

Fifth Sunday of Lent Lenten Reflection

A Woman Campus Minister

The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.

Usually by the fifth week of Lent I am ready to abandon the desert and get to Easter Sunday. I feel like I have done my due diligence of praying, fasting, and almsgiving and I just want to rejoice in the resurrection. In our fast paced culture isn't four weeks enough to focus on my interior life and outward actions? Haven't I given up enough already by committing myself to any Lenten promises?

Fortunately, the wisdom of God through the scriptures calls me back to the importance of staying with Him in this fifth week and not abandoning the desert too quickly. The psalm this week calls me to dig deep to acknowledge where the Lord has been working in my life this Lent and this past year. As I uncover the Lord's presence in my life, I am encouraged to make sense of both the blessings and the challenges. In dissecting the challenges in my life the prophet Isaiah's words, "see, I am doing something new!" bring me great comfort. I know that if I hold on tight to the Lord during the challenges he will bring me out of captivity and into the light. As I am brought into the light and have the opportunity to laugh and rejoice, I rest in the promise of the resurrection and the knowledge that the light always overcomes the darkness.

As I challenge myself to stay with the Lord in this fifth week of Lent, I am grateful for the companionship of others in the Church who are also on this journey. As I acknowledge the great things the Lord has done for me, I am also called to acknowledge what he has done for us as a community. Despite all of the pain and suffering in our world, the Lord is indeed doing great things for all of us. In honestly sharing our stories of challenge and joy as a community, we can more fully see how the Lord is working in the world. As we linger together in the desert for a few more days we do so knowing that soon we will share in the joy of the resurrection.

Questions for Reflection:

- What Lenten commitment do you need to re-engage this fifth week of Lent?
- Who do you share your joy with? How can you encourage others to recognize the good things that the Lord is doing in their lives?

Lent 2016 Cast Into the Story

This Lent you have been cast into the story. The roles will not always be easy; you may find yourself tempted by the devil, as Jesus was for 40 days in the wilderness. Or you may find you've turned away from Jesus, as Peter did on the eve of the crucifixion.

We are all cast into different roles, at different times, but during these times we must remember we are all one cast: the children of God. Open your heart this Lent and let the drama prepare you for the risen Lord.

The following themes will guide us on our journey:

- Ash Wednesday: We are cast as a common humanity.
- First Sunday of Lent: We are cast as children of God.
- <u>Second Sunday of Lent</u>: We are cast as a blessing to others.
- Third Sunday of Lent: We are cast to a universal need for grace.
- Fourth Sunday of Lent: We are cast to return home.
- Fifth Sunday of Lent: We are cast to be merciful.
- Palm Sunday: Casting Call!


SINDUCTICS stations of the cross

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmarystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist (Lamb of God)

As the presider continues with the breaking of the bread, the choir and assembly sing the Lamb of God, a litany-style prayer that accompanies the rite. A litany is a call-and-response-style song. The text for the Lamb of God is taken from the first chapter of John's Gospel. It makes the Passover connection with the bread and wine that are broken and poured at this time: Jesus is the Lamb of God, the spotless victim who takes away the world's sins, freeing God's people from slavery to sin and death. This banquet is our eternal Passover.

The choir and assembly sing the Lamb of God until the ritual action is complete, repeating the first line as many times as necessary, and ending with a call for peace.

Next, the presider and the people prepare themselves for Communion. The presider elevates the Body and Blood and invites the people to "behold" the Lamb of God. This evokes scenes from Jesus' passion. The people respond, "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof..."

This phrase, which was changed in the new translation, is a reference to the story of the faithful centurion in Matthew's Gospel. The Lord promised to accompany the centurion to his home to heal his beloved servant.
