Easter Reflection

First of all, let's get our vocabulary straight: "Easter" in Protestant talk means "Easter Sunday." In Catholic talk "Easter" means the Easter Season that runs from Easter Sunday to Pentecost, 50 days later. It is easy for us to slip into Protestant talk and say things like, "What are you doing for Easter?" meaning "What are you doing on Easter Sunday?" But as Catholics it is important to make the distinction.

Why? Because Jesus' Resurrection offers us life-despite-death, and that is worth having 50 days to celebrate. And because we have just spent 40 days of Lent in the desert asking ourselves the three fundamental questions: Who am I? Where am I going? How am I going to get there?

Ideally, the time in the desert helped us realize that answering these questions lies beyond my human ability. Many of you are registering great successes at the University of Michigan, and I have my own successes. But I am more than my successes and much more than my failures. And the circuitous path of my life defies any rational planning or model building.

Fortunately, God knows these things, and Jesus himself saw that in only three years a human being can go from total obscurity to being notorious, widely-known, famous - and a pariah - among the best and brightest of his era. Imagine your most important career move being your own public execution!

In the Northern Hemisphere we have the spring-coming-from-winter to serve as metaphor for what Jesus' death and resurrection offer to us as we work our way through the three life questions above. "I tried everything I could think of to give myself a rewarding life, but everything failed - until I found Jesus looking for me." "I had what I thought was a happy life - but I knew there was still something missing."

The result, the new life, isn't just a thought. It is the deep-seated sense that my life is worth living, that I am glad that I am who I am, that I am glad that I am alive - after all. "After all" literally means "after all I have been through." That is what Easter Sunday is.

In the Spiritual Exercises, St. Ignatius asks the retreatant, who has just prayed with Jesus through his Passion, to meditate on Jesus appearing to his mother. This incident is not in scripture, but Ignatius' insight is right on target: after all Jesus had been through, to whom would he naturally have appeared first? His mother, after all, in the best Jewish tradition. And then, Ignatius says, he appears to his disciples and friends - and now to us - in his role as comforter.

I have always found this striking: we have just been through the trauma of his crucifixion and death. What do we need now more than ever? Comforting, of course. So the Easter Season offers us 50 days of being comforted and so 50 days of celebration. So best wishes to us all for this Easter Sunday and Season!

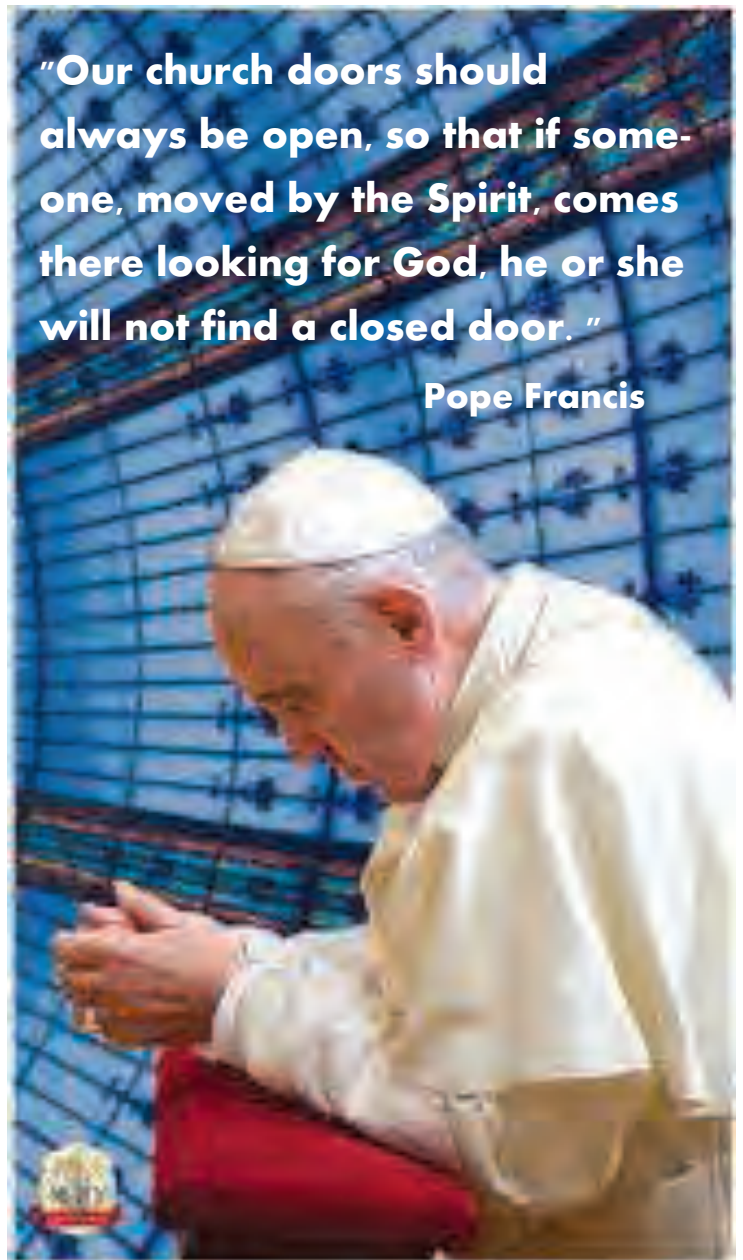

Liturgy 101

St. Mary Student Parish is taking a deeper look at the way we celebrate the Mass. Each week in the bulletin (and at stmystudentparish.org) we will explore the meaning and origins of the Sacrament that is central to who we are as Catholics.

Liturgy of the Eucharist (Concluding Rites)

Once we have received Holy Communion, we are sent out to take the Eucharist – in so many different ways – out into the world.

Remember, Mass is one great prayer. Just as we began it by marking ourselves with the cross of Christ, so now, at the conclusion of the Mass, we do the same. This time, we mark ourselves as we receive the final blessing. We all make the sign of the cross together.

The final part of the Mass, the Concluding Rite, consists of a blessing and a dismissal – a sending out. We have what we need: The Eucharist. Now we are charged to *be* the Eucharist in every other part of our lives – in our family life, in our work life, in our neighborhood life. We are sent to *be* the Body of Christ in the world.

“Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord.” Or “Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life.”

You can’t miss the concept of mission in these words that we are given! We respond by proclaiming together, “Thanks be to God.”

The original Latin text, *Ite, missa est*, contains the word *missa*, which basically means dismissal, but has connotations of being sent or *missioned*, to go out and do Christ’s work. The word Mass actually comes from this Latin phrase. This makes a strong connection between the Mass and the lives we lead as Catholics in the world.

Possessing a Eucharistic attitude can change not only the life of the individual, but the world. “For the Eucharist is a mode of being, which passes from Jesus into each Christian, through whose testimony it is meant to spread throughout society and culture. For this to happen, each member of the faithful must assimilate, through personal and communal meditation, the values which the Eucharist expresses, the attitudes it inspires, the resolutions to which it gives rise...
