# Advent



"And the Word became flesh and dwells among us."
Advent always implies incarnation, the Word becoming flesh, God taking a human face. And the season is one of allowing the Lord to overshadow us with his Spirit as Mary did, so that God can continue to take a human

face in each of us. For as the Jesuit poet, Gerard Manley Hopkins says, "for Christ plays in ten thousand places, lovely in limbs, and lovely in eyes not his to the Father through the features of men's faces." And the Lord invites us to prepare for his coming that he might dwell within us and among us.

John the Baptist shouts "Prepare the way of the Lord" and to prepare the way in the desert, the place of quiet, of solitude, in an attitude of alertness, of growing expectancy and hope, a place where our lives are not already so full, so cluttered. God creates out of the nothingness, the emptiness. It is here in the waiting, in the expectancy that God makes the mountains low, that the valleys in our life are filled in, that all that keeps the glory of the Lord from shining in us and in our world, is removed, so that the world might indeed see that Emmanuel, "God with us" is indeed coming into the world and living and taking flesh within us.

Advent calls us to take seriously the invitation to become what we were created to be, the Body of Christ. It is a mindful, intentional proclamation that we are created in the image and likeness of God, and that we were made to be filled with Christ. Filled with his Spirit, we are missioned as Jesus was to show the face of God, the mercy of God, the justice, forgiveness and compassion of God. We are missioned and sent as Christians. "As the Father has sent me, so I send you," Jesus tells his apostles and disciples in every age. It is this revelation of the ongoing incarnation of Christ that we call Christmas. It is this revelation of the ongoing Word becoming flesh, the revelation of the Children of God that all of creation awaits. And it this waiting for and preparing for the glory of God shining within us that we await and for which we prepare in Advent.

May the Lord slow us down that we might know the experience of waiting, of growing in hope, of growing in desire. And may the Spirit pray intensely in the depths of our beings, "Maranatha," Come, Lord. Jesus.

"Listen, out into your heart, my youngest and dearest son, that the thing that disturbs you, the thing that affects you, is nothing. Do not let your countenance, your heart be disturbed. Am I not here, who am your Mother?"

Our Lady of Guadalupe Feast, celebrated on December 12<sup>th</sup>, represents a date of gathering in faith among the Mexican community. The duality of the symbolism of our Lady of Guadalupe represents a message of faith, hope and unity. Her mestiza face, reflects the reconciliation of opposing cultural, religious and racial differences between Europeans and Aztecs. Our Lady of Guadalupe made her apparition to Juan Diego, a humble native, choosing him to carry her message of love and courage.

The image of our Lady of Guadalupe reminds us that beyond differences we are all God's loved children, that language barriers, cultural differences, and power distinctions may come together through faith.



## From Fr. Ben...

I presented the following report to the Parish Pastoral Council on Monday, November 18, 2015. The Council encouraged me to share the report with all of you so that you could see the concrete steps we have been taking this fall to revitalize our Sunday masses. I am very pleased with the progress we are making. All the lay ministers have been enthusiastic participants in these discussions and efforts, and we are all finding ways to address long-standing problems. If you have any questions or comments, please let me know.

1. The pianists and choir directors for all English-language Sunday masses have been meeting with Fr John, Emily Gibbons, and me and have begun to develop a professional community among ourselves. We have discussed the process of finding new, on-line sources for music that broadens the range of our current music choices, music selection in relationship to readings, communicating with presiders about themes from the readings for the homily and music.

We have also discussed matters of

microphones, volume levels for the piano, choir members and singers with Fernando Yarza, our sound advisor, for the main church and Donnelly Hall at 10am. With Fernando's guidance we have made considerable improvements in our sound system in the past year. This Advent we will begin using new missalettes that contain the Sunday readings and songs. In Lent, 2016 we will begin using the new Gather book. We will be making decisions about the future of the Voices book at future musicians meetings in December and January.

- 2. The Mass Coordinators (MCs) have met with Lanette Mele, Matt Rejniak and me:
- Newly recruited ushers are being trained and scheduled, filling a desperate need.
- Revised communion distribution patterns will make the process smoother and clearer.
- Revised processes for counting those attending masses so that our data reflect reality and are consistent across masses.
- Recruiting and training new liturgical ministers so that numbers of trained ministers are adequate for each mass (numbers now are insufficient, with a small number of people bearing a disproportionate burden) and so that undergrads, grads and young professionals are proportionately represented among liturgical ministers. This adequate representation is important as a welcoming sign for new young people attending mass for the first time as a sign that young people like them are committed to the parish.

- 3. Matt Rejniak is rewriting/writing position descriptions for all liturgical ministers (lectors, Eucharistic Ministers, ushers/greeters, servers, and Mass Coordinators). These statements will help in training new ministers and in providing consistency across all masses.
- 4. Campus Ministry staff has identified themes drawn from the Sunday Advent readings that will provide thematic unity among Sunday masses in terms of music selection, homily preparation, design for Sunday bulletins, posters, and material for the website and Facebook page. We initiated this use of themes during Lent last year, with the theme Now is the Time. These changes will help the entire parish pray together as a community.
- 5. The senior staff is using the above experience to help guide decisions about what kind of person to hire in the coming year to take the lead in these areas.
- 6. We held our first-ever-in-recentyears evening of prayer and reflection for liturgical ministers on Sunday, November 15. Forty people attended, a number nearly equally divided between residents and students. It was an inspiring evening of community building and faith sharing.

#### Liturgy of the Word (The Homily)


The Liturgy of the Word continues with the homily, in which the priest or deacon breaks open the mysteries proclaimed in the readings. The homily should help the people make connections between the Scripture readings and how we live out a life of faith. Liturgist Emily Strand tells us that a great homily attempts to connect the Word with our celebration of Christ's Eucharistic sacrifice "so that the assembly may celebrate the paschal mystery wholeheartedly."

"This is a tall order! A great homily does all this while grabbing and keeping the assembly's attention... and without being too long or too short." The person delivering the homily must also keep in mind that the assembly is made up of all manner of people and ages, from the highly educated to the uneducated, from the young to the old.




