

Gean in Review

As each day grows warmer than the last, students take their final exams and turn in their term papers. Professors make final evaluations, doling out grades and making plans for summer. Here at St. Mary, we say goodbye to many of our students as well. Some will leave just for the summer while others graduate and begin a new chapter.

We invite you to take a look back with us at the past year. 2015 -2016 was energetic, merciful, and loving. Our students formed community through dances, movie nights, service events, holiday parties, and even a casino night (photo below). Our students hosted a prom dress drive, participated in Relay for Life, Alternative Spring Break, and started their own twitter account @UmichCatholics.



A renewed focus on liturgy meant exciting changes. The student-led 9 PM mass moved up into the church from Donnelly Hall. A greater number of students were trained in all liturgical roles, from ushers and greeters to lectures and Eucharistic ministers, and even mass coordinators. We washed each other's feet on Holy Thursday, held our first silhouette stations of the cross (photo below), and welcomed our Elect through baptism at the Easter Vigil.



We also welcomed Fr. John Ferone, S.J. who led a series of lectures on praying through the spiritual exercises along with student retreats. We continued our seasonal blogs and small church communities. We implemented brand new hymnals and added missalettes to the pews.



Pope Francis visited the United States and although Ann Arbor wasn't a part of his tour, we gathered as a community to watch his address to Congress (photo above). A few months later we commenced a Jubilee Year of Mercy, focusing our ministry on compassion, forgiveness, and welcome.

But as we leave this academic year and prepare for the next, we ask you to join us in prayer. Pray for our students who are graduating, tackling summer internships, or returning home after their first year away. Pray for our students who are still

finding their way, changing majors, or struggling to find a job.

We ask you to pray that our students continue to share faith, community, and mercy with others. We pray that while they may worship elsewhere, they will always feel the love and support of our community.

Registration for Family Faith Formation and Teen Confirmation

Now through September 1

The Family Faith Formation program is for registered parish families whose eldest child is in at least kindergarten and serves students through the seventh-grade academic year. It is a home-based catechesis program that requires parents/guardians and children to attend a monthly formation class (Sundays, October-May) and work at home on lessons.

The Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically completed in the 2nd-grade year and it is encouraged that children have received at least one year of faith formation before their sacramental prep year.

Teen confirmation is for eighth-grade students who have completed the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, and Eucharist. Our teen confirmation program meets 2-3 times a month on Sunday afternoons between October-May. Teens attend most sessions on their own with some parental/guardian involvement at some of the sessions. In addition to attending class, teens are required to complete a faith formation text at home, complete 25 hours of service, and attend a day-long retreat. It is recommended that teens come to their confirmation preparation year with recent faith formation experience. More information and registration forms are available in the parish office. Space is limited, so early registration is recommended.

Families who are interested in our faith formation programs, but are not registered parishioners as of April 1, 2016 are welcome to register for both programs starting August 1, 2016. Final deadline for all registration is September 1, 2016.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

My community is overwhelmed by the outpouring of love and support from the St. Mary Student Parish Community, in response to my Mission Appeal visit this past fall and the Advent gift. The over \$22,000 from your generosity is in hand and exclusively targeted for our work with the poor in the Fort Portal region of Western Uganda. You are supporting training of two nurses and one of our Sisters, who will qualify as a physician assistant. They will serve the underprivileged sick patients where the health care workers are few.

Your generosity is also helping us at Virika Hospital. You have provided our pediatric ward with better equipment, furniture and the most basic of provisions for the many women who come to us for help with their complications from child bearing. Just to have more mattresses and a place to sit for those seeking help are such simple but necessary blessings. You can see a Sister offloading a truck, and Mother Specioza Kabahuma receiving the materials for our service with great joy.



You've allowed us to support the children in their nursery/primary school many of whom are orphans due to the death of their parents from HIV infection. They hardly have anyone to get them materials to enhance their learning. The children were so blessed and happy for your generosity. This is a picture of the children and their teacher.



Below is a group of women who had birth injuries and we were able to facilitate all that was needed to do surgical repair of the birth injuries and restored their dignity with your help in the advent offering. May God bless you.



The pink buckets are for the continuous urinary bladder drainage and after 14days they will walk home .This is the activity that we have just concluded which started on 4th April 2016 to 10th April.

In addition to the many things you have supported, we are also grateful for the University of Michigan students who are starting to come here to learn and to share in our work.
