Merciful Like the Father. A Holy Year of Mercy

On December 8th we began a Holy Year of Mercy, commemorating the 50th anniversary of the closing of the Second Vatican Council. More than a Holy Year, it is also a Jubilee, which includes special celebrations for the global church. Among these, Pope Francis has opened the Holy Door at St. Peter's Basilica. Pope Francis adds that the Holy Door is "a Door of Mercy through which anyone who enters will experience the love of God who consoles, pardons, and instills hope."

Likewise, Pope Francis has invited Holy Doors to be opened at other major Roman Basilicas and in dioceses across the world. Here at St. Mary, we have hung banners surrounding our entrance on William Street, welcoming our community to join in our Holy Year of Mercy.

What is mercy? Mercy is God's infinite and burning love for us that provides for our needs and overcomes our miseries. It is a virtue influencing one's will to have compassion for, and, if possible, to alleviate another's misfortune. By showing mercy to others, we are demonstrating God's mercy for us. There are two types of mercy:

Corporal works of mercy (for the body):

- ♣ Feed the hungry
- 引 Give drink to the thirsty
- Clothe the naked
- ਊ Harbor the harborless
- ♣ Visit the sick
- ♣ Ransom the captive
- Bury the Dead

Spiritual works of mercy (for the soul):

- ♣ Instruct the ignorant
- 🕆 Counsel the doubtful
- 🕆 Admonish sinners
- ☆ Bear wrongs patiently
- ♣ Forgive offenses willingly
- ☆ Comfort the afflicted
- Pray for the living and the dead

For me personally, the Holy Year of Mercy encourages me to open my doors. Too often I am quick to judge, closing my doors when I feel slighted, cheated, or disrespected. I still harbored feelings of disrespect from a former boss, and after two years of keeping those feelings buried, hidden inside, I finally forgave them this past month. Reconciling these feelings of personal injustice wasn't easy — but I knew if I could show mercy, by forgiving offenses and being patient, I could unlock the places in my heart that had been hardened. I feel lighter, more confident, and not surprisingly, at peace.

I invite you to take some time to pray and consider how you will celebrate the Holy Year of Mercy. How will the doors open in your life? Who needs your mercy the most?

She just wanted to play soccer, a little girl with blonde hair and smiles. She just wanted to run on a field with friends and kick a ball laughing with no worries and her life, it lay out ahead of her. Her mom was there on the sidelines, so proud of her daughter, so much in love. As they walked to their car at the end of practice, did they talk about school and what Emma liked about her teacher? Did Emma ask to stop for a special treat before heading home and did her Mom tell her no because it's getting late and it's a school night? Did her Mom ask what Emma thought Santa might bring her for Christmas and what she would like to give Grandma and Grandpa? In an instant, all the questions, all the silly, simple, beautiful, and wonderful moments of loving a seven -year-old were stopped forever when a family friend with a legally purchased firearm shot and killed little Emma, critically wounded her mom, and then turned the gun on himself.

My son is seven years old and every night before I go to bed, I give him a blessing as he sleeps. I make the sign of the cross on his forehead and I say, "I love you, my little prince. May God bless you and keep you safe all night long." I don't think, I can't think, that he could ever be taken from me. It is too painful and scary to think about, but someone will be next. Some mom and dad will be broken beyond repair, some holiday party will host mass murderers, some young black man will not come home tonight, and some refugees will be turned back by hatred and fear. I weep and my heart is filled with anguish as I cry out, "Why? Why is it into this world that Christ is born?"


Yes, I believe Christ is born into our deepest darkness. I believe Christ weeps with us there but also points us towards the light. Christ shows that death, suffering, and evil will not have the last word. Love, forgiveness, peace, goodness, and mercy will prevail. It will prevail because God asks us to bear Christ to the world; Christ is born into our world when we show kindness, when we give thanks in all things, and when we roll down justice. This is the joy I rejoice in. I want the Prince of Peace to be born now, no more delays, into this troubled and bruised world so that little girls and little boys can come home safe from soccer practice. Come, Lord Jesus, come! Symbolic plant: the wandering Jew

WEEK TWO: THE RIGHT QUADRANT: PURPLE

The week of the desert.

The week of John the Baptist, who proclaims that the Good News begins in the desert, the place of solitude, of silence. It is in the desert where one grows in longing and thirsting for the streams of living water.

It is in the desert where one waits and prepares a place for the Word of God who himself longs and thirsts to become flesh and dwell in us, who longs and thirsts to baptize us in the Holy Spirit setting our hearts on fire.

Symbolic plants: cacti, healing eucalyptus

WEEK THREE: THE BOTTOM QUADRANT: ROSE

The week of the desert that blooms with new life.

The week of Isaiah, the prophet of comfort and consolation, the quadrant of joy where the glory and splendor of God breaks forth in new creation.

It is the quadrant of hope where we are called to be patient and to place our trust in God who clothes the flowers with such splendor.

Symbolic plants: flowers of rose in bloom

WEEK FOUR: THE LEFT QUADRANT: PURPLE

The week of fulfillment, of visitation, of promises fulfilled. The week of the Virgin who brings forth Emmanuel: God with us.

The quadrant of sign, of sacrament, of incarnation, of where God takes a human face in Jesus, in the humanity, the body of Christ.

Symbolic plants: Lilies- the Virgin Mary, the pomegranatesymbol of the fruitful Church coming into being, eucalyptus-the healing of the nations, the olive branch- the Prince of Peace

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Word

(Universal Prayer/Intercessions)

After reciting the creed together, we actually ask God for *more* of his divine presence and action (which we have also just heard about in the readings).

And so we present to God our needs and the needs of the Church, usually following a similar pattern: prayers for the Church, those in authority, for the sick and the poor, and finally we pray for the needs of our community.

These petitions may be called the General Intercessions, Universal Prayer, or Prayer of the Faithful. These names emphasize the universal nature of our prayer – while we ask for our own needs, we must also look beyond our walls to the needs of the larger Church and the world.

The Church's ritual books do not prescribe any specific wording, so usually parishes compose their own prayers and responses. The Church does, however, provide general guidelines. These prayers mark the conclusion of the Liturgy of the Word.



Centering Prayer


Mondays at 6:30 PM



Centering Prayer is a method of silent, contemplative prayer in which thoughts and feelings are stilled as we simply seek to be with God. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book *Open Heart, Open Mind* by Fr. Thomas Keating, OCSO is a good introduction.

All are welcome. The first Monday of each month is a special introductory session, during which we listen to an audio tape that describes the method of Centering Prayer session. Otherwise, we typically sit for two 20-minute silent prayer sessions with a short meditative walk in between.




