

## Finding Light in a Dark World by Amy Ketner, Campus Ministry Associate

Lately tensions in our society have been palpable. Internationally, focus has been on Syria, ISIS and the migration crises. Here in the States, shootings and subsequent protests persist, and politics continually reveal a deep layer of disrespect for our marginalized brothers and sisters. Additionally, in "Just Mercy", our SMSP big-read about the criminal justice system, my heart has been broken by realities too hard to fathom.

Recently these tensions hit closer to home, when horrific messages of hate appeared on both UM and EMU campuses. Unfortunately, these messages, signed by "KKK" and other white supremacist groups, are not the first of their kind in recent local history. Attacking black students, Muslims and other minority groups, such messages lead many to feel unwelcome and unsafe here. All of this has caused in me a deep stirring. How is it possible that today, in 2016, we are so separated from our brothers and sisters? How can we still foster such disrespect and hate for entire groups of people?

The readings this week are particularly timely, it seems. In the Gospel, Jesus urges our humility by narrating the story of the prideful Pharisee and sinful tax collector. I can't help but wonder what might have happened if the Pharisee had turned around and reached out to the tax collector. What if, instead of boasting about his righteousness, he would have listened to his brother there in the temple? How many times do I let my prideful speech interfere with compassionate listening? I am quick to see the actions of others and think "at least I'm not hateful like them." Yet I still - often times unconsciously - let pride, complacency, fear, busyness, or many other factors get in the way of love.

In 2 Timothy, immediately preceding today's reading, we are each charged with the responsibility to "proclaim the word; be persistent whether it is convenient or inconvenient...encourage all through patience and teaching" (2 Tm 4:2). Later we are reminded that the Lord will stand by us and give us strength (2 Tm 4:17). Amid all of this darkness, misunderstanding and hatefulness, how can I be persistent in proclaiming God's love? How can I encourage myself and others to listen to, learn from and love each other?

Finally, perhaps most reassuringly, in today's first reading, we are reminded that our God is a just God. He hears the cries of the oppressed; He listens to those who serve Him and reach out to Him. I find great hope in these words, and am moved to keep praying, asking God to be with us as we come to better know, love and respect each other. Through it all, He is our strength.

I am constantly called back to St. Mother Teresa's words: "If we have no peace, it is because we have forgotten that we belong to each other." In our state of tension, discrimination, and fear, let us remember that the "other" isn't so "other" after all, but rather our sister or brother. Because we are all children of God, we belong to each other. It is in such unity that we can listen more compassionately and come to know and love one another, despite our differences.

So with God as our strength, and belonging to each other as family, let us be God's light in our world.

# Faith Formation Opportunity for Young Children



The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd is a Montessori-based approach to the religious formation of children, rooted in Sacred Scripture, Liturgy, and respect for the child's rich relationship with God. Central to CGS is the atrium, a room containing beautiful materials that focus the child's attention on key scripture passages or liturgical moments. After an introduction by the catechist, the children are invited to work with a material on their own to continue their meditation. Because children learn by using their hands, working with materials allows them to enter more deeply into meditation, nurturing their relationship with God.

We invite children ages 3-5 years who are either in preschool or young 5s programs to participate in our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd Atrium at St Mary Student Parish. This faith formation opportunity will be held once a month during the school year (October 30, November 13, December 11 with 2017 dates TBD) after the 10:00 AM Mass from 11:15 AM-12:45 PM. It is a drop- off program. Materials cost is \$35 per child for the year and scholarships are available.
