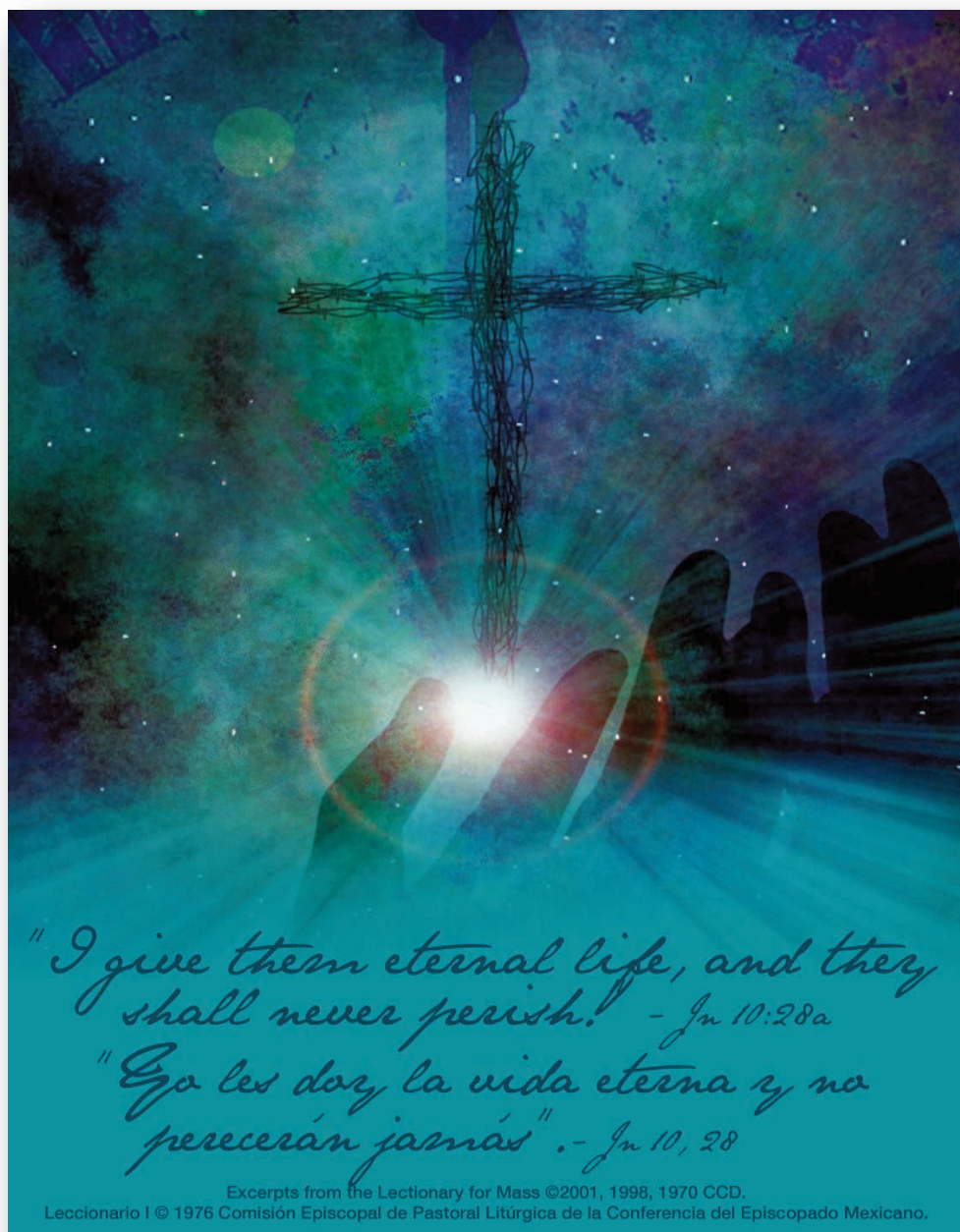

## With Gratitude

Today's brief Gospel builds on last Sunday's with crystal clear guidance. I have to admit, I'm always thankful when that happens...and I don't have to reread certain passages ten times to break them down and mold them into some sort of modern interpretation.

Feed my lambs. Tend my sheep. Follow me.

Jesus reminds us that he is counting on us. We need to feed his people. We need to tend to the needs of his people. And if we follow him, we shall never perish.

Let me take you back to the middle of January - which shouldn't be too hard during this particularly snowy April. You walk miles each day moving from shelter to shelter, trying to keep warm. Your boots are worn; there are holes in the bottom. The wind whips through your socks. Your feet are so cold you welcome the numbness to offset the cold, dampness of snow. People pass you on the street without acknowledgement.

You walk into a shelter and somebody greets you. You are so excited to see fresh fruit, granola bars, and other healthy foods. They ask you to list three items that you truly need. They tell you how hopeful they are that these items will be donated. Items just for you. Your exact size. Your needs met. And in that moment, you have comfort. You have community. You feel love.

This past January I was in awe of your response to the warming shelter. Not only did you sign up to volunteer, but you dropped off food, stayed for conversation, and donated specific items requested by our guests. It took many coordinated efforts from so many people. It wasn't simply a warming shelter - it was a loving community.

But the shelter was just one example of your love this past year. And my gratitude extends far beyond those cold January days. Thank you for working a 40-hour work week and giving your free time to help us serve those who are lost. Thank you for standing at the doors to the church simply to smile and welcome. Thank you for the hours spent creating curriculum for the child who insists on coloring it and creating a paper plane. Thank you for believing in our mission, following Jesus, and making a difference in our community.

When mailings don't matter and formal invitations fail, you are the ones who represent who we are. You share Jesus' love in ways St. Mary isn't able to - around a coffee table, at the gym, or picking your children up from school. Thank you for being a part of our family, feeding his lambs, and tending his sheep. You are appreciated, highly valued, and much needed.

## Registration for Family Faith Formation & Teen Confirmation

### Starts April 18

The Family Faith Formation program is for registered parish families whose eldest child is in at least kindergarten and serves students through the seventh-grade academic year. Family Faith Formation is a home-based catechesis program that requires parents/guardians and children to attend a monthly formation class (Sundays, October-May) and work at home on lessons. The Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically completed in the 2nd-grade year and it is encouraged that children have received at least one year of faith formation before their sacramental prep year.

Teen confirmation is for eighth-grade students who have completed the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, and Eucharist. Our teen confirmation program meets 2-3 times a month on Sunday afternoons between October-May. Teens attend most sessions on their own with some parental/guardain involvement at some of the sessions. In addition to attending class, teens are required to complete a faith formation text at home, complete 25 hours of service, and attend a day-long retreat. It is recommended that teens come to their confirmation preparation year with recent faith formation experience. More information and registration forms are available in the parish office. Space is limited, so early registration is recommended.

Families who are interested in our faith formation programs, but are not registered parishioners as of April 1, 2016 are welcome to register for both programs starting August 1, 2016. Final deadline for all registration is September 1, 2016.
