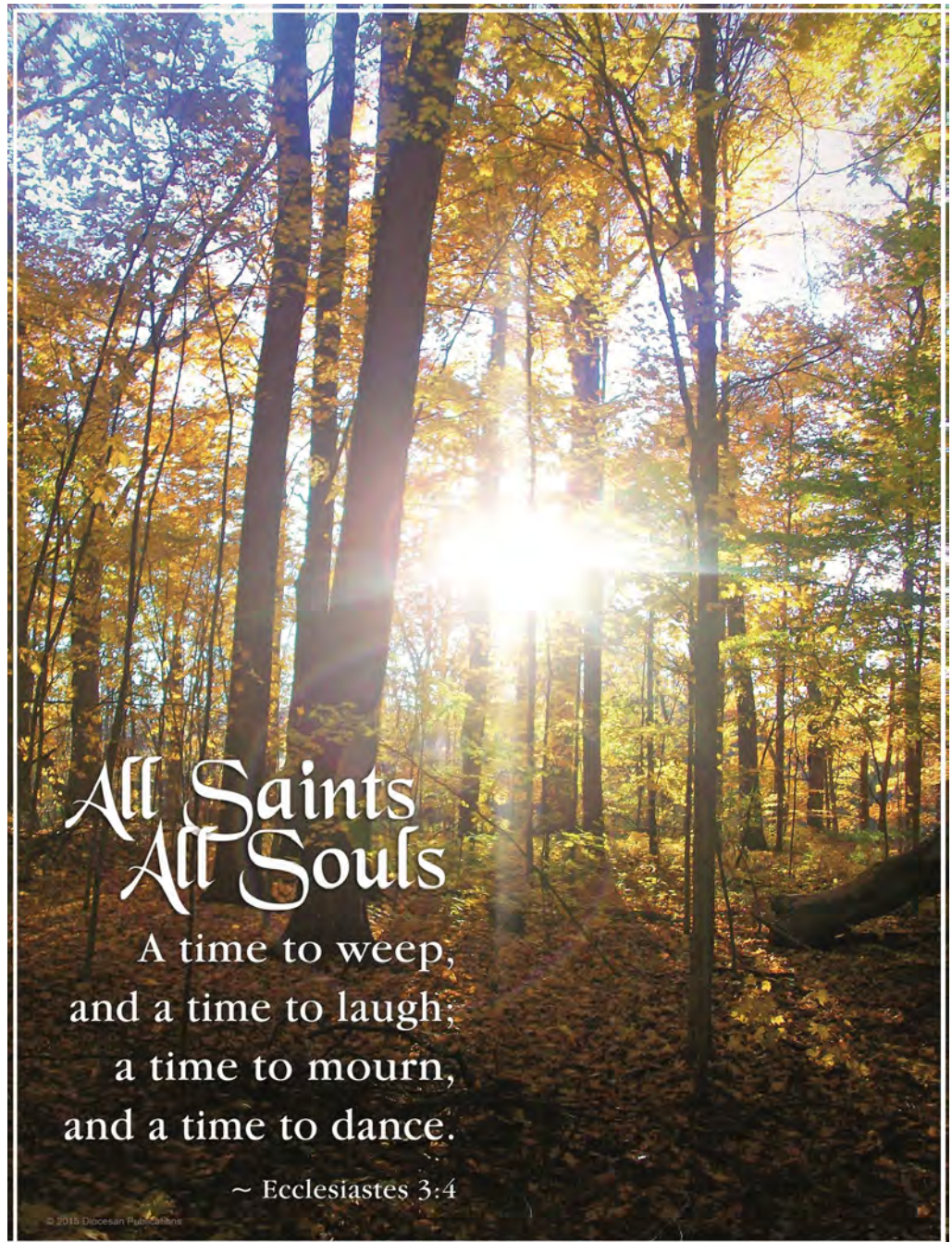

# REFLECTING ON THE READINGS

## ALL SOULS DAY

In recent years, I've had the unfortunate pleasure of attending various viewings, funerals, and memorial services for elderly relatives and friends' relatives. At most of these events, due to surprise about the unexpected death, whoever was in charge of "making the arrangements" normally would run to the deceased's house and make a makeshift shrine out of whatever recent photos were left sitting on their mantle. If you didn't know any better, you could walk out of one of these memorials and think the deceased had just been old their entire life!

Wherever your body ends up, your gravestone is going to have a beginning date and an end date. And it is an almost innate human feature to focus too much on the beginning or end of a story. But All Souls Day is a reminder to focus on the middle. On the person who (at some point in their life and in their own unique way) experienced all of the emotions and situations described in the third reading. It's a celebration of that person's unique relationship with, hope for, and love that Jesus had for them.

But you too have a unique relationship with Jesus, and he has unique dreams and desires for your life. So if this All Souls Day, you happen to be feeling one of those emotions (from the third reading), take a step back, and examine how Jesus is trying to lead you into a more productive place.

# Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at [stmarystudentparish.org](http://stmarystudentparish.org)) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

## Liturgy of the Word (Responsorial Psalm)

Singing or reciting the Psalm helps us to respond to all that God has done for us. Using words from one of the Psalms (part of the Hebrew Scriptures), the assembly is invited to join in the antiphon (the part that repeats between the verses). The Psalm is chosen with the first reading in mind, especially as it relates to the words of the antiphon.

While the Psalm often seems to articulate an emotional response to the first reading, some scholars have referred to the Psalm as creating "a bridge" of meaning from the first reading to the Gospel. (*Adapted From Mass 101, Liturgy and Life, by Emily Strand, MA (Liguori Publications)*)

The Psalms have been called the "Church's first prayer book." These are words that Jesus himself used in prayer. As we sing the Psalm, we are responding to God's greatness using the very word of God. (From *Walk Through the Mass*, Todd Williamson and Nancy Polacek, 2012, Archdiocese of Chicago).

## Creating an Economy of Inclusion: Pope Francis' Call to the Common Good

We invite you to join us at St. Mary in hosting Sister Simone Campbell with our local RESULTS chapter on Thursday, December 3rd at 6:45 PM. She will be delivering a keynote address titled, "**Creating an Economy of Inclusion: Pope Francis' Call to the Common Good**" beginning at 7:30 PM. A pre-reception will begin at 6:45 PM.

The talk stems from remarks made by Pope Francis during a recent eight-day visit to the US in which he emphasized our connection to those living in poverty. He has said, "The times talk to us of so much poverty in the world and this is a scandal. Poverty in the world is a scandal. In a world where there is so much wealth, so many resources to feed everyone, it is unfathomable that there are so many hungry children, that there are so many children without an education, so many poor persons. Poverty today is a cry."

Sister Simone Campbell is the executive director of NETWORK, a national Catholic social-justice lobby based in Washington, D.C. Campbell is a religious leader, attorney and poet with extensive experience in public policy and advocacy for the poor. In Washington, she lobbies on issues of peace-building, immigration reform, health care and economic justice.
