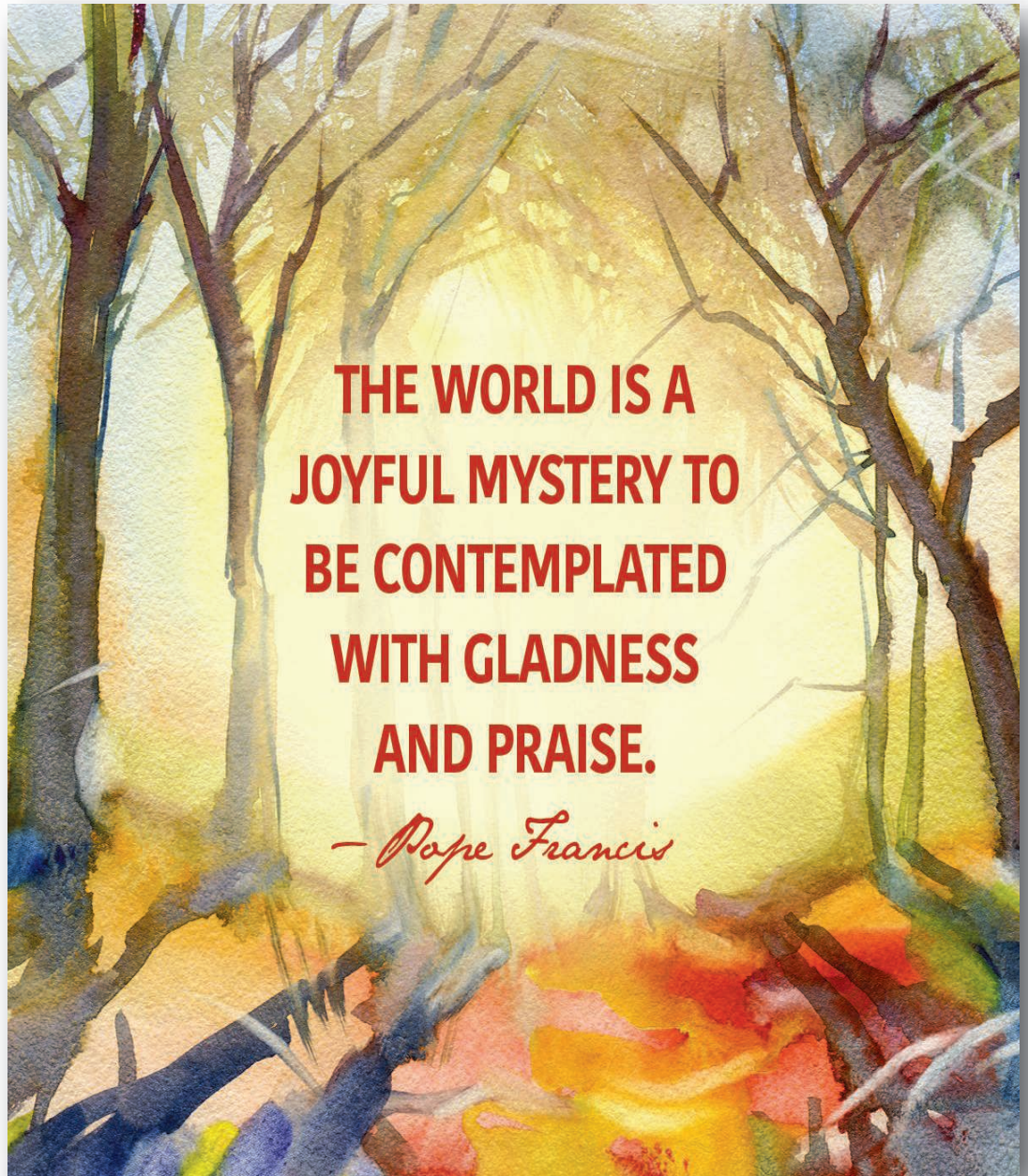

## It's all about *Love*

The woman in Luke's Gospel today is all about love. She is overcome with emotion and tears, just being in the presence of Jesus. Could there be a more personal, heartfelt display of love? She follows Jesus to this private dinner. She sees him and begins to attend to his needs, bathing his feet with her own tears and drying them with her hair.

What an image! It's the perfect example of true discipleship.

Perhaps the woman was determined to seek out Jesus because she trusted completely in the transformational power of his presence. Maybe she had seen him previously and watched the way he treated women or other outsiders with compassion. In any case, Jesus does not disappoint her. He shows mercy and tenderness toward her, even knowing her background and knowing what the crowd's reaction will be.

In our sessions for RCIA (the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults), it's the first principle that we want to convey to those who are seeking to know more about the Catholic faith: "We love because God first loved us." (1 John 4:19). With the help of the Holy Spirit, we are able to recognize God's constant invitation and respond to it.

Everything else about faith makes sense because of this. All that we do – even our prayer – is a response to God's great, unlimited love for us. Just as this woman in the Gospel discovered; her fear and her shame were nothing when she brought them to Jesus. He overcame all of this with love and mercy toward her.

One seeker this year said the best thing about the RCIA process was that he felt he had truly found a home with God. There's nothing more rewarding than hearing how the Holy Spirit has worked in our candidates throughout the year.

Joe Paprocki, author of *The Bible Blueprint* (Loyola Press), says that every Bible story is somehow our own story. So maybe we can ask ourselves a few questions:

How do we compare to this "sinful" woman? Do we seek out the risen Lord the way she did? When we encounter God are we changed? Do we pay attention and respond to the love and mercy God shows us? Do we trust completely that we can bring our fears to God and watch them be transformed?

Hopefully, we can strive to come to Jesus with our own heartfelt outpouring. We can bring to him our own messy lives, knowing with complete trust that he will hear us. We are already assured of this.

## Centering Prayer

*Mondays at 6:30 pm*

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book, *Open Mind, Open Heart* by Father Thomas Keating, OCSO, is a good introduction.

The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

## Registration for Family Faith Formation and Teen Confirmation

### Now through September 1

The Family Faith Formation program is for registered parish families whose eldest child is in at least kindergarten and serves students through the seventh-grade academic year. It is a home-based catechesis program that requires parents/guardians and children to attend a monthly formation class (Sundays, October-May) and work at home on lessons.

The Sacraments of First Reconciliation and First Eucharist are typically completed in the 2nd-grade year and it is encouraged that children have received at least one year of faith formation before their sacramental prep year.

Teen confirmation is for eighth-grade students who have completed the sacraments of baptism, reconciliation, and Eucharist. Our teen confirmation program meets 2-3 times a month on Sunday afternoons between October-May. Teens attend most sessions on their own with parental/guardian involvement at some of the sessions. In addition to attending class, teens are required to complete a faith formation text at home, complete 25 hours of service, and attend a day-long retreat. It is recommended that teens come to their confirmation preparation year with recent faith formation experience. More information and registration forms are available in the parish office. **Space is limited, so early registration is recommended.**

Families who are interested in our faith formation programs, but are not registered parishioners as of April 1, 2016 are welcome to register for both programs starting August 1, 2016. **Final deadline for all registration is September 1, 2016.**
