Pastoral Perspective

GROWING IN OUR RELATIONSHIP WITH GOD

One thing I've learned from working at a Jesuit-led parish is to regularly ask, "How am I doing in my relationship with Christ?" Our faith, St. Ignatius says, is not just about the "requirements" we check off the list, but at the heart, it's about seeing God as a friend, and letting God get to know you.

That may sound strange. After all, doesn't God know everything? Yes, but as we strive to learn and grow, and to reveal what's in our hearts to God, we come to experience God in new ways. God lets us know that he is always there for us, always ready to love, forgive and surprise us.

As we move into fall and experience changing weather, as well as new changes in life, it's also a good time to jump into some new faith opportunities. You may want to consider joining a Small Church Community (SCC), or perhaps participating in the Busy Person's Retreat (for undergrads, Grad/YP). We don't often have the chance to talk about faith and our experiences of God. Students tell us so often that they appreciate this benefit, especially amid the busy, secular world of campus life.

Here's how to sign up:

The Busy Person's Retreat – For undergrads, grad students and young adults. It's a way to enhance your prayer life and participate in a retreat experience in your daily life. Commit to praying 15 to 20 minutes a day, then meet with an experienced Spiritual Companion once a week. Your companion can help encourage you in prayer, and explore what might be coming up during your prayer time. Begins the week of Sept. 26 and runs through November 14.

Small Church Communities – Faith sharing groups help you to explore the Sunday readings and share about your experiences of God at work in your life. SCC groups look at the upcoming Sunday readings. Materials are provided with reflections and questions for thought. Groups meet at various times to fit your schedule. We also have some groups exploring special topics,

including the Just Faith group focusing on racial healing and awareness. There is also a Spanish speaking group and Latinx for young adults. (SCC's also run Sept. 26 through Nov. 14).

SOME NEWS FROM THE REFUGEE FAMILY

The Refugee Co-Sponsorship program has been very busy ever since the Enamorado Family arrived from Honduras on July 6th. In the past few weeks our team of 50 volunteers has helped the family with all aspects of lives from housing to education to employment and more.

Last weekend the Enamorado family moved into a two-bedroom apartment in Ann Arbor with a year long lease. Our housing team found the apartment and was able to fully furnish it for the family with donations from parishioners. Our employment team has helped the family set up bank accounts, and start jobs. Omar, the 12 year old boy, also started school this week through AAPS. In the coming weeks our program will focus on helping the family learn long-term skills like budgeting, learning how to speak English, and more. MISSION APPEAL FOR THE DIOCESE OF KOTTAPURAM

Situated in Kerala in the southwest region of India as it juts into the Arabian Sea, the Diocese of Kottapuram is geographically full of islands and villages with about 25,000 Catholic families out of a population of 100,000 families – Christians, Muslims and Hindus. With an economy based on fishing, and with monsoons and other fluctuations of weather, the people experience great hardships. In love and charity the Diocese offers many programs to assist, support Catholic, and non-Catholic. Father asks, “On behalf of my Bishop Joseph Karikkasery I request your prayerful support and financial assistance to continue all the good works our outreach ministry does”. Let me explain some of the projects that we have implemented in the social outreach ministry

1. For the children of the terminally ill patients for their education or to train them with some jobs to look after the treatment of the cancer patient in that family and to take care of the family needs.
2. Food and Medical Support of the poor during the Heavy monsoon season.
3. Fisherman project is “Cage Fish Culture”, it is a project growing fish in the natural environment in flowing backwater in a cage.
4. Jobs for special need people especially physically handicap men and women making “screw pine” craft products, which is a plant of great lasting natural fiber which is available in our area. When it is sundried it is used to make the products like bags, mats, living room, kitchen and dining table top different items.

Fr. Bosco Padamattumal will celebrate the 3 morning masses on September 18, there will be a special collection that day.

THE 19TH ANNOTATION RETREAT AT SMSP

The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius are a collection of meditations, prayers, and contemplative practices intended to help people to deepen their intimacy with God. The 19th Annotation, an adaptation of the 30-day retreat, involves daily prayer over eight months and calls for a prayerful evening review of each day. By entering into a personal experience of the mystery of Jesus’s life, death, and resurrection, one can grow in love for Jesus and into a closer discipleship to him.

Several trained directors, led by Fr. Bobby Karle, S.J., will lead a small group of participants through the Annotation this academic year (beginning in mid-October, through May.)

Who is this for? The 19th Annotation retreat isn’t for someone new to prayer or spiritual direction. This is an advanced trek into prayer, contemplation, collaboration and discernment.

The 19th Annotation hopes to serve people (1) in the habit of daily prayer, (2) comfortable with Sacred Scripture, and (3) receptive to ongoing spiritual direction.

Required Commitments over the 8 months (32 weeks):

Daily prayer: 45-60 minutes of prayer everyday.

Spiritual direction: One-on-one meeting with an assigned spiritual director every 10-16 days. The group will also meet regularly in person and on Zoom to share and support one another along the way.

Because the retreat requires a certain level of readiness and commitment, we are requiring participants to complete an application.

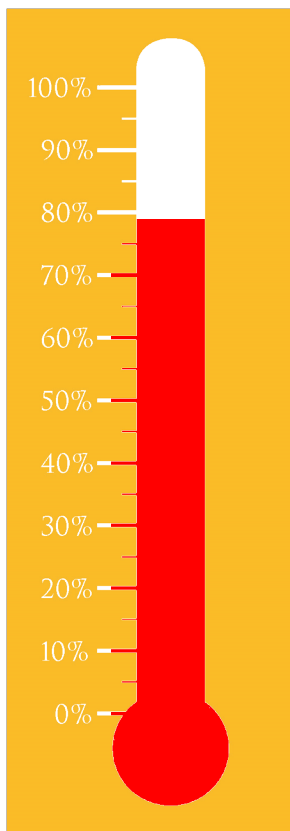

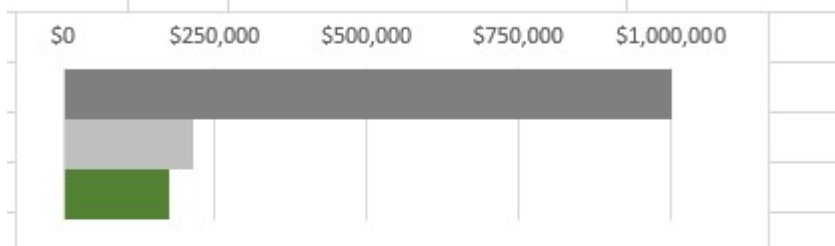
