

Helping Families at Alpha House

"The family is the foundation of co-existence and a remedy against social fragmentation. Children have a right to grow up in a family with a father and a mother capable of creating a suitable environment for the child's development and emotional maturity." ~Pope Francis

We as a parish have a calling and unique opportunity to live the words of Pope Francis through our social justice ministry at Alpha House. Alpha House is an emergency shelter for children and their families experiencing homelessness located in Washtenaw County. It is the only shelter in our area where families can stay together in the same room system rather than be separated dormitory style. It's a setup that preserves the sanctity and dignity of that family while they are in crisis. Through rapid re-housing, the staff of Alpha House works with families to set goals and secure permanent housing as quickly as possible while also offering support services to maintain that home. Congregations like St. Mary's provide food, companionship, and hospitality throughout the year. It is this love given that makes Alpha House possible.

My family began serving with Alpha House when my sons were in elementary school. The parish bulletin had a request for volunteers and thankfully we could participate as a family. We started by volunteering to supervise the children's play activities. The boys were very moved by the difference between these families and our own home.

Early in our volunteering, there was a child who had a birthday the next day after we were signed up for activity time. She was not going to have a birthday party and my boys were shocked. They never realized that someone could not celebrate a birthday. They were moved to come back the next day and throw one for her. As a parent it was a beautiful thing to see your kids do something so thoughtful for another and completely self motivated and innocent. Everyone had a great time at the party and our family was hooked. We have been volunteering at Alpha House for nearly 10 years now.

Over time we have expanded our dedication. For me, I wanted to invest my time fully in one project so I could see the results. For my sons, it just became a part of how they view the world. Two of my sons run programs through their service fraternities to serve in much the same way the parish does. One mentioned how Alpha House was pivotal in his decision to enter the School of Social Work next year. It's a rewarding experience that can have long lasting impact, not just for those being served by the shelter but in our own homes. Our appreciation for our blessing grows. Our empathy and love for others expands. Our reach as the hands of Christ makes an impact beyond even what we can see. Alpha House is a local shelter on Jackson Road in Ann Arbor that can serve up to 6 homeless families, housing them with shared bedrooms for each of the families. It's a place where other families can come to serve. Consider bringing your family with you as you cook a meal or play with the children. Singles can give a huge service by spending the night in a special guest room to be available to help the Alpha House staff should someone have an emergency, such as a sick child, or going into labor. The overnight volunteer is on-call to drive the AlphaHouse van for the family in need, should it arise. The only requirement is to have a driver's license.

Registration for Family Faith Formation and Teen Confirmation

Now through September 1

The Family Faith Formation program is for registered parish families whose eldest child is in at least kindergarten and serves students through the seventh-grade academic year. It is a home-based catechesis program that requires parents/guardians and children to attend a monthly formation class (Sundays, October-May) and work at home on lessons.

The Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically completed in the 2nd-grade year and it is encouraged that children have received at least one year of faith formation before their sacramental prep year.

Teen confirmation is for eighth-grade students who have completed the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, and Eucharist. Our teen confirmation program meets 2-3 times a month on Sunday afternoons between October-May. Teens attend most sessions on their own with parental/guardian involvement at some of the sessions. In addition to attending class, teens are required to complete a faith formation text at home, complete 25 hours of service, and attend a day-long retreat. It is recommended that teens come to their confirmation preparation year with recent faith formation experience. More information and registration forms are available in the parish office. Space is limited, so early registration is recommended.

Families who are interested in our faith formation programs, but are not registered parishioners as of April 1, 2016 are welcome to register for both programs starting August 1, 2016. Final deadline for all registration is September 1, 2016.
