

Anxiety. Relationship. Gratitude. by Kelly Dunlop



Tomorrow we celebrate the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary and hear proclaimed Luke's account of the Visitation of Mary to her cousin Elizabeth. This gospel account reminds us of the outpouring of divine grace and faithfulness that sustained Mary throughout her life until she was assumed into heaven. While

tomorrow we read only of Mary's arrival at Elizabeth's home, the earlier events in the gospel narrative help me appreciate Mary's yes even more. Luke tells us that prior to this trip the angel Gabriel had shown up to a single pre-teen and said "Hail, favored one. The Lord is with you!" How does Mary respond? "She is greatly troubled at what was said and pondered what kind of greeting this might be," and she rightfully has questions.

It is then, in haste, she travels to be with her cousin Elizabeth. In her uncertainty, Mary wanted to be with a dear friend, someone who knew and understood her. Someone she could trust. When she arrived, she found that indeed Elizabeth, a woman who had been barren her entire life, was pregnant as the angel had predicted. It is then the praise and gratitude spill over as she proclaims the Magnificat.

Anxiety. Relationship. Gratitude.

After much discernment, I have accepted a position with the Center for Campus Involvement here at U-M. As I packed up my office this week, five years of memories seemed to come flooding back. First were the feelings of anxiety, nerves and homesickness. Paul and I, along with our son Conor, not yet 2 at the time, moved to Michigan from North Carolina where we had spent the previous decade building a life for ourselves. We came here knowing no one and I wondered if I would be able to cut it

with such brilliant students and parishioners and talented staff (not to mention Michigan winters). I re-read the letter Paul snuck into my bag on my first day of work here reassuring me it was going to be OK and that I would grow in unexpected ways. How right he was.

With each picture I take down and each book I put away, I remember conversations and relationships. I re-discover early documents from the beginning brainstorming about a small church community initiative and the internship program for undergrads. I find my favorite thank you notes of students who were impacted by this place that I tucked away in a file. I find a postcard from an alum who went on to pursue a dream of international service, although she was terrified.

I reflect on the many relationships formed that don't have physical mementos to mark them. Friday gatherings with my dear sister church that despite slight variation in participants season after season remained a source of wisdom, compassion and grounded-ness. I recall student after student who was willing to show up and share their life with me and be my teacher in so many ways. I smile as I remember sharing the news of our pregnancy with the staff and students, the unusual baby shower they threw, the blessing of Women of the Heart and celebrating our daughter Erin's baptism here surrounded by family and friends who had become like family. Finally, I am overwhelmed as I think about the journey shared with so many incredible coworkers who consistently showed me not how to do church but to be church.

For all of this I am so grateful and my spirit rejoices.

Update on Heating & Cooling in the Church

Our modifications to the HVAC system in the church have been completed. Working closely with Johnson Controls, we successfully added two cool air returns above the choir area behind the altar and upgraded our main control system to more efficiently regulate temperature. Monitoring the air patterns in the church, we also decided to close the cool air returns located in the transept area, funneling the air from the nave through the altar and to the choir.

The end result of these modifications is increased circulation and control, creating a more uniform climate throughout the church. While our historic building will never truly have "climate control," at least in modern terms, we hope these modifications will help make your worship experience with us more comfortable.

There's no pressure or obligation. Participants are welcome to explore and ask questions as they discern where God may be leading them.



It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book, *Open Mind, Open Heart* by Father Thomas Keating, OCSO, is a good introduction.

The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.


