

The God of Fresh Starts

See, I am doing something new! Now it springs forth, do you not perceive it? (Isaiah 43: 19)

I always hate to see the last days of August. I know many people love Fall – what's not to love about golden leaves and pumpkinspiced everything? But for me, it's hard to



let go of the warm, more leisurely days of summer. Once again, I'll be saying goodbye to my daughters, as one heads back to college and one starts a new job in Milwaukee. My husband, too, will be traveling more for his job. We all feel a sense of excitement for new adventures, yet there's some sadness and anxiety too.

Here at St. Mary's, we have many new faces on staff, and it has been great to begin to know them. They bring fresh energy and diverse gifts to our group. I am also taking on something new this year. Along with RCIA, I will coordinate Confirmation. I can't wait to meet these eighth-graders and help them to experience Jesus working through our college catechists.


One Human Family

Fall Music Updates

This spring we celebrated Anita Bohn's 20 years of service to St. Mary Student Parish. In her honor, a small group of her colleagues generously donated new *Voices as One* hymnals for the congregation and choir. These hymnals, which contain many of our favorite hymns, also include a book plate celebrating Anita inside the back cover. We will enjoy singing together in celebration of Anita for many years to come!

Additionally, we have made several changes to the music ministry schedule in an effort to give new emphasis to student participation and leadership to music at all liturgies. Paige Graham has accepted a part-time position as music coordinator and will lead music at the 12 noon, 5:00 pm, and 9:00 pm masses. The 5:00 pm choir and musicians are moving to the 10:00 am mass, and will be led by Anita Bohn beginning Sunday, September 11th. The remainder of the changes will begin Sunday, September 4th.



Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book, *Open Mind, Open Heart* by Father Thomas Keating, OCSO, is a good introduction.

The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.

Catechesis of the Good Shepherd

Looking for a way to help your young child grow in relationship with God?

The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite children ages 3-5 years who are either in preschool or young 5s programs to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish. This faith formation opportunity will be held once a month starting September 25 after the 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 AM-12:45 PM. Materials cost is \$35 per child for the year and scholarships are available.
