One of my favorite parts of starting the year with a new cohort of interns is discovering their vibe- the feeling they as a group emit and the atmosphere they create. The best way I can describe the 2015-16 cohort is mercifully passionate. Mercy was the gift that presented itself most abundantly this year with 7 identifying it within one of their top charisms- timely given Pope Francis named 2016 the Year of Mercy! Six of the 11 are pursuing healthcare related positions; 9 of the 11 participated in Alternative Spring Break with three serving as site leaders this year in addition to their internships. Three of our seniors are headed to different parts of the country to serve with the Jesuit Volunteer Corps next year and a 4th is discerning a year of service in parish ministry. They are a group who is passionately engaged as well with global concerns including cancer research, environmental justice, reducing stigma around mental health, access to quality and affordable health care and immigration reform, to highlight a few. Throughout the year I continued to be grateful for and inspired by their desire to go deeper and grapple with the hard questions which made for some lively formation sessions!

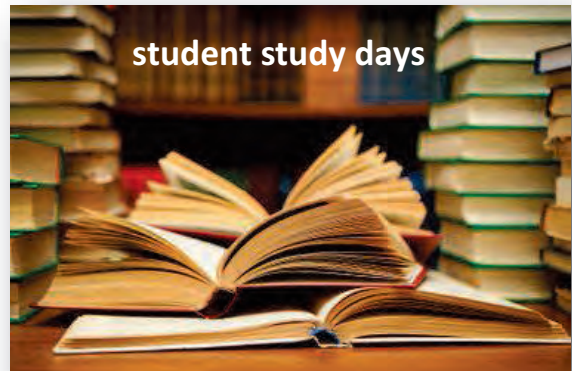

Registration for Family Faith Formation & Teen Confirmation

April 18 from 9am-10pm

The Family Faith Formation program is for registered parish families whose eldest child is in at least kindergarten and serves students through the seventh-grade academic year. Family Faith Formation is a home-based catechesis that requires parents and children to attend a monthly formation class (Sundays, October-May) and work at home on lessons. The Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically completed in the 2nd-grade year and it is encouraged that children have received at least one year of faith formation before their sacramental prep year.

Teen confirmation is for eighth-grade students who have completed the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, and Eucharist. Our teen confirmation program meets 2-3 times a month on Sunday afternoons between October-May. Teens attend most sessions on their own with some parental involvement at some of the sessions. In addition to attending class, teens are required to complete a faith formation text at home, complete 25 hours of service, and attend a day-long retreat. It is recommended that teens come to their confirmation preparation year with recent faith formation experience.


