Fill us with your word, O Lord, and heal us with your grace.



#### **General Congregation 36**

### What's going on in Rome?

More than 200 Jesuits continue to meet in Rome as part of the 36th General Congregation of the Society of Jesus, which convened on Oct. 2.

A General Congregation is an event steeped in history and significance, but it's fairly rare in the 474-year history of the Jesuits. The current gathering includes 212 delegates from 62 countries and all five continents. The delegates have two main tasks: to elect a Superior General and to discuss important topics for the future of the universal Society of Jesus.

The current Superior General of the Society of Jesus, Father Adolfo Nicolás, SJ, a native of Spain, announced in 2014 his intention to resign. Fr. Nicolás, 80, was elected in 2008. During the first week of the gathering, before Fr. Nicolás resigned, he appointed a Vicar General, Fr. James Grummer, to lead the Congregation and the Society until a new General is elected.

The work of the congregation is expected to take several weeks, and some congregations last for months. When it is in session, a general congregation (GC) is the supreme governing body of the Society of Jesus, outranking even the Jesuit's Superior General.

Pope Francis, a Jesuit, attended two general congregations — GC 32 (1974-75) and GC 33 (1983).




