Our Lady of Guadalupe: a Motif of Faith and Culture

I was 16 when I left home to study abroad for the first time. Right before I left for the airport, my grandma said good bye to me in a way she could only do: “Que la Virgencita te cuide y te acompañe” (“May Our Lady of Guadalupe be with you at all times). As a farewell gift, she put a gold charm on my neck with Our Lady of Guadalupe on one side and my name on the other.

Until that moment, I had always taken for granted the significance of Our Lady of Guadalupe. Born and raised as a catholic in Mexico, Our Lady of Guadalupe has been a symbol present not only in my family, my church and my catholic high school, but also a historic figure used in war emblems, constitutional seals and famous literature. Within the Mexican community, December 12th represents a day of gathering and hope, a moment of union and faith. Classes are cancelled, mom and dad are off work, and churches are opened. There will be family gatherings full of tamales and hot chocolate. The significance of Our Lady of

Guadalupe goes beyond religious celebrations; she is a symbol of culture and tradition.

Why are Mexicans so devoted to this figure? Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to Juan Diego, a native Aztec, in 1531, a period of annihilation of the Aztec empire and of imposition of the Spanish culture and religion. The Aztecs were known as a devoted polytheistic community. It was not until Our Lady of Guadalupe made her apparitions that indigenous people started accepting catholic faith as their own. She appeared in a way that Aztec people could identify with. The color of her skin was neither white, nor indigenous, it was a blend of both. She used Nahuatl, not Spanish, to communicate with Juan Diego. She is replete with symbolism. Her pink robe, her blue stellated mantle, her name “Guadalupe”, her facial expressions, everything is full of meaning for the Aztec community. Instead of imposing a new, unfamiliar set of values and beliefs, she

chose to acknowledge the richness of a culture, blending the catholic faith with the Aztec beliefs. The message of Our Lady of Guadalupe is a message of love and of protection. She acknowledges those in the margins who don't seem to have a voice.

The image of Our Lady of Guadalupe among the Mexican community in the United States carries the same meaning it carried 500 years ago in the Spanish-Aztec context. It reminds us of the value of every human being beyond nationality, social class or racial privileges, portraying that the reconciliation of a heterogeneous and complex society is possible. This message is just as important today with our struggles with immigration as it was in the time of Juan Diego. In that spirit of inclusion the Mexican community welcomes everyone to join us in the celebration of Our Lady of Guadalupe this December 12th.

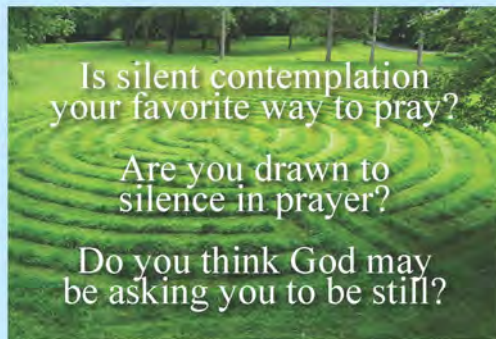

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Word (The Creed)

After the readings and the homily, we respond to the Lord, who has spoken through the readings: we proclaim "I believe!" as we profess our faith and recite the creed together. Either the Apostles' Creed or Nicene Creed is professed (typically the Nicene Creed at this parish). While there are other creeds, these two are the most common creeds used in the daily life of the Roman Catholic Church.

Each of these creeds is an ancient symbol of the Christian faith: a summary of the story that holds us as believers. The creeds first arose to help new Christians learn the tenets of the faith, and also as a way of "regularizing" Christian belief in the face of heresies or irreconcilably different ways of believing. The creeds sum up the mystery of faith itself.

Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book *Open Heart, Open Mind* by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction.

All are welcome. The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session. Otherwise, we typically sit for two 20-minute silent prayer sessions with a short meditative walk in between.
