Fr. Dan on Sabbatical

I am grateful to Fr. Ben, St. Mary's, the Ann Arbor Jesuit Community and the Chicago-Detroit Province of the Jesuits for granting me a six-month sabbatical starting in January and returning at the end of June. I will spend two months at the Jesuit School of Theology in Berkeley, CA. Since my ordination in 1995 I have been collecting all kinds of questions related to my priesthood, especially in terms of the Sacraments and Liturgy. How can I understand them more deeply? How can I celebrate them more effectively? When will I stop being anxious before the start of every mass?! So for two months I will meet on a regular basis with a Jesuit theologian whose area of study is Sacramental Theology. I look forward to spending time re-reading Sacrosanctum Concilium (On the Sacred Liturgy) of Vatican II. I hope to read what the guys now in theology studies are reading (on their Ipads of course!). And I will appreciate time to reflect on the years of priestly ministry to this point in my life.

I will then spend four months in Cuernavaca, Mexico at the Cemanahuac Language Institute hoping to improve my Spanish. For over four years I have had the great privilege of presiding at the Spanish mass and celebrating Baptisms (3-4 baptisms at a time!).

I am able to read and pronounce the words fairly well, but I'm not able to have conversations with people. Over these past years I have come to know the people at the Spanish mass; I love praying with them—I just can't talk with them!! I am very excited about the possibility of more fully engaging in the life of our Hispanic/Latino community.

I am very grateful for the many people making this opportunity possible. Fr. Eric will be covering the Spanish masses and Leonor Kromis will be leading the Hispanic/Latino ministry. Lisa Hirsch will be coordinating our parish Social Justice Ministry (so please sign up for the Social Justice Newsletter). And Bill Alt will be coordinating the Alternative Spring Break program with our two student co-coordinators Danielle Bean and Julia Kehoe.

Please pray for me and be assured of my prayers for you.



Reflections for the Season

... The Second Letter to Peter teaches, "With the Lord one day is like a thousand years and a thousand years like one day. The Lord does not delay his promise, as some regard 'delay,' but he is patient with you." For me this reading begs a question, and I am forced to ask myself, "God is patient with me, but how can I be patient with God?" So often, I want God's plans to happen right now. I don't want to wait. Waiting is hard, often tortuous work. It also forces me to accept that I am not in the one in control, and that rarely fits into my plans.

John the Baptist prepared the way of the Lord with patient hope and with a great sense of immediacy. He wasn't preparing the way for a kingdom to come years down the road; he was preparing the way right now. Yet, he also managed to wait patiently for Christ, the one mightier than he who would come, and John the Baptist fully accepted that he was not the one in control. How can I work tirelessly for God and his kingdom with that same sense of immediacy while also trusting in the slow work of God and allowing myself to be restless and incomplete?

Advent is a time of waiting, but it isn't passive waiting. How can we actively wait for God and trust in his plans for us while we simultaneously work to bring about the kingdom right here and right now? God's plan for our salvation requires us to hand over control to our loving Father and to wait, work, and trust with hope and with joy. (Stephanie Smith)

It is no coincidence that Jesus came to us through a humble young woman and was born in a simple manger. Emmanuel - God with us - is always inviting us to reach out in mercy and love, to give healing and hope to those who are poor and lowly in our own world. This is how our souls might magnify the Lord. ... Advent is the reminder and the promise that God will bring light to all of the darkness and uncertainty that we face. Even though we don't always have all the answers, we know that God will never leave us to face our journey alone. Advent gives us the chance to slow down and take a closer look at our relationship with God, to listen, and to trust. When we do this, taking paths that might be difficult, frightening, or just not what we would have chosen, we are bound to be blessed immeasurably in return. During this season of waiting, remember that God is waiting for us too - waiting patiently for us to open our hearts to Him and to trust, so that He can work through us in unimaginably amazing ways.


Women's Undergraduate Retreat

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Program

Looking for a way to help your young child grow in relationship with God?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite preschool children ages 3-5 years to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish. This faith formation opportunity will be held on the following Sundays: January 18, February 1, March 22, April 26, and May 3 after the 10am Mass from 11:15am-12:45pm in the Newman Room. Materials cost is \$20 per child.

Delonis Community Kitchen Volunteering Opportunity

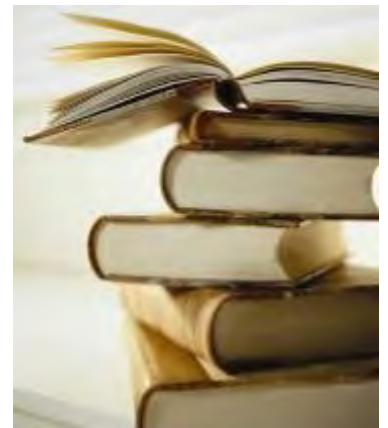

Parish Memorial Garden

The dust has cleared and our beautiful parish Memorial Garden is now in place in the courtyard area behind the parish offices. Parish members have shown great interest in the garden and columbarium, so if you have been waiting to discuss reservation arrangements, please know that you will be called for an appointment as soon as possible.

The St. Mary Student Parish Memorial Garden is the result of many years of planning and requests from parishioners. Final landscaping will be done in the spring, creating a beautiful, lasting resting place for the cremated remains of parishioners and their family members.

The Memorial Garden includes a columbarium, which is an arrangement of openings, or niches, that are used to hold the urns containing the remains of an individual. Each niche will be covered and sealed. The columbarium will be constructed of cast bronze and granite, with 214 niches available.
