

Dia de los muertos/ Day of the Dead

Dia de los muertos is a holiday celebrated in many Latin American countries from October 31st until November 2nd. While each region varies on how it celebrates Dia de los muertos, the intention behind the festival is the same everywhere: to celebrate the lives of friends and family who have passed away. Families spend these days cooking for their extended family, cleaning, and telling stories of the loved ones who have passed on. Some visit the cemeteries to clean the gravestones of the deceased and leave flowers, a small portion of the food they cooked, and mementos for the deceased. Others go to mass and say a novena of rosaries leading up to this day. After speaking with some of our parishioners I have learned that each country's customs are slightly varied and wholly beautiful.

Mexico, being a large contributor in the diffusion of the celebration of Dia de los muertos throughout the world, has strong influences in how we, here at SMSP, adorn our atrium to celebrate this holiday. We have a community altar, and all are invited to participate and join in this celebration. These altars are adorned with pictures of all those being remembered, flowers, traditionally marigolds, a candle for each loved one, pan de muerto (Day of the Dead bread), religious images and figures, as well as favorite objects of the deceased -- including favorite beverages, food, and trinkets. If the family is remembering a child who has passed on, they place milk and a baby bottle on the altar.

Guatemalan salad, called fiambre (fee-ahh-mm-br-a), full of meats and sausages, cheeses, and many vegetables, is made and eaten for Dia de los muertos. Unique to Guatemala, the families also build and fly kites in the cemeteries for this celebration. These kites can be as large as a two-story building, designed in a variety of ways, including displaying religious images, looking like tejidos (the traditional woven clothing), or being covered with national symbols such as the national bird and/or flower, or even images of indigenous heritage. In Sumpango, Guatemala, these kites are worked on six months to a year in advance. Each kite has messages written to the deceased loved ones, in hope that these messages reach their ancestors in heaven, when flown in the cemetery.

In Colombia, there is the tradition for Dia de los muertos, similar to dressing up for Halloween and trick-or-treating, but children don't ask for candy from their neighbors, they ask for potatoes, rice, meat, and other foods to make dinner. All the children and families, in a community come together and combine all of the food they collected from each house and make a huge pot of stew out in the street. All of the families in the community join together and eat this meal. In this form of celebration, families and community share in the telling of stories and memories of loved ones.

Through the sharing of stories of those whom are now with Christ, the younger generations of families come to know their ancestors. The beauty in this celebration is in the passing of familial history from generation to generation with love, joy, and in community.


Eucharistic Adoration

Centering Prayer is a silent practice of prayer that rests on the faith that Christ is present within by his Holy Spirit. It is an excellent preparation for contemplative prayer, which is a grace or gift bestowed by God. Centering Prayer is an intentional openness to, or practice of "waiting" on God, encouraging the building of a more intimate relationship with Jesus and the movement of the Holy Spirit. It is rooted in centuries-old monastic prayer. The book, *Open Mind*, *Open Heart* by Father Thomas Keating, OCSO, is a good introduction. The first Monday of each month we listen to an introduction to centering prayer and then pray for 20 minutes. Otherwise, we typically sit and pray for two 20-minute sessions with a short meditative walk in between. All are welcome.




