians celebrated. Our Liturgy of the Word follows the pattern of a Jewish Synagogue service with its procession of the Torah to a place of honor so it can be read and God's word proclaimed.

Our posture changes in response to the readings, though we remain active listeners. This is because, in the Liturgy of the Word, we enter into an actual dialogue – a conversation – with God (*From Walk Through the Mass, Todd Williamson and Nancy Polacek, 2012, Archdiocese of Chicago*).

First Reading: In this reading, usually taken from the Hebrew Scriptures (Old Testament), we are reminded of all the things that God has done throughout history to save us. As we remember God's greatness and covenant with his people, it gives us hope. In this reading, we get a "sneak preview" of the Gospel, because the Church chooses the readings to match the "theme" of the Gospel.

During the Easter season, the First reading changes and we hear stories of the resurrected Christ, usually from the Acts of the Apostles.

Taken together, the Hebrew Scripture reading and the Gospel reveal a particular aspect of the continuity and completeness Jesus brings to the faith of our ancestors, the Jewish people. (*From Mass 101, Liturgy and Life, by Emily Strand, MA (Liguori Publications)*)

The Liturgy of the Word and Liturgy of the Eucharist are integrally related and serve to amplify the power and riches each has to offer. The Liturgy of the Word gives us an effective model of what it means to live the life of God, and the Liturgy of the Eucharist gives us the effective power to do so... In both Word and sacrament, God nourishes us for the journey home to him.
