## **Pastoral Perspective**

## Pondering All Things in our Hearts by Fr. Ben Hawley, S.J.

"And Mary pondered all these things in her heart." I once shocked a community of cloistered Carmelite nuns into surprise and laughter by suggesting that Mary was the first Jesuit. The suggestion, intended of course for dramatic effect, emphasized a profound human reality: that we need to reflect on our own experience, on events large and small and our intellectual and emotional reaction to them to gain any insight into the great questions of human life.

Such reflection forms the core of St. Ignatius' injunction to us all to find God in all things. The story of the disciples encountering the Risen Jesus on the road to Emmaus offers a clear example: the disciples' first instinct that they were walking with Jesus came when, as they realized later, "Were our hearts not burning within us as we walked with him?"

The intuition about reflection on experience occurs outside the Catholic tradition as well. The Roman god Janus for whom the month of January is named has two faces, one looking forward to the new year, one backward to the old year. Socrates said that the unexamined life is not worth living. Aristotle said that philosophy should not be taught to anyone under 30 for lack of sufficient life experience.

As we begin the new calendar year, it is good to ask ourselves where we have been to gain a clearer sense of where we are going. Today we celebrate the Feast of the Epiphany, the revelation of Jesus to the Gentiles in the persons of the Magi, and tomorrow we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism, Jesus' baptism by John in the Jordan River. At his baptism he hears the Father assure him of his fundamental goodness as a human person and the importance of his unique vocation.

Have you and I experienced the unique affirmation of the Father? Over the break I met up after many years with a good friend from my days working in the US Government. We had talked extensively about our lives back then, wanting to be sure that we were on the path that would lead us to fullness of life. And in long conversations with him I felt affirmed in my choice to leave the government because I now experience such richness of life, having found Jesus at work in my life inviting me to something better.

The special days in our liturgical year remind us of the key events of Jesus' life, always as invitations into parallel experiences in our own lives, Jesus in his humanity serving as exemplar and guide for us our own human lives. We discover these parallelisms as we reflect on our own experience, asking God to help us find His dynamic presence in our lives.

The new year welcomes us to new experience, new opportunity and new richness. Jesus invites us to a fullness of life we cannot imagine for ourselves. So please join me, all Jesuits - and Carmelites! everywhere in following Our Lady's example in pondering all things in our hearts.
